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8 9 AN ACT relating to state procurement of contractual services; prescrib-10 ing certain restrictions on foreign contractors. 11 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 Section 1. The provisions of this act shall be cited as the American 14 jobs act. 15Sec. 2. The legislature finds that: 16 (a) State agencies and subdivisions procure services in part through 17contracts with private vendors. (b) Increasingly private vendors carry out these services or subcon-18 19 tract or otherwise procure these services, from a location outside the 20 United States and that such international outsourcing exacerbates unemployment and workforce dislocation and deprives Kansas residents of 2122 job opportunities, including industries and jobs this state has expended 23resources to attract. 24(c) International outsourcing erodes state and local revenues by draw-25ing jobs and income away from the state. 26 (d) International outsourcing additionally may provide less privacy 27protections for state residents whose personal information may, in the 28course of service delivery, be transmitted to locations outside the United 29 States. 30 Sec. 3. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no 31 state agency shall award a contract to a contractor who performs the work 32 contracted for at a site outside of the United States. 33 (b) Each vendor submitting a bid or contract to provide services for 34 the state shall certify that the services covered by the bid or contract will 35 be performed in the United States. 36 (c) If, during the term of the contract, the contractor or subcontractor 37 shifts work outside of the United States, then such agency shall require 38 the contractor or subcontractor to pay damages in an amount equal to 39 the amount paid by the agency for the percentage of outsourced work. 40The agency shall also terminate the contract for noncompliance. 41 (d) A state agency shall be entitled to bring a civil action in an ap-42 propriate court to compel enforcement under this statute. The court shall 43 award reasonable attorney's fees, costs and other expenses of litigation to

such state agency if the agency is the prevailing party in an action in which 

a remedy is sought under this act. 

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

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
