10 AN ACT concerning the medical student loan act practice obligations 11 for certain students of allopathic or osteopathic medicine re-12**ceiving financial assistance**; relating to service commitment areas; 13 amending K.S.A. 74-3266 and K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 76-381 and re-14pealing the existing section sections. 1516Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 17Section 1. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 76-381 is hereby amended to read as 18follows: 76-381. As used in K.S.A. 76-380 through 76-386 and amend-19 ments thereto: 20 (a) "Act" means the medical student loan act; 21(b) "approved postgraduate residency training program" means a res-22 idency training program in general pediatrics, general internal medicine, 23 family medicine, family practice or emergency medicine; 24 (c) "service commitment area" means (1) any community within any 25county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, or, Shawnee 26 or Wyandotte or Wyandotte county, (2) any state medical care facility 27or institution, (3) any medical center operated by the veterans adminis-28tration of the United States, or (4) the full-time faculty of the university of Kansas school of medicine in family medicine or family practice; or 2930 (5) any community within Wyandotte county for purposes of any 31 practice obligation under an agreement entered into by a person 32 who is enrolled for the first time after July 1, 2004, in a course of 33 study leading to the medical degree; and "state medical care facility or institution" includes, but is not lim-34 (d) 35 ited to, the Kansas state school for the visually handicapped, the Kansas 36 state school for the deaf, any institution under the secretary of social and 37 rehabilitation services, as defined by subsection (b) of K.S.A. 76-12a01 38 and amendments thereto, any institution under the commissioner of ju-39 venile justice as defined by K.S.A. 38-1602, and amendments thereto, the 40 Kansas soldiers' home, the Kansas veterans' home and any correctional 41 institution under the secretary of corrections, as defined by subsection 42(d) of K.S.A. 75-5202 and amendments thereto, but shall not include any 43 state educational institution under the state board of regents, as defined 1 by subsection (a) of K.S.A. 76-711 and amendments thereto, except as 2 specifically provided by statute.

3 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 74-3266 is hereby amended to read as follows: 4 74-3266. (a) An agreement entered into by the state board of re-5gents and a Kansas resident who is an undergraduate student en-6 rolled in or admitted to an accredited school of osteopathic med-7 icine in a course of instruction leading to the degree of doctor of 8 osteopathy for the awarding of an osteopathic medical service 9 scholarship shall require that the person receiving the scholarship: 10 Complete the required course of instruction and receive (1) the degree of doctor of osteopathy; 11 12(2)apply for and obtain a license to practice medicine and sur-13 gery in Kansas; 14(3) except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), engage in 15the practice of medicine and surgery in Kansas on a full-time basis 16 for a period of 12 months for each year a scholarship was received 17or on a part-time basis for a period equivalent to 12 months, as 18determined by the state board of regents, for each year a schol-19 arship was received; 20(4) (A) with regard to persons entering into agreements prior 21to the effective date of this act, commence such full-time or part-22 time practice of medicine and surgery within nine months after 23 licensure or within nine months after completion of an approved 24 postgraduate residency training program and licensure, whichever 25is later, and continue such practice in Kansas for a consecutive 26period of months equal to the total number of months required 27under the agreement; 28(B) with regard to persons entering into agreements after the 29effective date of this act, commence such full-time or part-time 30 practice of medicine and surgery within six months after licensure 31 or within six months after completion of an approved postgraduate 32 residency training program and licensure, whichever is later, and 33 continue such practice in Kansas for a consecutive period of months equal to the total number of months required under the 34 35 agreement; 36 agree that the service commitment for each agreement en-(5) 37 tered into under this section is in addition to the service commit-38 ment contained in any other agreement which has been or may be

entered into under this section for the purpose of obtaining schol arship aid;

41 (6) maintain records and make reports to the state board of
42 regents to document satisfaction of the obligation under such
43 agreement to engage in the full-time or part-time practice of med-

icine and surgery in Kansas and to continue such practice for a 1 2 consecutive period of months equal to the total number of months 3 required under the agreement; and (7) repay amounts to the state board of regents as provided in 4 5K.S.A. 74-3267, and amendments thereto, upon failure to engage 6 in the full-time or part-time practice of medicine and surgery in 7 Kansas for the required period of time under any agreement en-8 tered into as provided in this section. 9 (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), each Kansas 10student who enters into an agreement as provided in this section 11 shall serve the practice obligations incurred by such student under 12the agreement in a rural area or a medically underserved area. 13 (c) (1) A person awarded an osteopathic medical service schol-14arship may satisfy the obligation to engage in the practice of med-15icine and surgery under an agreement entered into pursuant to 16this section, even though such person is engaged in practice in an 17area not designated a rural area or a medically underserved area, 18through employment by the state of Kansas on a part-time basis, 19 which employment has been approved by the state board of re-20gents, for the practice of medicine and surgery at any state medical 21care facility or institution. 22 (2) For the purposes of this subsection, service or employment 23 at a state medical care facility or institution on a part-time basis of 24at least the equivalent of 1/2 time shall satisfy the obligation to en-25gage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in Kansas 26 for a period of 12 months for each year a scholarship was received 27as provided in an agreement entered into under this section. 28(d) For the purposes of the osteopathic medical service schol-29arship program (1) "state medical care facility or institution" has 30 the meaning ascribed thereto in subsection (k) of K.S.A. 76-375, 31 and amendments thereto; (2) "approved postgraduate residency 32 training program" means a residency training program in general 33 internal medicine, pediatrics, family medicine, family practice, ob-34 stetrics and gynecology, or emergency medicine; (3) "medically 35 underserved area" means a practice location designated medically 36 underserved by the state board of regents; and (4) "rural area" 37 means any county of this state other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, 38 Shawnee and Wyandotte counties has the meaning ascribed to "service 39 commitment area" by subsection (c) of K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 76-381, and 40amendments thereto. 41Sec. 2. 3.
