AN ACT concerning horse pulling; providing for adoption and enforcement of certain standards.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The livestock commissioner appointed by the Kansas animal health board shall adopt rules and regulations providing standards for the conduct of horse pulls which will protect the health of the horses and drivers and the integrity of the sport. Such standards may include, without limitation, rules for conducting horse pulls, the manner of weighing horses or teams, the type of equipment to be used and prohibition of the use of certain stimulants and drugs and requirements for veterinarian examination of horses for use of such stimulants and drugs.

- (b) The rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this section may include a schedule of administrative fines in amounts not exceeding \$500 for violation of standards adopted pursuant to this section. In addition, such rules and regulations may provide disqualification of a teamster's horses from participating in any horse pull in the state for a period not to exceed one year for violations relating to the use of stimulants or other prohibited drugs.
- (c) Any duly authorized agent of the livestock commissioner, upon a finding that any person has violated a provision of rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this section may impose a civil penalty upon the violator in accordance with the schedule of fines provided by such rules and regulations.
- (d) No civil penalty shall be imposed pursuant to this section except upon the written order of the duly authorized agent of the livestock commissioner to the person who committed the violation. Such order shall state the violation, the penalty to be imposed and the right of the person to appeal to the commissioner. Any such person, within 20 days after notification, may make written request to the commissioner for a hearing in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act. The commissioner shall affirm, reverse or modify the order and shall specify the reasons therefor.
- (e) Any person aggrieved by an order of the commissioner pursuant to this section may appeal such order to the district court in the manner
