10 AN ACT concerning crimes, punishment and criminal procedure; relat-11 ing to arrest powers of federal law enforcement officers. 1213 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. (a) A federal law enforcement officer who enters this 15state may arrest a person, without a warrant, when in the view judgment 16 of the federal law enforcement officer a person: 17(1) Asserts physical force or uses forcible compulsion likely to cause 18death or great bodily harm to any person; or 19 (2) is committing an inherently dangerous felony as defined in K.S.A. 2021-3436, and amendments thereto. 21 (b) To provide assistance to law enforcement officers, a federal law 22 enforcement officer shall have the same authority as a law enforcement 23 officer where: 24 (1) The federal law enforcement officer is rendering assistance at the 25request of any law enforcement officer; or 26 (2) the federal law enforcement officer is effecting an arrest or pro-27viding assistance as part of a bona fide task force or joint investigation in 28which law enforcement officers are participating. 29Any lawful actions pursuant to this section shall be deemed to be (c) 30 within the scope of the federal law enforcement officer's employment. 31 (d) As used in this section: 32 (1)"Federal law enforcement officer" means a person employed by 33 the United States government and assigned to the federal bureau of investigation who is empowered to effect an arrest with or without a 34 35 warrant for violation of the United States code and who is authorized to 36 carry a firearm in the performance of the person's official duties as a 37 federal law enforcement officer. 38 "Law enforcement officer" has the meaning ascribed thereto in (2)39 K.S.A. 21-3110, and amendments thereto. 40 (e) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas 41criminal code. 42(**f**) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, 2007. 43
