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9 AN ACT concerning the state health care benefits program; relating to 10 participation of public school districts; amending K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 11 75-6506 and repealing the existing section. 1213 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-6506 is hereby amended to read as 15follows: 75-6506. (a) The participation of a person qualified to participate 16in the state health care benefits program shall be voluntary, and the cost 17of the state health care benefits program for such person shall be estab-18lished by the Kansas state employees health care commission. 19 Periodic deductions from state payrolls may be made in accord-(b) 20ance with procedures prescribed by the secretary of administration to 21cover the costs of the state health care benefits program payable by per-22 sons who are on the state payroll when authorized by such persons. Any 23 such periodic payroll deductions in effect on an implementation date for 24 biweekly payroll periods shall be collected in the manner prescribed by 25the secretary of administration. 26 In the event that the Kansas state employees health care com-(c) 27mission designates by rules and regulations a group of persons on the 28payroll of a county, township, city, special district or other local govern-29mental entity, public school district, licensed child care facility operated 30 by a not-for-profit corporation providing residential group foster care for 31 children and receiving reimbursement for all or part of such care from 32 the department of social and rehabilitation services, nonprofit community 33 mental health center, as provided in K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq., and amend-34 ments thereto, nonprofit community facility for the mentally retarded, as 35 provided in K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq., and amendments thereto, or nonprofit 36 independent living agency, as defined in K.S.A. 65-5101 and amendments 37 thereto, as qualified to participate in the state health care benefits pro-38 gram, periodic deductions from payrolls of the local governmental entity, 39 public school district, licensed child care facility operated by a not-for-40 profit corporation providing residential group foster care for children and 41 receiving reimbursement for all or part of such care from the department 42of social and rehabilitation services, nonprofit community mental health 43 center, as provided in K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq., and amendments thereto,

nonprofit community facility for the mentally retarded, as provided in 1 2 K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq., and amendments thereto, or nonprofit independ-3 ent living agency, as defined in K.S.A. 65-5101 and amendments thereto, 4 may be made to cover the costs of the state health care benefits program 5payable by such persons when authorized by such persons. All such mon-6 eys deducted from payrolls shall be remitted to the Kansas state employ-7 ees health care commission in accordance with the directions of the 8 commission. 9 (d) On and after July 1, 2002, Whenever the Kansas state employees 10 health care commission designates any entity listed in subsection (c) as qualified to participate in the state health care benefits program, such 11 12 entity's participation shall be conditioned upon the following: 13 (1) At least 70% of such entity's employees shall participate in the 14state health care plan; 15(2) except as provided by paragraph (6) (7) or (8) of this subsection, 16 the rate of the premium paid by the entity as the employer's share of the 17total amount of premium paid shall be at least equal to the rate paid by 18 the state of Kansas for its employees; 19 the entity shall not create, maintain or permit any exemption from (3)20 participation in the state health care plan for such entity's employees; 21(4)the rate charged to such entity shall be sufficient to pay for any 22 administrative or underwriting costs incurred by the state employees 23 health care commission; 24 (5) the rate charged to such entity shall not increase the rate of pre-25mium paid by the state of Kansas for its employees; 26 (6) the entity shall elect to participate for a minimum of three con-27 secutive years in the state health care benefits program; and 28(7) the commission may authorize an entity, other than a public 29school district, to pay less than the state rate for the employee coverage 30 for no more than three years and no more than five years for dependent 31 coverage on the condition that the entity elects to participate for at least 32 three consecutive years after first paying the state rate for employee cov-33 erage; and 34 (8) the rate of the premium paid by a public school district as the 35 employer's share of the total amount of premium may be less than the 36 rate paid by the state of Kansas for its employees. 37 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-6506 is hereby repealed. 38 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 39 publication in the statute book.
