HOUSE BILL No. 2733

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AN ACT relating to teachers; concerning employment after retirement; amending K.S.A. 74-4914 and repealing the existing section.

12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

13 Section 1. K.S.A. 74-4914 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-144914. (1) The normal retirement date for a member of the system shall 15be the first day of the month coinciding with or following termination of 16 employment with any participating employer not followed by employ-17ment with any participating employer within 30 days and the attainment 18 of age 65 or, commencing July 1, 1993, age 62 with the completion of 10 19 years of credited service or the first day of the month coinciding with or 20following the date that the total of the number of years of credited service 21and the number of years of attained age of the member is equal to or 22 more than 85. In no event shall a normal retirement date for a member 23be before six months after the entry date of the participating employer 24by whom such member is employed. A member may retire on the normal 25retirement date or on the first day of any month thereafter upon the filing 26 with the office of the retirement system of an application in such form 27 and manner as the board shall prescribe. Nothing herein shall prevent 28any person, member or retirant from being employed, appointed or 29 elected as an employee, appointee, officer or member of the legislature. 30 Elected officers may retire from the system on any date on or after the 31 attainment of the normal retirement date, but no retirement benefits 32 payable under this act shall be paid until the member has terminated such member's office. 33 34 (2)No retirant shall make contributions to the system or receive serv-35 ice credit for any service after the date of retirement. 36 Any member who is an employee of an affiliating employer pur-(3)

suant to K.S.A. 74-4954b and amendments thereto and has not withdrawn
such member's accumulated contributions from the Kansas police and
firemen's retirement system may retire before such member's normal
retirement date on the first day of any month coinciding with or following
the attainment of age 55.

42 (4) Any member may retire before such member's normal retirement43 date on the first day of any month coinciding with or following termination

of employment with any participating employer not followed by employment with any participating employer within 30 days and the attainment of age 55 with the completion of 10 years of credited service, but in no event before six months after the entry date, upon the filing with the office of the retirement system of an application for retirement in such form and manner as the board shall prescribe.

7 If a retirant who retired on or after July 1, 1988, is employed or (5)8 appointed in or to any position or office for which compensation for serv-9 ice is paid in an amount equal to \$15,000 or more in any one such calendar 10 year, by any participating employer for which such retirant was employed or appointed during the final two years of such retirant's participation, 11 12 such retirant shall not receive any retirement benefit for any month for 13 which such retirant serves in such position or office. The participating 14 employer shall report to the system within 30 days of when the compen-15sation paid to the retirant is equal to or exceeds any limitation provided by this section. Any retirant employed by a participating employer shall 16 17not make contributions nor receive additional credit under such system 18 for such service except as provided by this section. Upon request of the executive director of the system, the secretary of revenue shall provide 19 20such information as may be needed by the executive director to carry out 21the provisions of this act. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply 22 to retirants employed as substitute teachers or officers, employees or 23appointees of the legislature or certified teachers who have had at least 24a twelve-month separation from their employment after becoming eligible 25to retire from employment with their participating employer. The provi-26sions of this subsection shall not apply to members of the legislature prior 27to January 8, 2000. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to 28any other elected officials prior to the term of office of such elected 29 official which commences on or after July 1, 2000. The provisions of this 30 subsection shall apply to any other elected official on and after the term 31 of office of such other elected official which commences on or after July 32 1, 2000. Except as otherwise provided, commencing January 8, 2001, the 33 provisions of this subsection shall apply to members of the legislature. 34 For determination of the amount of compensation paid pursuant to this 35 subsection, for members of the legislature, compensation shall include 36 any amount paid as provided pursuant to subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d) 37 of K.S.A. 46-137a, and amendments thereto, or pursuant to K.S.A. 46-38 137b, and amendments thereto. Notwithstanding any provision of law to 39 the contrary, when a member of the legislature is paid an amount of 40 compensation of \$15,000 or more in any one calendar year, the member 41 may continue to receive any amount provided in subsections (b) and (d) 42 of K.S.A. 46-137a, and amendments thereto, and still be entitled to re-43 ceive such member's retirement benefit.

(6) For purposes of this section, any employee of a local governmental unit which has its own pension plan who becomes an employee of a participating employer as a result of a merger or consolidation of services provided by local governmental units, which occurred on January 1, 1994, $\mathbf{5}$ may count service with such local governmental unit in determining whether such employee has met the years of credited service require-ments contained in this section. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 74-4914 is hereby repealed. Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
