9 AN ACT relating to drivers' licenses; concerning certain age restrictions; 10 amending K.S.A. 8-235d, 8-237, 8-239, 8-296, 8-297 and 8-2,147 and 11 K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 8-240 and repealing the existing sections. 1213 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. K.S.A. 8-235d is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-15235d. (a) Drivers' license examiners of the division shall accept original 16 applications for drivers' licenses and instruction permits, as distinguished 17from applications for renewals of licenses, on forms prescribed by the 18division and also shall issue instruction permits. Drivers' license examiners 19 of the division shall examine every applicant for a driver's license who is 20required by the provisions of the motor vehicle drivers' license act to be 21examined. Such examination shall be held in the county where the ap-22 plicant resides or at a place adjacent thereto reasonably convenient to the 23 applicant or at a location established by the secretary for the issuance of 24 a commercial driver's license. Such examination shall include a test of the 25applicant's eyesight, the applicant's ability to read and understand high-26 way signs regulating, warning and directing traffic, the applicant's knowl-27edge of the traffic laws of this state and shall include an actual demon-28stration of ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the 29operation of motor vehicles which the class of license applied for would 30 entitle the applicant to drive. At the conclusion of the examination the 31 examiner shall issue a license to the applicant, if the applicant has suc-32 cessfully passed the examination with the class of license the applicant 33 has applied for. 34 (b) In addition to the requirements of subsection (a): 35 (1) Any person applying for a driver's license shall comply with the 36 provisions of subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-240, and amendments thereto; 37 and 38 any person who is under the age of 18 years and at least 16 years (2)39 of age, who is applying for a driver's license for the first time, not including an instruction permit, shall submit a signed affidavit of either a parent or 40 41 guardian, stating that the applicant has completed at least 50 hours of 42adult supervised driving with at least 10 of those hours being at night. 43 The required adult supervised driving required in this subsection shall be conducted by an adult who is at least 21 years of age and is the holder of
 a valid commercial driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license.

Evidence of failure of any licensee who was required to complete the hours of adult supervised driving under this subsection shall not be admissible in any action for the purpose of determining any aspect of comparative negligence or mitigation of damages;; *or*

(3) any person 18 years of age or older, who is applying for a driver's
license for the first time, not including an instruction permit, shall be
required to hold a restricted license for a period of at least six months.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-237 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-237.
The division of vehicles shall not issue any driver's license to any person:
(a) Who is under the age of 16 18 years, except that the division may

13 issue:

14 (1) A nonrestricted license to a person under the age of 18 years who 15 submits documentation that the person holds a diploma or other certifi-16 cate of graduation issued to the person from a secondary school of this 17 state or any other state, or that the person holds a general education 18 development (GED) certificate from a state approved institution or or-19 ganization and has held a restricted license for a period of at least six 20 months; or

21 (2) a restricted class C or M license, as provided in this act, to any 22 person who: (1) (A) Is at least 15 years of age; (2) (B) has successfully 23 completed an approved course in driver training; (3) (C) has held an 24 instructional permit issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-239, and 25 amendments thereto, for a period of at least six months and has com-26 pleted at least 25 hours of adult supervised driving; and (4) (D) upon the 27 written application of the person's parent or guardian.

28The required adult supervised driving required in clause (3)(C) above 29 shall be conducted by an adult who is at least 21 years of age and is the 30 holder of a valid commercial driver's license, class A, B or C driver's 31 license. Except as hereafter provided, the application of the parent or 32 guardian shall be submitted to the division. The governing body of any 33 city, by ordinance, may require the application of any person who is under 34 16 18 years of age and who resides within the city to be first submitted 35 to the chief law enforcement officer of the city. The board of county 36 commissioners of any county, by resolution, may require the application 37 of any person who is under 16 18 years of age and who resides within the 38 county and outside the corporate limits of any city to be first submitted 39 to the chief law enforcement officer of the county. No ordinance or res-40olution authorized by this subsection shall become effective until a copy 41 of it is transmitted to the division of vehicles. The chief law enforcement 42 officer of any city or county which has adopted the ordinance or resolution 1 plication as to the necessity for the issuance of the restricted license, and

2 the recommendation shall be transmitted, with the application, to the 3 division of vehicles. If the division finds that it is necessary to issue the 4 restricted license, it shall issue a driver's license to the person.

5 A restricted class C license issued under this subsection shall entitle 6 the licensee, while possessing the license, to operate any motor vehicle 7 in class C, as designated in K.S.A. 8-234b, and amendments thereto. A 8 restricted class M license shall entitle the licensee, while possessing such 9 license, to operate a motorcycle. The restricted license shall entitle the 10 licensee to operate the appropriate vehicle at any time:

(1) While going to or from or in connection with any job, employmentor farm-related work;

(2) on days while school is in session, over the most direct and accessible route between the licensee's residence and school of enrollment
for the purposes of school attendance;

(3) when the licensee is operating a passenger car, at any time when
accompanied by an adult who is the holder of a valid commercial driver's
license, class A, B or C driver's license and who is actually occupying a
seat beside the driver; or

(4) when the licensee is operating a motorcycle, at any time when
accompanied by an adult who is the holder of a valid class M driver's
license and who is operating a motorcycle in the general proximity of the
licensee.

Any licensee issued a restricted license under this subsection *who is under 17 years of age* shall not operate any motor vehicle with nonsibling minor passengers and any conviction for violating this provision shall be construed as a moving traffic violation for the purpose of K.S.A. 8-255, and amendments thereto.

29A restricted driver's license issued under this subsection is subject to 30 suspension or revocation in the same manner as any other driver's license. 31 In addition, the division may suspend the restricted driver's license upon 32 receiving satisfactory evidence that: (1) The licensee has violated the re-33 striction of the license, (2) the licensee has been involved in two or more accidents chargeable to the licensee or (3) the recommendation of the 34 35 chief law enforcement officer of any city or county requiring the rec-36 ommendation has been withdrawn. The suspended license shall not be 37 reinstated for one year or until the licensee reaches the age of 16 18, 38 whichever period is longer.

39 Any licensee issued a restricted license under this subsection who: (1)

40 Is under the age of $\frac{16}{18}$ years and is convicted of two or more moving

41 traffic violations committed on separate occasions shall not be eligible to 42 receive a driver's license which is not restricted in accordance with the

42 receive a driver's license which is not restricted in accordance with the 43 provisions of this subsection until the person reaches 17 19 years of age; or (2) fails to provide the required affidavit stating that the licensee has
 completed at least 50 hours of adult supervised driving with 10 of those
 hours being at night shall not be eligible to receive a driver's license which
 is not restricted in accordance with the provisions of this subsection until
 the person provides such affidavit to the division or the person reaches
 17 19 years of age, whichever occurs first.

7 Any licensee issued a restricted license under this subsection on and 8 after July 1, 1999 2004, shall provide prior to reaching 16 18 years of age, 9 a signed affidavit of either a parent or guardian, stating that the applicant 10 has completed the required 25 hours prior to being issued a restricted 11 license and 25 hours of additional adult supervised driving. Of the 50 12 hours required by this subsection, at least 10 of those hours shall be at 13 night. The adult supervised driving shall be conducted by an adult who 14is at least 21 years of age and is the holder of a valid commercial driver's 15license, class A, B or C driver's license.

16 Evidence of failure of any licensee who was required to complete the 17 50 hours of adult supervised driving under this subsection shall not be 18 admissible in any action for the purpose of determining any aspect of 19 comparative negligence or mitigation of damages.

(b) Who is under the age of 18 years, except as provided in K.S.A. 82,147, and amendments thereto, for the purpose of driving a commercial
or class A or B motor vehicle.

(c) Whose license is currently revoked, suspended or canceled in this
or any other state, except as provided in K.S.A. 8-256, and amendments
thereto.

(d) Who is a habitual drunkard, habitual user of narcotic drugs or
habitual user of any other drug to a degree which renders the user incapable of safely driving a motor vehicle.

(e) Who has previously been adjudged to be afflicted with or suffering from any mental disability or disease and who, at the time of making application for a driver's license, has not been restored to capacity in the manner provided by law. Application of this limitation to any person known to have suffered any seizure disorder is subject to the provisions of paragraph (7) of subsection (e) of K.S.A. 8-247, and amendments thereto.

36 (f) Who is required by the motor vehicle drivers' license act to take 37 an examination, unless the person has successfully passed the 38 examination.

(g) Who is at least 16 18 years of age and less than 17 19 years of age, who is applying for a driver's license for the first time since reaching
16 18 years of age and who, three times or more, has been adjudged to
be a traffic offender under the Kansas juvenile code or a juvenile offender
under the Kansas juvenile justice code, by reason of violation of one or

more statutes regulating the movement of traffic on the roads, streets or 1 2 highways of this state, except that, in the discretion of the director, the 3 person may be issued a driver's license which is restricted in the manner 4 the division deems to be appropriate. No person described by this sub-5section shall be eligible to receive a driver's license which is not restricted 6 until the person has reached the age of 17 19 years. 7 (h) Who has not submitted proof of age or proof of identity, as re-8 quired by K.S.A. 8-240, and amendments thereto. 9 (i) Whose presence in the United States is in violation of federal im-10 migration laws. 11 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 8-239 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-239. (a) 12 Any person who is at least 14 15 years of age may apply to the division 13 for an instruction permit. The division may in its discretion, after the 14applicant has successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the driving test, issue to the applicant an instruction permit which shall 1516 entitle the applicant while having such permit in such person's immediate 17possession to drive a passenger car upon the public highways for a period 18of one year subject to the restrictions herein contained. The division may 19 issue an instruction or restricted instruction permit to any person who is 20at least 14 15 years of age and under the age of 16 18 years only upon 21the written application of a parent or guardian of the minor. The one 22 having the instruction permit may operate a passenger car at any time 23 when accompanied by an adult who is the holder of a valid commercial 24 driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license, who has had at least one 25year of driving experience and who is occupying a seat beside the driver. 26 Any person who is at least 14 15 years of age may apply for an instruction 27permit to operate a motorcycle either separate from or in conjunction 28with an instruction permit to operate a passenger car, and such permit 29shall entitle the permittee to operate a motorcycle if such person is ac-30 companied by an adult who is the holder of a valid class M driver's license, 31 who has had at least one year of driving experience and who is riding a 32 motorcycle in the general proximity of the permittee. 33 (b) The division upon receiving proper application may issue in its 34 discretion a restricted instruction permit effective for a school year or for 35 a more restricted period to an applicant who is at least 14 15 years of age 36 and who is enrolled in a driver-education program which includes practice 37 driving and which is approved by the division, even though the applicant 38 has not reached the legal age to be eligible for a driver's license. Such

instruction permit shall entitle the permittee when the person has such permit in such person's immediate possession to operate a passenger car only on a designated highway or within a designated area but only when

42 an approved instructor is occupying a seat beside the permittee or when

43 such permit has been endorsed by an approved instructor to operate a

passenger car with a parent or guardian who is the holder of a valid
 commercial driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license, who has had
 at least one year of driving experience and who is occupying a seat beside
 the driver.

 $\mathbf{5}$ (c) The division, in its discretion, may issue a temporary driver's per-6 mit to an applicant for a classified driver's license permitting the applicant 7 to operate a motor vehicle within such classification while the division is 8 completing its investigation and determination of all facts relative to such 9 applicant's right to receive a driver's license. The division may issue such 10 a temporary driver's permit to any applicant whose employer certifies that such permit is necessary to complete seasonal agricultural operations 11 12 of the employer. Any such temporary driver's permit issued pursuant to 13 this subsection shall be in the immediate possession of the permittee 14while operating a motor vehicle, and it shall be invalid on the date spec-15ified thereon, which shall not be more than 15 days after its issuance, or 16 when the applicant's license has been issued or for good cause has been 17refused.

18Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 8-240 is hereby amended to read as fol-19 lows: 8-240. (a) Every application for an instruction permit shall be made 20upon a form furnished by the division of vehicles and accompanied by a 21fee of \$2 for class A, B, C or M and \$5 for all commercial classes. Every 22 other application shall be made upon a form furnished by the division 23 and accompanied by an examination fee of \$3, unless a different fee is 24 required by K.S.A. 8-241, and amendments thereto, and by the proper 25fee for the license for which the application is made. If the applicant is 26not required to take an examination the examination fee shall not be 27required. The examination shall consist of three tests, as follows: (1) Vi-28sion; (2) written; and (3) driving. If the applicant fails the vision test, the 29applicant may have correction of vision made and take the vision test again 30 without any additional fee. If an applicant fails the written test, the ap-31 plicant may take such test again upon the payment of an additional ex-32 amination fee of \$1.50. If an applicant fails the driving test, the applicant 33 may take such test again upon the payment of an additional examination 34 fee of \$1.50. If an applicant fails to pass all three of the tests within a 35 period of six months from the date of original application and desires to 36 take additional tests, the applicant shall file an application for reexami-37 nation upon a form furnished by the division, which shall be accompanied 38 by a reexamination fee of \$3, except that any applicant who fails to pass 39 the written or driving portion of an examination four times within a six-40month period, shall be required to wait a period of six months from the 41 date of the last failed examination before additional examinations may be given. Upon the filing of such application and the payment of such re-42

manner and subject to the additional fees and time limitation as provided 1 2 for examination on an original application. If the applicant passes the 3 reexamination, the applicant shall be issued the classified driver's license for which the applicant originally applied, which license shall be issued 4 5to expire as if the applicant had passed the original examination. 6 (b) (1) For the purposes of obtaining any driver's license or instruc-7 tion permit, an applicant shall submit, with the application, proof of age 8 or proof of identity, or both, as the division may require. An applicant 9 shall submit the applicant's social security number or a taxpayer identi-10fication number if the applicant does not have a social security number, 11 which shall remain confidential and shall not be disclosed, except as pro-12 vided pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2012, and amendments thereto. If the ap-13 plicant does not have a social security number or a taxpayer identification 14number, the applicant shall submit a sworn statement, with the applica-15tion, stating that the applicant does not have a social security number or 16 taxpayer identification number. The distinguishing number assigned to 17the license or permit may be the applicant's social security number or a 18 taxpayer identification number if the applicant so requests in writing. If 19 the applicant is applying for an instruction permit or driver's license and 20the applicant otherwise meets the requirements for such license, the ap-21plicant shall receive a temporary license or instruction permit until the 22 division verifies all facts relative to such applicant's right to receive an 23 instruction permit or driver's license, including the age, identity, social 24 security number, taxpayer identification number and residency of the 25applicant. 26(2) An applicant who submits proof of age or of identity issued by an entity other than a state or the United States shall also submit such proof 2728as the division may require that the applicant is lawfully present in the 29United States. 30 The division shall not issue any driver's license to any person who (3)31 is not lawfully present in the United States. 32 (4)The division shall not issue any driver's license to any person who 33 is not a resident of the state of Kansas, except as provided in K.S.A. 8-34 2,148, and amendments thereto. 35 (5) The parent or guardian of an applicant under $\frac{16}{18}$ years of age 36 shall sign the application for any driver's license submitted by such 37 applicant. 38 (c) Every application shall state the name, date of birth, sex and res-39 idence address of the applicant, and briefly describe the applicant, and 40 shall state whether the applicant has been licensed as a driver prior to 41such application, and, if so, when and by what state or country. Such

42 application shall state whether any such license has ever been suspended

43 or revoked, or whether an application has ever been refused, and, if so,

43

the date of and reason for such suspension, revocation or refusal. In ad-1 2 dition, applications for commercial drivers' licenses and instruction per-3 mits for commercial licenses must include the following: The applicant's 4 social security number; the person's signature; the person's color photo-5graph; certifications, including those required by 49 C.F.R. 383.71(a), 6 effective January 1, 1991; a consent to release driving record information; 7 and, any other information required by the division. 8 (d) When an application is received from a person previously licensed 9 in another jurisdiction, the division shall request a copy of the driver's 10 record from the other jurisdiction. When received, the driver's record 11 shall become a part of the driver's record in this state with the same force 12 and effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state in the 13 original instance. 14(e) When the division receives a request for a driver's record from 15another licensing jurisdiction the record shall be forwarded without 16 charge. 17(f) A fee shall be charged as follows: 18(1) For a class C driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years 19 of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$18; 20(2) for a class C driver's license issued to a person less than 21 years 21of age or 65 years of age or older, or a farm permit, \$12; 22 (3)for a class M driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years 23of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$12.50; 24 (4) for a class M driver's license issued to a person less than 21 years 25of age or 65 years of age or older, \$9; 26(5)for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person who is at least 2721 years of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$24; 28(6) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person less than 21 29years of age or 65 years of age or older, \$16; or 30 for any class of commercial driver's license, \$18. K.S.A. 8-296 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-296. (a) 42Any person who is less than 16 18 years of age but is at least 14 years of

age and who resides upon a farm in this state or is employed for com-

pensation upon a farm in this state may apply to the division of vehicles 1 2 for a farm permit authorizing such person, while possessing the permit, 3 to operate any motor vehicle in class C, as designated in K.S.A. 8-234b, and amendments thereto. The farm permit shall entitle the licensee to 4 5operate such motor vehicles at any time: 6 (1) While going to or from or in connection with any farm job, em-7 ployment or other farm-related work; (2) on days while school is in session, over the most direct and ac-8 9 cessible route between the licensee's residence and school of enrollment 10 for the purpose of school attendance; or 11 (3) when the licensee is operating a passenger car at any time when 12accompanied by an adult who is the holder of a valid commercial driver's 13 license, class A, B or C driver's license and who is actually occupying a 14seat beside the driver. A farm permit shall be issued only if: 15(b) 16The applicant can prove that such applicant resides or works on (1)17a farm; 18(2)the applicant has successfully completed the examination require-19 ments in K.S.A. 8-235d, and amendments thereto; and 20

(3) the applicant submits the signed affidavit of either a parent or
guardian, stating that the applicant lives on a farm or, if the applicant
does not live on a farm but works on a farm, the applicant submits the
signed affidavit of the applicant's employer and parent or guardian, attesting to such employment.

(c) Any licensee issued a farm permit under this section *who is under 17 years of age* shall not operate any motor vehicle with nonsibling minor passengers and any conviction for violating this provision shall be construed as a moving traffic violation for the purpose of K.S.A. 8-255, and amendments thereto.

(d) As used in this section, "farm" means any parcel of land largerthan 20 acres which is used in agricultural operations.

(e) A farm permit issued under this section is subject to suspension
or revocation in the same manner as any other driver's license. A person
who has been issued a farm permit and who violates this section by driving
beyond the scope allowed in subsection (a) shall lose the farm permit and
shall be issued no other driver's license for a period of one year or until
the person reaches 16 18 years of age, whichever period is longer.

(f) Any licensee issued a farm permit under this section on and after
July 1, 1999 2004, shall provide prior to reaching 16 18 years of age, a
signed affidavit of either a parent or guardian, stating that the applicant
has completed at least 50 hours of adult supervised driving with at least
10 of those hours being at night. The adult supervised driving required

K.S.A. 8-297 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-297. 18Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, any person who held 19 any valid farm permit, class C or class M driver's license, restricted class 20C or class M driver's license, instruction permit or, restricted instruction 21permit or commercial driver's license issued pursuant to K.S.A. 8-2,147, 22 and amendments thereto, on the effective date of this act may continue 23 to operate motor vehicles subject to the conditions, limitations and re-24 strictions contained in K.S.A. 8-237 and 8-239, 8-239, 8-296 or 8-2,147,

25and amendments thereto, as in effect on June 30, 1993 2004. 26 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 8-2,147 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-2,147. 27(a) The division may issue a commercial driver's license to an applicant 28who is a resident of this state and who is at least 16 years of age for the 29 operation of commercial class B and commercial class C motor vehicles 30 for a farm custom harvesting operation. Any person applying for or who 31 is issued a commercial driver's license under this section shall be subject 32 to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-2,125 through 8-2,145, and amendments 33 thereto. 34 (b) For the purpose of this section, "farm custom harvesting opera-

tions" means a person, firm, partnership, association or corporation engaged in farm custom harvesting operations if the motor vehicle is used
to:

(1) Transport farm machinery, supplies, or both, to or from a farm,for custom harvesting operations on a farm; or

40 (2) transport custom harvested crops only from a harvested field to 41 initial storage or to initial market locations.

42 (c) In addition to the driving restrictions contained in this section, a

43 license issued under this section shall be subject to the driving restrictions
