8 9 AN ACT concerning campaign finance; relating to an exemption from 10 filing certain reports; amending K.S.A. 25-4144 and repealing the ex-11 isting section. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14 Section 1. K.S.A. 25-4144 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-154144. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), not later than 10 days after 16 becoming a candidate, every candidate shall appoint a treasurer or in lieu 17thereof shall appoint a candidate committee. The treasurer so appointed 18 may be the candidate making such appointment. No candidate shall ap-19 point more than one candidate committee to exist at the same time. If a 20 candidate appoints a candidate committee, such candidate shall appoint 21a chairperson and a treasurer thereof, and the treasurer so appointed may 22 be the candidate. No person who is registered as a lobbyist in accordance 23 with K.S.A. 46-265 and amendments thereto shall be eligible for appoint-24ment as treasurer for any candidate or candidate committee. The name 25and address of each treasurer and chairperson appointed under this sec-26 tion by a candidate for a state office shall be reported to the secretary of 27 state by the candidate not later than 10 days after such appointment. The 28name and address of each treasurer and chairperson appointed under this 29 section by a candidate for a local office shall be reported to the county 30 election officer by the candidate not later than 10 days after such ap-31 pointment. The candidate for governor shall carry out the requirements 32 and responsibilities of the candidate under the campaign finance act, for 33 the pair of candidates for governor and lieutenant governor, unless an-34 other specific provision applies. 35 (b) Whenever a candidate for state office does not anticipate or expect 36 to receive or expend an aggregate amount of less than \$500, exclusive of 37 any filing fees, in a primary or general election, such candidate may file

any filing fees, in a primary or general election, such candidate may file an affidavit attesting to that fact with the governmental ethics commission.

39 The affidavit shall be on a form prescribed by the governmental ethics 40 commission. By filing such affidavit, the candidate shall not be required

41 to appoint a treasurer or campaign committee as required by subsection

42 (a) or perform any duties imposed by law on such treasurer or campaign

43 committee unless such candidate receives or expends a sum of \$500 or

1	more. Such affidavit shall be filed no later than 10 days prior to such
2	primary or general election.
