Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 21-4018 is hereby amended to read as follows: 21-4018. (a) Identity theft is knowingly and with intent to defraud for economic benefit, without authorization obtaining, possessing, transferring, using or attempting to obtain, possess, transfer or use, one or more identification documents or personal identification number of another person other than that issued lawfully for the use of the possessor with the intent to:

- Defraud; (1)
- (2)harass;
- affect the credit worthiness of such person; or
- enter, remain or gain employment illegally in the United States.
- "Identification documents" means the definition as provided in K.S.A. 21-3830, and amendments thereto.
- (c) Identity theft is a severity level 7, person felony.
 - (d)The conduct prohibited in subsection (a) does not apply to:
- A person less than 21 years of age who uses the identification documents of another person to acquire an alcoholic beverage, as defined in K.S.A. 8-1599, and amendments thereto;
- (2) a person less than 18 years of age who uses the identification documents of another person to acquire:
- (A) Cigarettes or tobacco products as defined in K.S.A. 79-3301, and amendments thereto;
- a periodical, a videotape or other communication medium that contains or depicts nudity;
- admittance to a performance, live or film, that prohibits the attendance of the person based on age; or
- an item that is prohibited by law for use or consumption by such
