1 As Amended by House Committee 2 Session of 2003 3 **House Concurrent Resolution No. 5007** 4 $\mathbf{5}$ 6 By Committee on Utilities 7 8 1 - 289 10 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the Federal Energy Regu-11 latory Commission to take action to ensure expansion and improvement of the electric transmission system to meet the nation's energy 12 13 needs work to develop sufficient electric transmission facility in-14 frastructure and design and implement regional transmission 15organizations and cost recovery mechanisms. 16 17 WHEREAS, The electric transmission system in the United States is 18 an extensive network of high-voltage power lines which transport elec-19 tricity from generators to consumers and which must accommodate the 20 nation's growing demand for reliable and affordable power; and 21WHEREAS, The system is rapidly becoming congested due to growth 22 in demand, investment in new generation facilities and lack of investment 23 in expansion and improvement of transmission facilities; and 24WHEREAS, Expansion and improvement of the transmission system 25is vital to the national interest because congestion creates bottlenecks 26 which result in decreased reliability, less competition, higher prices to 27 consumers and increased infrastructure vulnerability; and 28WHEREAS, Kansas is third The United States Department of En-29 ergy recognizes that Kansas is first in the nation in wind energy pro-30 duction potential and has adopted incentives for investment in wind gen-31 eration and generation from other resources, but expansion of generation 32 is dependent on a transmission system that will efficiently and reliably 33 deliver power to markets; and 34 WHEREAS, The existing transmission system, while capable of pro-35 viding reliable service to the native load in Kansas for the foreseeable 36 future, does not have capacity to import additional power from outside the state or export additional power to markets beyond the state's bound-37 aries unless the system is redesigned to do so; and 38 39 -WHEREAS, Because uncertainty in how transmission system expan-40 sion and improvements will be financed and lack of regulatory direction 41 hamper investment in transmission facilities, the leadership of the Federal 42 Energy Regulatory Commission is crucial to resolution of the problems 43 that exist in the transmission system is increasingly incapable of providing reliable service to the native load in Kansas and does not
 have the capacity to support economic development of renewable
 and fossil-fuel resources or to economically dispatch power within
 the state; and

5 WHEREAS, The existing transmission system experiences sig-6 nificant constraints to the importation of additional power from 7 outside the state and export of additional power to markets beyond 8 the state's boundaries in support of national energy reliability and 9 clean air standards; and

WHEREAS, The leadership of the Federal Energy Regulatory
Commission is crucial to resolving issues related to cost recovery
of transmission facility upgrades and regional transmission system
reliability issues: Now, therefore,

14Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas, 15the Senate concurring therein: That the Legislature urges the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to assume an aggressive leadership role 16 in development of sufficient transmission infrastructure to support the 17nation's growing energy needs and to provide expeditiously for the estab-18 lishment of standard market design and implementation of regional trans-19 20 mission organizations work with the State of Kansas in development 21of sufficient transmission facility infrastructure to support the 22 state's economic development efforts and the nation's growing energy, security and reliability needs, along with the design and im-23 24plementation of regional transmission organizations and cost re-25covery mechanisms; and

26 Be it further resolved: That the Secretary of State is directed to pro-27 vide a copy of this enrolled resolution to each member of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the President of the United States, the 2829 Vice-President of the United States, the United States Secretary of En-30 ergy, the President Pro Tempore of the United States Senate, the Mi-31 nority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United 32 States House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the United 33 States House of Representatives, each member of the Kansas Congressional delegation, the State Corporation Commission, the Nebraska 34 35 Power Review Board, the Missouri Public Service Commission, the 36 Oklahoma Corporation Commission and the Public Utility Commission 37 of Texas.

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
