12	A PROPOSITION to amend article 15 of the constitution of the state of
13	Kansas by adding a new section thereto, concerning marriage.

15	Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the
16	members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Repre-
17	sentatives and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and
18	qualified to the Senate concurring therein:
19	Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of the
20	state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state
21	for their approval or rejection: Article 15 of the constitution of the state
22	of Kansas is amended by adding a new section thereto to read as follows:
23	"§ 16. Marriage. (a) The marriage contract is to be considered in
24	law as a civil contract. Marriage shall be constituted by one man
25	and one woman only and the rights, [benefits,] privileges and in-
26	cidents of marriage shall inure only to the benefit of parties to such
27	a marriage. All other marriages are declared to be contrary to the
28	public policy of this state and are void. "
29	"(b) No relationship other than a marriage between one man
30	and one woman shall be recognized by the state as being
31	entitled to the benefits [rights, benefits, privileges and inci-
32	dents] of marriage."
33	Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with
34	the amendment as a whole:
35	<i>"Explanatory statement.</i> There is currently no constitutional provision
36	regarding the marriage relationship.
37	"A vote for this proposition would provide in the constitution that
38	marriage is a civil contract between a man and a woman and that
39	all other marriages are void, and that no relationship other than
40	a marriage between one man and one woman shall be rec-
41	ognized by the state as being entitled to the benefits [rights,
42	benefits, privileges and incidents] of marriage.
43	"A vote against this proposition would allow the legislature to continue

to determine by statute the nature of the marriage relationship will 1 2 not amend the Kansas constitution in the manner described 3 above." 4 Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members $\mathbf{5}$ elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives, and 6 two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the 7 Senate, shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and nays. The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as pro-8 9 vided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted 10 to the electors of the state at the general election in November in the year 2004 unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent 1112 resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the

13 electors of the state at the special election.
