## **HOUSE Substitute for SENATE BILL No. 166**

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9 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to compliance with the help 10 America vote act of 2002; relating to disabled voters; amending K.S.A. 11 25-1122d, 25-1123, 25-2710, 25-2909 and K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 25-1122, 1225-2309, 25-2908 and 25-3002 and repealing the existing sections. 13 14Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 15Section 1. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as 16 follows: 25-1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county elec-17tion officer where such person is a resident, or where such person is 18 authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for 19 an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only 20to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as 21otherwise provided by law. 22 (b) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to 23 be transmitted in person, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter 24 shall provide a form of valid identification such as a current and valid 25Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank 26 statement, paycheck, government check or other government document 27containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on the reg-28istration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide identification 29if such voter has previously provided current and valid identification in 30 the county where registered. 31 (c) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to 32 be transmitted by mail, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter 33 shall provide on the application for an advance voting ballot the voter's 34 current and valid Kansas driver's license number, nondriver's identifi-35 cation card number or the last four digits of the voter's social security 36 number, or shall provide with the application a copy of the voter's current 37 and valid Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility 38 bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or other government 39 document containing the voter's current name and address as indicated 40 on the registration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide iden-41tification if such voter has previously provided current and valid identi-42fication in the county where registered. 43 If a first-time voter is unable or refuses to provide current and (d)

valid identification, or if the name and address do not match the voter's 1 2 name and address on the registration book, the voter may vote a provi-3 sional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and amendments thereto. The 4 voter shall provide a valid form of identification as defined in subsection 5(c) of this section to the county election officer in person or provide a 6 copy by mail or electronic means before the meeting of the county board 7 of canvassers. At the meeting of the county board of canvassers the county 8 election officer shall present copies of identification received from provi-9 sional voters and the corresponding provisional ballots. If the county 10 board of canvassers determines that a voter's identification is valid and 11 the provisional ballot was properly cast, the ballot shall be counted. 12(e)Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to the 13 voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times: 14(1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August 15in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and the last busi-16 ness day of the week preceding such primary election. 17(2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the 18first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between 90 days 19 prior to such election and the last business day of the week preceding 20such general election. 21(3) For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first Tues-22 day in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last 23business day of the week preceding such primary election. 24 (4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day 2526of the week preceding such general election. 27(5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a pri-28mary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for election 29of officers at such election. 30 (6) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a 31 primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice 32 thereof and the last business day of the week preceding such question 33 submitted election, except that if the question submitted election is held 34 on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine 35 the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots, but such date shall 36 not be more than three business days before such election. 37 (7) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified by 38 the secretary of state. 39 (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1 of the year in which such primary is held and the last business day of the 40 41week preceding such primary election. 42 The county election officer of any county may receive applications prior 43 to the time specified in this subsection (b)(e) and hold such applications until the beginning of the prescribed application period. Such applications
 shall be treated as filed on that date.

3 (e) (f) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election 4 office, applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in 5person in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the 6 Tuesday next preceding the election and on each subsequent business 7 day until no later than 12:00 noon on the day preceding such election. If 8 the county election officer so provides, applications for advance voting 9 ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county elec-10 tion officer also may be filed on the Saturday preceding the election. 11 Upon receipt of any such properly executed application, the county elec-12tion officer shall deliver to the voter such ballots and instructions as are 13 provided for in this act.

An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter who has a temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the close of the polls on election day.

In any county having a population exceeding 250,000, the county election officer may designate places other than the central county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for advance voting ballots, such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by this subsection.

26 (d)(g) Any person having a permanent physical disability or an illness 27 which has been diagnosed as a permanent illness is hereby authorized to 28 make an application for permanent advance voting status. Applications 29 for permanent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such 30 information as is required for application for advance voting ballots and 31 also shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to per-32 manent advance voting status.

33 (e) (h) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this 34 section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such 35 officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such 36 applications, together with their correct post office address and the pre-37 cinct, ward, township or voting area in which such persons claim to be 38 registered voters or to be authorized by law to vote as former precinct 39 residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Such names 40 and addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The 41county election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names and 42addresses of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status. All 43 such lists shall be available for inspection upon request in compliance

with this subsection by any registered voter during regular business hours. 1 2 The county election officer upon receipt of such applications shall enter 3 upon a record kept by such officer the name and address of each appli-4 cant, which record shall conform to the list above required. Before in- $\mathbf{5}$ spection of any advance voting ballot application list, the person desiring 6 to make such inspection shall provide to the county election officer iden-7 tification in the form of driver's license or other reliable identification and 8 shall sign a log book or application form maintained by such officer stating 9 such person's name and address and showing the date and time of in-10 spection. All records made by the county election officer shall be subject 11 to public inspection, except that the voter identification information re-12quired by subsections (b) and (c) and the identifying number on ballots 13 and ballot envelopes and records of such number numbers shall not be 14made public. 15(f) (i) If a person on the permanent advance voting list fails to vote 16 in two consecutive general elections held on the Tuesday succeeding the 17first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, the county elec-18tion officer may mail a notice to such voter. Such notice shall inform the 19 voter that the voter's name will be removed from the permanent advance 20 voting list unless the voter renews the application for permanent advance 21voting status within 30 days after the notice is mailed. If the voter fails to 22 renew such application, the county election officer shall remove the 23 voter's name from the permanent advance voting list. Failure to renew 24 the application for permanent advance voting status shall not result in 25removal of the voter's name from the voter registration list. 26 (j) For the purposes of this section, "first-time voter" means a regis-27tered voter who has not previously voted in any election in the county in 28which the voter desires to vote. First-time voter includes a person whose 29name was removed from the county registration list in accordance with 30 K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, and who has re-registered. 31 (k) The secretary of state may adopt rules and regulations defining 32 valid forms of identification. 33 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-1122d is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-34 1122d. 43	(c) An application for permanent advance voting status shall be on a		

form prescribed by the secretary of state for this purpose. Such applica-1 2 tion shall contain an affirmation concerning substantially the same infor-3 mation required in subsection (a) and in addition thereto a statement 4 regarding the permanent character of such illness or disability. 5(e) (d) Any application by a former precinct resident shall state both 6 the former and present residence, address, precinct and county of such 7 former precinct resident and the date of change of residence. 8 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 25-1123 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-9 1123. (a) When an application for an advance voting ballot has been filed 10in accordance with K.S.A. 25-1122, and amendments thereto, the county 11 election officer shall transmit to the voter applying therefor one each of 12 the appropriate ballots. Except as provided by subsection (b), the county 13 election officer shall transmit the advance voting ballots to the voter at 14one of the following addresses as specified by the voter on such appli-15cation: (1) The voter's residential address or mailing address as indicated 16 on the registration list; (2) the voter's temporary residential address; or 17(3) a medical care facility as defined in K.S.A. 65-425, and amendments 18thereto, psychiatric hospital, hospice or adult care home where the voter 19 resides. No advance voting ballot shall be transmitted by the county elec-20tion officer by any means prior to the 20th day before the election for 21which an application for an advance voting ballot has been received by 22 such county election officer. If the advance voting ballot is transmitted 23 by mail, such ballot shall be transmitted with printed instructions pre-24 scribed by the secretary of state and a ballot envelope bearing upon the 25outside a printed form as described in K.S.A. 25-1120, and amendments 26thereto, and the same number as the number of the ballot. If the advance 27voting ballot is transmitted to the applicant in person in the office of the 28county election officer or at a satellite advance voting site, such advance 29voting ballot and printed instructions shall be transmitted in an advance 30 voting ballot envelope bearing upon the outside a printed form as de-31 scribed in K.S.A. 25-1120, and amendments thereto, and the same num-32 ber as the number of the ballot unless the voter elects to deposit the 33 advance voting ballot into a locked ballot box without an envelope. All 34 ballots shall be transmitted to the advance voting voter not more than 20 35 days before the election but within two business days of the receipt of 36 such voter's application by the election officer or the commencement of 37 such 20-day period. In primary elections required to be conducted on a 38 partisan basis, the election officer shall deliver to such voter the ballot of 39 the political party of the applicant. 40 (b) The restrictions in subsection (a) relating to where a county elec-

(b) The restrictions in subsection (a) relating to where a county elec tion officer may transmit an advance voting ballot shall not apply to an
 advance voting ballot requested pursuant to an application for an advance
 voting ballot filed by a sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter who has

1 *a temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the* 2 *English language.* 

3 (c) The county election officer shall compare the driver's license number, nondriver's identification card number, social security number or 4 copy of other valid identification provided by a first-time voter to the 56 voter registration list verified by the division of motor vehicles in accord-7 ance with federal law. If no identification information was provided by the first-time voter, or if such information does not match the information 8 9 on the voter registration list, the county election officer shall not transmit 10 an advance voting ballot.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 25-2309 is hereby amended to read as 11 12 follows: 25-2309. (a) Any person may apply in person, by mail, through a 13 voter registration agency, or by other delivery to a county election officer 14to be registered. Such application shall be made on: (1) A form approved by the secretary of state, which shall be provided by a county election 1516 officer or chief state election official upon request in person, by telephone 17or in writing; or (2) the mail voter registration application prescribed by 18 the federal election commission. Such application shall be signed by the 19 applicant under penalty of perjury and shall contain the original signature 20of the applicant or the computerized, electronic or digitized transmitted 21signature of the applicant. A signature may be made by mark, initials, 22 typewriter, print, stamp, symbol or any other manner if by placing the 23 signature on the document the person intends the signature to be binding. 24 A signature may be made by another person at the voter's direction if the 25signature reflects such voter's intention.

(b) Applications made under this section shall give voter eligibility
requirements and such information as is necessary to identify the applicant and to determine the qualifications of the applicant as an elector and
the facts authorizing such person to be registered, including, but not
limited to, the following data:

31 (1) Name;

(2) place of residence, including specific address or location, and
 mailing address if the residence address is not a permissible postal ad dress;

35 (3) date of birth;

36 (4) sex;

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(5) the last four digits of the person's social security number or the
 *person's full driver's license or nondriver's identification card number*;

39 (6) telephone number, if available;

(7) naturalization data (if applicable);

41 (8) if applicant has previously registered or voted elsewhere, resi-

42 dence at time of last registration or voting;43 (9) when present residence established;

1 (10) name under which applicant last registered or voted, if different 2 from present name;

3 (11) an attestation that the applicant meets each eligibility require-4 ment;

5 (12) a statement that the penalty for submission of a false voter reg-6 istration application is a maximum presumptive sentence of 17 months in 7 prison;

8 (13) a statement that, if an applicant declines to register to vote, the 9 fact that the applicant has declined to register will remain confidential 10 and will be used only for voter registration purposes;

(14) a statement that if an applicant does register to vote, the office
to which a voter registration application is submitted will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes; and

(15) boxes for the applicant to check to indicate whether the applicant
is or is not a citizen of the United States, together with the question "Are
you a citizen of the United States of America?";

(16) boxes for the applicant to check to indicate whether or not the
applicant will be 18 years of age or older on election day, together with
the question "Will you be 18 years of age on or before election day?";

20 (17) in reference to paragraphs (15) and (16) the statement "If you 21 checked 'no' in response to either of these questions, do not complete this 22 form.";

(18) a statement that the applicant may be required to provide iden tification when voting; and

(15) (19) political party affiliation declaration, if any. An applicant's
failure to make a declaration will result in the applicant being registered
as an unaffiliated voter.

If the application discloses any previous registration in any other county or state, as indicated by paragraph (8) or (10), or otherwise, the county election officer shall upon the registration of the applicant, give notice to the election official of the place of former registration, notifying such official of applicant's present residence and registration, and authorizing cancellation of such former registration.

34 (c) Any person who applies for registration through a voter registra35 tion agency shall be provided with, in addition to the application under
36 subsection (b), a form which includes:

(1) The question "If you are not registered to vote where you livenow, would you like to apply to register to vote here today?";

(2) a statement that if the applicant declines to register to vote, this
decision will remain confidential and be used only for voter registration
purposes;

42 (3) a statement that if the applicant does register to vote, information 43 regarding the office to which the application was submitted will remain 1 confidential and be used only for voter registration purposes; and

2 (4) if the agency provides public assistance, (i) the statement "Apply3 ing to register or declining to register to vote will not affect the amount
4 of assistance that you will be provided by this agency.";

(ii) boxes for the applicant to check to indicate whether the applicant
would like to register or declines to register to vote, together with the
statement "IF YOU DO NOT CHECK EITHER BOX, YOU WILL BE
CONSIDERED TO HAVE DECIDED NOT TO REGISTER TO
VOTE AT THIS TIME.";

(iii) the statement "If you would like help in filling out the voter
registration application form, we will help you. The decision whether to
seek or accept help is yours. You may fill out the application form in
private."; and

(iv) the statement "If you believe that someone has interfered with
your right to register or to decline to register to vote, your right to privacy
in deciding whether to register or in applying to register to vote, or your
right to choose your own political party or other political preference, you
may file a complaint with the Kansas Secretary of State."

19 (d) If any person, in writing, declines to register to vote, the voter 20registration agency shall maintain the form prescribed by subsection (c). 21(e) A voter registration agency shall transmit the completed registra-22 tion application to the county election officer not later than five days after 23 the date of acceptance. Upon receipt of an application for registration, 24the county election officer shall send, by nonforwardable mail, a notice 25of disposition of the application to the applicant at the postal delivery 26 address shown on the application. If a notice of disposition is returned as 27undeliverable, a confirmation mailing prescribed by K.S.A. 25-2316c, and 28amendments thereto, shall occur.

(f) If an application is received while registration is closed, such application shall be considered to have been received on the next following
day during which registration is open.

(g) A person who completes an application for voter registration shall
be considered a registered voter when the county election officer adds
the applicant's name to the county voter registration list.

(h) Any registered voter whose residence address is not a permissible postal delivery address shall designate a postal address for registration records. When a county election officer has reason to believe that a voter's registration residence is not a permissible postal delivery address, the county election officer shall attempt to determine a proper mailing address for the voter.

(i) Any registered voter may request that such person's residence address be concealed from public inspection on the voter registration list
and on the original voter registration application form. Such request shall

be made in writing to the county election officer, and shall specify a clearly 1 2 unwarranted invasion of personal privacy or a threat to the voter's safety. 3 Upon receipt of such a request, the county election officer shall take 4 appropriate steps to ensure that such person's residence address is not 5publicly disclosed. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as re-6 quiring or authorizing the secretary of state to include on the voter reg-7 istration application form a space or other provision on the form that 8 would allow the applicant to request that such applicant's residence ad-9 dress be concealed from public inspection. 10 No application for voter registration shall be made available for (j) 11 public inspection or copying unless the information required by para-12graph (5) of subsection (b) has been removed or otherwise rendered 13 unreadable. 14If an applicant fails to answer the question prescribed in para-(k)15graph (15) of subsection (b), the county election officer shall send the 16 application to the applicant at the postal delivery address given on the 17application, by nonforwardable mail, with a notice of incompleteness. The 18notice shall specify a period of time during which the applicant may com-19 plete the application in accordance with K.S.A. 25-2311, and amendments 20thereto, and be eligible to vote in the next election. 21Sec. 5. K.S.A. 25-2710 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-22 2710. (a) Except as hereinafter provided, each voting place provided by 23the county election officer, in which is to be held national, state, county, 24 township, city and school primary and general elections and question 25submitted elections, shall be accessible to and usable by elderly persons 26and by physically handicapped persons by complying when necessary with the following standards of accessibility: 2728 -(1) Doors, entrances and exits used to gain access to or egress from the voting place shall have a minimum width of thirty (30) inches; 2930 (2) any curb adjacent to the main entrance to the voting place shall have curb cuts or temporary ramps; 31 32 - (3) any stairs necessarily used to enter the voting place shall have a 33 temporary handrail and ramp; and (4) at the voting place, no barrier shall impede the path of the phys-34 35 ically handicapped to the voting booth. 36 (b) The county election officer may select a voting place not meeting 37 the standards of accessibility prescribed in subsection (a) if: 38 (1) No acceptable and accessible voting place is available within the 39 precinct or other designated voting area; or 40 (2) it is anticipated that the voting place will be brought into compliance with such standards in the foreseeable future or the voting place 41will be temporarily made to comply with the standards for the time during 4243 which the polls are open.

(c) Any county election officer who selects a voting place which does 1 2 not meet the standards prescribed in subsection (a) shall report such 3 selection to the board of county commissioners. On any day upon which an election is held, all polling places shall be accessible by either perma-4 5nent or temporary means to any voter having a disability. 6 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 25-2908 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 25-2908. (a) Each polling place shall use either: (1) A registration 8 book and a poll book, as defined in K.S.A. 25-2507(a) and K.S.A. 25-9 2507(b)(1), and amendments thereto; or (2) a registration book, as de-10 fined in K.S.A. 25-2507(b)(2), and amendments thereto. The county elec-11 tion officer shall determine which books are used in each county, and which book voters shall sign. 1213 (b) Persons desiring to vote shall give their names, and if required 14their residence, to the judges of election, one of whom shall announce 15the name in a loud and distinct tone of voice, and if the name is in the 16 registration books, the member of the election board having the registra-17tion record shall repeat the name. For the purpose of identifying voters 18at the polling place, the voter shall add the voter's signature, as listed in 19 the registration book, to the registration book beside the voter's printed 20name or to the poll book and the voter shall be allowed to vote. An 21election board member shall provide the required signature at the request 22 of and on behalf of any voter who is unable to personally affix a hand-23 written signature by reason of physical disability, visual handicap or lack 24 of proficiency in reading the English language or any voter 65 or more 25years of age. The judges shall give the voter one and only one of each 26ballot to be east at the election, on the upper right-hand corner of each 27of which shall be written the number corresponding to the voter's number 28in the registration book or poll books, and the voter's name shall be 29marked in the registration books and the party affiliation list. If the voter 30 refuses to sign the registration book or poll book, the election board judge 31 shall ehallenge such person's vote pursuant to K.S.A. 25-414, and amend-32 ments thereto. A person desiring to vote shall provide to the election 33 board: (1) the voter's name; (2) if required, the voter's address; and (3) 34 the voter's signature on the registration or poll book. A signature may be 35 made by mark, initials, typewriter, print, stamp, symbol or any other 36 manner if by placing the signature on the document the person intends 37 the signature to be binding. A signature may be made by another person 38 at the voter's direction if the signature reflects such voter's intention. 39 (c) A member of the election board shall: 40 (1) Announce the voter's name in a loud and distinct tone of voice, 41 and, if the name is in the registration books, the member of the election 42board having the registration record shall repeat the name;

43 (2) request the voter's signature on the registration or poll book;

1 (3) provide the required signature at the request of and on behalf of 2 any voter who is unable to personally affix a signature by reason of tem-3 porary illness or disability, or lack of proficiency in reading the English 4 language;

5 (4) if the voter is a first-time voter as described in subsection (h) of 6 this section, request valid identification from the voter unless such voter 7 has previously submitted current and valid identification in the county 8 where registered;

9 (5) give the voter one ballot, on the upper right-hand corner of which 10 shall be written the number corresponding to the voter's number in the 11 registration book or poll book; and

12 (6) mark the voter's name in the registration book and party affilia-13 tion list.

14(d)A first-time voter shall provide to the election board a form of 15valid identification such as a current and valid Kansas driver's license, 16 nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, gov-17ernment check or other government document unless such voter has pre-18viously submitted current and valid identification in the county where 19 registered. The document provided in accordance with this section shall 20 contain the voter's current name and address as indicated on the regis-21tration book or poll book.

22 (e) If a first-time voter is unable or refuses to provide current and 23 valid identification at the polling place, or if the name and address do not 24match the voter's name and address on the registration book or poll book, 25the voter may vote a provisional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and 26amendments thereto. The voter shall provide a valid form of identification 27as defined in subsection (d) of this section to the county election officer 28in person or provide a copy by mail or electronic means before the meeting 29 of the county board of canvassers. At the meeting of the county board of 30 canvassers the county election officer shall present copies of identification 31 received from provisional voters and the corresponding provisional bal-32 lots. If the county board of canvassers determines that a voter's identifi-33 cation is valid and the provisional ballot was properly cast, the ballot shall 34 be counted. 35 (f) If the name of any person desiring to vote at an election is not in 36 the registration books, an election board member shall print the name 37 and address of the person appearing to vote in the registration book or 38 poll book. The person appearing to vote shall add such person's signature 39 to the registration book or poll book beside such person's printed name, 40as listed in the registration book or poll book, and the election board 41 judge shall challenge such person's vote pursuant to K.S.A. 25-414, and

42 amendments thereto. During the pendency of a challenge other voters

43 shall be given ballots and be permitted to vote.

First-time voter includes a person whose 11 name was removed from the county registration list in accordance with 12K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, and has re-registered. 13 (i) The secretary of state may adopt rules and regulations defining 14valid forms of identification. 15Sec. 7. In voting places where 36 voting machines are used, such voter shall vote on an *electronic voting* 37 machine or advance voting ballot, and, if the county election officer so 38 directs, the two board members, upon returning to the voting place, shall 39 east the voter's votes, exactly in the manner shown on such voter's ballot, on a voting machine. If the voter's votes are east on a voting machine, 40the advance voting ballots used in this subsection shall be marked 4142"VOID" with a notation indicating that the votes thereon have been tab-43 ulated on a voting machine. 16(f) (7) Any advance voting or mail ballot whose envelope containing 17the voter's written declaration is unsigned, shall be wholly void and no 18 vote thereon shall be counted.

(8) No ballot cast by a first-time voter as defined by K.S.A. 25-1122, 19 20 and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto, 21 shall be counted if the voter fails to provide valid identification.
