K.S.A. 72-6438 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-15 6438. (a) The state school district finance fund, established by K.S.A. 1991 16 Supp. 72-7081 prior to its repeal by this act, is hereby continued in ex-17 istence and shall consist of (1) all moneys credited to such fund under 18 K.S.A. 72-6418 and 72-6431 and K.S.A. 72-6441, and amendments 19 thereto, and (2) all amounts transferred to such fund. 20 The state school district finance fund shall be used for the purpose 21 of school district finance and for no other governmental purpose. It is the 22 intent of the legislature that the fund shall remain intact and inviolate for 23 such purpose, and moneys in the fund shall not be subject to the provi-24 sions of K.S.A. 75-3722, 75-3725a and 75-3726a, and amendments 25 thereto. 26 Amounts in the state school district finance fund shall be allocated 27 and distributed to school districts as a portion of general state aid enti-28 tlements provided for under this act. 29 Any increase in the amount of the base state aid per pupil in school 30 year 2004-2005, and each year thereafter, which is attributable to revenue 31 transferred pursuant to K.S.A. 79-4804, and amendments thereto, shall 32 be used for the enhancement of salaries and benefits of teachers. If the revenue derived from such taxes exceeds the statutory amount of the base 34 state aid per pupil, the revenue in excess of such amount shall be trans-35 ferred to the special education services aid account in the state department 36 of education and shall be used for the enhancement of salaries and benefits 37 of teachers who are qualified to provide special education or related serv-38 ices to exceptional children. 39 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 79-4804 is hereby amended to read as 40 follows: 79-4804. (a) After the transfer of moneys pursuant to subsection 41 (b) and (c) and K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 79-4806, and amendments thereto, an

amount equal to 85% of the balance of all moneys credited to the state gaming revenues fund shall be transferred and credited to the state ee-

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onomic development initiatives fund. Expenditures from the state economic development initiatives fund shall be made in accordance with appropriations acts for the financing of such programs supporting and enhancing the existing economic foundation of the state and fostering growth through the expansion of current, and the establishment and attraction of new, commercial and industrial enterprises as provided by this section and as may be authorized by law and not less than ½ of such money shall be distributed equally among the congressional districts of the state. Except as provided by subsection (g), all moneys credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be credited within the fund, as provided by law, to an account or accounts of the fund which are created by this section.

- (b) There is hereby created the Kansas capital formation account in the state economic development initiatives fund. All moneys credited to the Kansas capital formation account shall be used to provide, encourage and implement capital development and formation in Kansas.
- (e) There is hereby created the Kansas economic development research and development account in the state economic development initiatives fund. All moneys credited to the Kansas economic development research and development account shall be used to promote, encourage and implement research and development programs and activities in Kansas and technical assistance funded through state educational institutions under the supervision and control of the state board of regents or other Kansas colleges and universities.
- (d) There is hereby created the Kansas economic development endowment account in the state economic development initiatives fund. All moneys credited to the Kansas economic development endowment account shall be accumulated and invested as provided in this section to provide an ongoing source of funds which shall be used for economic development activities in Kansas, including but not limited to continuing appropriations or demand transfers for programs and projects which shall include, but are not limited to, specific community infrastructure projects in Kansas that stimulate economic growth.
- (e) Except as provided in subsection (f), the director of investments may invest and reinvest moneys credited to the state economic development initiatives fund in accordance with investment policies established by the pooled money investment board under K.S.A. 75-4232, and amendments thereto, in the pooled money investment portfolio. All moneys received as interest earned by the investment of the moneys credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic development endowment account of such fund.
- 3 (f) Moneys eredited to the Kansas economic development endow-

 ment account of the state economic development initiatives fund may be invested in government guaranteed loans and debentures as provided by law in addition to the investments authorized by subsection (e) or in lieu of such investments. All moneys received as interest earned by the investment under this subsection of the moneys credited to the Kansas economic development endowment account shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic development endowment account of the state economic development initiatives fund school district finance fund described in K.S.A. 72-6438, and amendments thereto.

- (g) (b) In each fiscal year, the director of accounts and reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and January 15 which in the aggregate equal \$2,000,000 from the state economic development initiatives general fund to the state water plan fund created by K.S.A. 82a-951, and amendments thereto, except that the aggregate amount of the transfers on such dates during state fiscal year 2004 shall not exceed \$1,900,000. No other moneys credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be used for: (1) Water-related projects or programs, or related technical assistance; or (2) any other projects or programs, or related technical assistance, which meet one or more of the long-range goals, objectives and considerations set forth in the state water resource planning act.
- (c) On July 1 of each year or as soon thereafter as sufficient moneys are available, \$10,000,000 shall be transferred and credited to the state board of regents adult education fund created by section 3, and amendments thereto.
- (d) The state economic development initiatives fund is hereby abolished. All moneys in such fund shall be transferred to the state general fund.
- New Sec. 3. (a) There is hereby established in the state treasury the state board of regents adult education fund. All moneys credited to such fund shall be used only for adult basic education programs and the cost of administration of such programs. Such fund shall be administered in accordance with this section and the provisions of appropriation acts.
- (b) All expenditures from the state board of regents adult education fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved in the manner prescribed by law.
- Sec. 4. K.S.A. 72-6438 and K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 79-4804 are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
