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9 AN ACT concerning issuance of bonds by certain state agencies to fund 10 capital improvements for water-related infrastructure; amending 11 K.S.A. 82a-1360, 82a-1361, 82a-1362, 82a-1363, 82a-1364, 82a-1367 12 and 82a-1368 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 13 82a-1365. 1415 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 16 Section 1. K.S.A. 82a-1360 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-1360. As used in K.S.A. 82a-1360 to 82a-1368, inclusive through 82a-171364 and 82a-1366 through 82a-1368, and amendments thereto, unless 18 19 the context otherwise requires: "Director" means the director of the Kansas water office. 20 (a) 21 (a) "Agency head" means the director of the Kansas water office, the 22 administrative officer ("executive director") of the state conservation com-23mission, the secretary of agriculture or the secretary of wildlife and parks. 24(b)"Capital improvements for water-related infrastructure projects" 25includes, but is not limited to: 26 (1) Purchase of reservoir storage in a structure which has been 27 planned, authorized and constructed by the federal government or the 28state of Kansas and which contains waters for conservation storage water 29 supply; 30 (2) purchase of federal or state reservoir storage for fish, wildlife and 31 recreational purposes; 32 purchase of ground water rights and overlying land rights from (3)33 willing sellers for municipal, industrial, aquifer preservation and fish, 34 wildlife and recreational purposes; 35 (4) construction of multipurpose small lake projects or addition of 36 water supply capacity to proposed multipurpose small lake projects, in-37 cluding engineering services and land acquisition; and 38 (5) reservoir protection, restoration and enhancement for long-term 39 water quality and quantity assurance. 40(b) (c) "Revenue bonds" means bonds issued pursuant to this act and 41 the Kansas development finance authority act, payable as to both principal 42 and interest from: (1) The revenue derived from water supply contracts 43 with water users who will derive benefits from the construction of a large

reservoir project or from the purchase of space in existing reservoirs; (2) 1 the revenue from participants in water assurance programs; (3) in the 2 3 discretion of the director head of a water-related agency, the proceeds of any grant-in-aid gift, loan or grant-in-aid which is made in furtherance 4 of any of the authorized goals or purposes found in the state water plan-56 ning act, K.S.A. 82a-901 et seq., and amendments thereto, and which may 7 be received from any source; or (4) the state water plan fund created by K.S.A. 82a-951, and amendments thereto; or (5) any one or more of the 8 9 foregoing. 10

(c) "Large reservoir project" means a structure that has been
 planned, authorized and constructed by the federal government or the
 state of Kansas which contains waters for conservation storage water
 supply.

(d) "Water-related agency" means the Kansas water office, the state
conservation commission, the Kansas department of agriculture or the
Kansas department of wildlife and parks.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 82a-1361 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-1718 1361. (a) The Kansas water office is Any water-related agency, or two or 19 more water-related agencies jointly, are hereby authorized to request the 20 Kansas development finance authority to issue and sell revenue bonds for 21the purpose of paying all or part of the cost of acquiring a site or sites, 22 constructing, reconstructing, improving and expanding large reservoir projects or to finance the purchase of storage in existing reservoirs capital 2324improvements for water-related infrastructure projects. The revenue 25bonds may be issued from time to time and sold in amounts which the 26 director deems agency head or heads deem necessary for such purposes.

(b) Prior to the issuance of the revenue bonds, the director and pursuant to a request from agency head or heads, the Kansas development finance authority shall adopt a resolution or resolutions in the name and on behalf of the Kansas water office water-related agency or agencies, which resolution or resolutions, unless otherwise provided therein, shall take effect immediately and:

(1) Determine an interest rate or rates to be paid on the principal of
the revenue bonds not in excess of the maximum rate of interest prescribed by K.S.A. 10-1009, and amendments thereto;

36 (2) determine that the revenue bonds will be term or serial bonds or
37 any combination thereof maturing not later than 40 years from the date
38 of issuance;

39 (3) (A) make provision for charges in water supply contracts with 40 water users who will derive benefits from the construction of a large 41 reservoir project or from the purchase of space in existing reservoirs and, 42 (B) fix charges to participants in water assurance programs and (C) make 43 married for charges to handfinitize of other against for solutions for the province of the second se

43 provision for charges to beneficiaries of other capital improvements for

water-related infrastructure projects in an amount necessary to assure the 1 prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the revenue bonds as 2 3 they become due, to maintain any required reserves and to provide for 4 any deficits resulting from failure to receive sums payable to the Kansas water office water-related agency or agencies by such water users or, 56 participants in water assurance programs or beneficiaries of capital improvements for water-related infrastructure projects, or resulting from 7 any other cause, and shall sell the revenue bonds in the manner provided 8 9 by K.S.A. 10-106, and amendments thereto, at a price of not less than 10 90% of the par value thereof; and

11 (4) register the revenue bonds with the state treasurer.

(c) Prior to the issuance of the revenue bonds, the director agency*head or heads* may:

(1) Pledge to the payment of the principal and interest on the revenue
bonds for the purchase of large reservoir conservation storage capacity
the gross revenues derived from water supply contracts with water users
from revenue from participants in water assurance programs or from any
one or more or all of such sources;

(2) pledge to the payment of the principal of and interest on the
revenue bonds the proceeds of any grant-in-aid, gift, donation, bequest
or other such fund, or the income from any of such sources, obtained by
the Kansas water office water-related agency or agencies directly or in
trust;

24(3)pledge to the payment of the principal of and interest on any 25revenue bonds issued to acquire conservation water supply storage capacity in federal reservoirs for capital improvements for water-related 26 27 infrastructure projects, if moneys otherwise authorized to be pledged are 28insufficient, moneys appropriated from the following, in descending order 29 of priority: The state water plan fund created by K.S.A. 82a-951, and 30 amendments thereto, the state economic development initiatives fund 31 created by K.S.A. 79-4804, and amendments thereto or the state general 32 fund;

(4) create and maintain (A) revenue bond funds adequate to promptly
pay both the principal of and interest on the revenue bonds when they
become due and (B) a reasonable reserve fund; and

(5) covenant or contract with respect to any and all matters consistent with the authority granted herein necessary and convenient in the determination of the director agency head or heads to sell the revenue bonds and obtain the most favorable interest rate thereon, including, but not limited to, maturities, priority of liens, number of issuances, special funds for security, redemption privileges, investments of the proceeds of the revenue bonds and any other funds pledged to the payment thereof or held an accurity therefore accurity arresented to the payment thereof or

43 held as security therefor, security agreements, trust indentures, paying

1 agencies, registration provisions and conversion privileges.

2 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 82a-1362 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-3 1362. (a) Revenue bonds issued hereunder, including refunding revenue bonds authorized hereunder, shall be special obligations of the Kansas 4 water office development finance authority in accordance with their terms 5and shall not constitute an indebtedness of the state of Kansas or the 6 7 Kansas water office water-related agency or agencies, nor shall they constitute indebtedness within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory 8 9 provision limiting the incurring of indebtedness.

10 (b) All contracts, agreements and covenants contained in the reso-11 lution authorizing the issuance of revenue bonds shall be binding in all 12 respects upon the Kansas water office, its water-related agency or agen-13 cies and their officials, agents, employees and successors. Such agree-14 ments, contracts and covenants shall be enforceable by appropriate legal 15 action brought pursuant to the terms of the resolution authorizing the 16 issuance of revenue bonds.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 82a-1363 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a1363. The Kansas water office development finance authority may issue
revenue bonds for the purpose of refunding revenue bonds issued hereunder pursuant to the terms and authority of K.S.A. 10-116a 74-8912,
and amendments thereto.

22 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 82a-1364 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-23 1364. The proceeds derived from the sale of all any revenue bonds issued 24under this act shall be divided, if necessary, according to the bond agree-25ment and deposited to the credit of the Kansas water office appropriate 26 water-related agency or agencies in either an account administered pur-27 suant to K.S.A. 75-4251 et seq., and amendments thereto, or in an account 28arranged pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3799, and amendments thereto, and used 29 solely for the purposes for which the revenue bonds are authorized. The 30 director is agency head or heads are authorized to make all contracts and 31 execute all instruments which, in the director's discretion of the agency 32 *head or heads*, may be deemed necessary or advisable for the purpose of 33 either or both of the following purposes: (a) Acquiring a site or sites, constructing, reconstructing, improving and expanding large reservoir 34 35 projects or to finance financing the purchase of space in existing reservoirs 36 and to provide providing for the manner of disbursement of the funds 37 for such purposes; or (b) funding capital improvements for other water-38 related infrastructure projects. Other than contracts with federal, state or 39 local governmental units, contracts authorized by this act shall be made 40pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3739 or 75-3799, and amendments thereto. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed as placing in the state treasury 4142 any money collected under this act or requiring such action, and the

43 legislature hereby declares that funds deposited under this section shall

not be subject to the provisions of section 24 of article 2 of the Kansas
 constitution.

3 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 82a-1367 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-1367. (a) This act constitutes full and complete authority for the purposes 4 set out in this act, and no procedure or proceedings other than those 5required by this act shall be necessary for the performance of the provi-6 7 sions thereof. The powers conferred by this act shall be in addition and supplemental to and not in substitution for, and the limitations imposed 8 9 by this act shall not affect, the powers conferred on the Kansas water 10 office any water-related agency by any other law.

11 (b) The provisions of this act are severable, and if any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this act, including, but not 12 13 limited to, the provisions relating to any of the sources of revenues for 14 payment of bonds authorized pursuant to this act are for any reason held 15to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining 16 portions of this act. The legislature hereby declares that it would have 17passed this act and each provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause 1819 or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more of the same 20are declared invalid.

21Sec. 7. K.S.A. 82a-1368 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-22 1368. Prior to the issuance of any revenue bonds under authority of this act and after the adoption of a resolution authorizing any revenue bonds 2324under this act, the director appropriate agency head or heads shall cause 25to be published once in the Kansas register a notice to all persons inter-26 ested that the Kansas water office development finance authority has de-27 termined to issue revenue bonds under authority of this act. The notice 28shall state the amount or maximum amount of revenue bonds to be issued 29 pursuant to such resolution, together with a brief statement of the pur-30 poses for which the proceeds are to be used, and further, that unless an action to contest the legality of the proposed revenue bonds shall be filed 31 32 in a court of law within 30 days from the date of such publication, the 33 right to contest the legality of any revenue bonds issued in compliance with the proceedings taken by the Kansas water office water-related 34 35 agency or agencies prior to the date of such publication and the right to 36 contest the validity of the provisions of such proceedings shall cease to 37 exist and no court shall thereafter have authority to inquire into such 38 matters. After the expiration of the 30 days, no one shall have any right to commence an action contesting the validity of such revenue bonds or 39 40the provisions of such proceedings and all revenue bonds shall be con-41 clusively presumed to be legal, and no court shall thereafter have au-42 thority to inquire into such matters.

- 82a-1365, 82a-1367 and 82a-1368 are hereby repealed.Sec. 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
