Session of 2004 **HOUSE BILL No. 2792** By Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice 2-10 AN ACT concerning the regulation of traffic; relating to pedestrians; amending K.S.A. 8-1533 and repealing the existing section. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 8-1533 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1533. (a) When traffic-control signals are not in place or not in operation the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way, slowing down or stop-ping if need be to so yield, to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling, or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger. (b) No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close as to constitute an immediate hazard within 200 feet from such pedestrian. (c) Subsection (a) shall not apply under the conditions stated in sub-section (b) of K.S.A. 8-1534, and amendments thereto. (d) Whenever any vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the roadway, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear shall not overtake and pass such stopped vehicle. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-1533 is hereby repealed. Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
