12	AN ACT concerning the department of commerce; relating to IMPACT;
13	amending K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 74-50,103, 74-50,104, 74-50,107 and 74-
14	50,108 and repealing the existing sections.
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16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
17	Section 1. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 74-50,103 is hereby amended to read
18	as follows: 74-50,103. As used in the IMPACT act unless the context
19	clearly requires otherwise:
20	(a) "Act" means the Kansas investments in major projects and com-
21	prehensive training act.
22	(b) "Agreement" means the agreement among an employer, an ed-
23	ucational institution and the secretary of commerce concerning a SKILL
24	project or a combined SKILL project and major project investment and
25	the agreement between an employer and the secretary of commerce con-
26	cerning a major project investment.
27	(c) "Bond" means a public purpose bond issued for IMPACT projects
28	by the Kansas development finance authority.
29	(d) "Date of commencement of the project" means the date of the
30	agreement.
31	(e) "Educational institution" means a community college, as defined
32	by K.S.A. 71-701, and amendments thereto, an area vocational school or
33	area vocational-technical school, as defined by K.S.A. 72-4412, and
34	amendments thereto, a university, as defined by K.S.A. 72-6501, and
35	amendments thereto, or a state educational institution, as defined by
36	K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, or a technical college as es-
37	tablished by K.S.A. 72-4468, and amendments thereto.
38	(f) "Employee" means a person employed in a new or retained job.
39	(g) "Employer" means a Kansas basic enterprise providing new jobs
40	or retaining existing jobs in conjunction with a project.
41	(h) "IMPACT program" or "program" means the major project in-
42	vestments and SKILL projects undertaken by the department of com-
43	merce in accordance with the provisions of this act for a new or expanding

1 Kansas basic enterprise.

2 (i) "IMPACT project" or "project" means a SKILL project, major 3 project investment or a combination of the two. "Kansas basic enterprise" means any enterprise: 4 (j) $\mathbf{5}$ Which is located or principally based in Kansas; and (1)6 (2)which can provide demonstrable evidence that: 7 (A) It is primarily engaged in any one or more of the Kansas basic 8 industries; or 9 (B) it is primarily engaged in the development or production of goods 10or the provision of services for out-of-state sale; or 11 (C) it is primarily engaged in the production of goods or the provision 12of services which will attract out-of-state buyers or consumers into the 13 state; or 14(D) it is primarily engaged in the production of raw materials, ingre-15dients, or components for other enterprises which export the majority of 16 their products from the state; or 17(E) it is a national or regional enterprise which is primarily engaged 18in interstate commerce or an affiliated management company of such an 19 enterprise; or 20 (F) it is primarily engaged in the production of goods or the provision 21of services which will supplant goods or services which would be imported 22 into the state; or 23(G) it is the corporate or regional headquarters of a multistate enter-24prise which is primarily engaged in out-of-state industrial activities. 25"Kansas basic industry" means: (k) 26(1)Agriculture; 27(2)mining; 28(3)manufacturing; 29(4)interstate transportation; 30 wholesale trade which is primarily multistate in activity or which (5)31 has a major import supplanting effect within the state; 32 (6)financial services which are provided primarily for interstate or 33 international transactions; 34 (7)business services which are provided primarily in out-of-state 35 markets; 36 (8)research and development of new products, processes, or tech-37 nologies; or 38 tourism activities which are primarily engaged in for the purpose (9)39 of attracting out-of-state tourists. 40"Major project investment" or "investment" means financial assis- (\mathbf{l}) tance to an employer to defray business costs including, but not limited 41 42 to, relocation expenses, building and equipment purchases, labor recruit-43 ment and job retention.

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1 (m) "New job" means a job in a new or expanding Kansas basic en-2 terprise not including jobs of recalled workers, or existing jobs that are 3 vacant or other jobs that formerly existed in the Kansas basic enterprise 4 in Kansas.

5 (n) "Primarily engaged" means engagement in an activity by an en-6 terprise to the extent that not less than 51% of the gross income of the 7 enterprise is derived from such engagement.

8 (o) "Program costs" means all necessary and incidental costs of pro-9 viding program services, except that program costs shall not include: (1)10Any wages paid to persons receiving education or training under a project, 11 (2) any costs for purchase or lease of training equipment that exceed 50% 12 of total program costs for the project, and (3) any costs for administrative 13 expenses of educational institutions that exceed 10% of total program 14costs for the project, and (4) any costs for direct investments in education and related workforce development institutions, for im-1516 provements to workforce development, human capital, training ex-17pertise and infrastructure that exceed 10% 15% of total program 18costs.

19 (p) "Program services" means:

(1) New jobs training, including training development costs, except
that the actual training period for any new job shall not exceed 36 months
from the date the job is first filled by an employee;

23 (2) adult basic education and job-related instruction;

24 (3) vocational and skill-assessment services and testing;

25 (4) training equipment for education institutions;

26 (5) material and supplies;

27 (6) administrative expenses of educational institutions for new jobs28 training programs;

(7) subcontracted services with other educational institutions, private
 colleges or universities or other federal, state or local agencies; and

31 (8) contracted or professional service;

32 (9) major project investments; and

(10) direct investments in educational and related workforce devel opment institutions, for improvements to workforce development, human
 capital, training expertise and infrastructure.

(q) "Retained job" means an existing job which will be lost without
participation by the employer under the provisions of the IMPACT
program.

39 (r) "Secretary" means the secretary of commerce.

40 (s) "SKILL project" means a training arrangement which is the sub-41 ject of an agreement entered into between the educational institution and 42 an employer to provide program services.

43 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 74-50,104 is hereby amended to read as

follows: 74-50,104. (a) The secretary of commerce shall administer the 1 2 provisions of this act and the IMPACT program established thereunder. 3 The secretary of commerce shall encourage Kansas basic enterprises with 4 similar training needs to cooperate in establishing SKILL projects. The $\mathbf{5}$ secretary of commerce shall coordinate the SKILL program with other 6 job training programs administered by the department of commerce. The 7 secretary of commerce shall provide opportunities for coordination and 8 cooperation of SKILL projects with other job training activities in Kansas. 9 The Subject to the limitation in K.S.A. 74-50,103, the secretary shall 10be authorized to make direct investments in educational and related work-11 force development institutions, for the purpose of promoting improve-12 ments in workforce development, human capital, training expertise and 13 infrastructure. 14(b) The secretary of commerce shall adopt rules and regulations as 15follows: (1) Prescribing review standards and priorities for approval of 16 proposed agreements under this act, including appropriate incentives for 17cooperation among projects, in order to maximize the number of new 18jobs created with respect to individual Kansas basic enterprises, which 19 will remain in Kansas, and (2) prescribing limits on program costs and on 20project and program size in relation to the number of new jobs created 21or the wages of new jobs created. No agreement shall be approved which 22 provides for program costs of a project under the agreement of more than 23 90% of the amount equal to the estimated rate of withholding tax applied 24 to the estimated amount of gross wages of all the new jobs under the 25project over a ten-year period. 26(c) Notice of the approval of a project or program under the IMPACT 27act shall be provided to the chairpersons of the senate committee on 28commerce and the committee on economic development of the house of 29representatives. 30 (d) The secretary of commerce may adopt such other rules and reg-31 ulations as may be required for the implementation and administration 32 of this act. 33 K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 74-50,107 is hereby amended to read as Sec. 3. 34 follows: 74-50,107. (a) The secretary of commerce shall determine and 35 from time to time shall redetermine the rate at which moneys shall be 36 credited to the IMPACT program repayment fund in order to satisfy all 37 bond repayment obligations which have been incurred to finance program 38 costs for IMPACT programs (which shall be referred to as the debt serv-39 ice rate) and the rate at which moneys shall be credited to the IMPACT 40program services fund in order to finance program costs that are not 41financed by bonds (which shall be referred to as the direct funding rate). 42 The total of the debt service rate and the direct funding rate shall be the 43 combined rate. Each rate so determined shall be certified to the secretary

of revenue. On and after July 1, 2003, The combined rate determined 1 2 under this subsection shall not exceed 1.5%. On and after July 1, 2005, 3 the combined rate determined under this subsection shall not exceed 2%. Upon receipt of the rates determined and certified under sub-4 (b) 5section (a), the secretary of revenue shall apply daily the combined rate 6 to that portion of the moneys withheld from the wages of individuals and 7 collected under the Kansas withholding and declaration of estimated tax 8 act K.S.A. 79-3294 et seq., and amendments thereto. The amount so de-9 termined shall be credited as follows: (1) The portion attributable to the 10 debt service rate shall be credited to the IMPACT program repayment 11 fund, and (2) the remaining portion shall be credited to the IMPACT 12program services fund. 13 The aggregate of all amounts credited to the IMPACT program repay-14ment fund under this section during any fiscal year to pay bond repayment 15obligations on bonds to finance major project investments shall not exceed 1610% of the amount which results when the rate of 1% is applied to all 17money withheld from the wages of individuals and received under the 18Kansas withholding and declaration of estimated tax act. 19 - On and after July 1, 2003, The aggregate of all amounts credited to the 20IMPACT program repayment fund under this section during any fiscal 21year to pay bond repayment obligations on bonds to finance major project 22 investments shall not exceed 10% 20% of the amount which results when 23 the rate of 1.5% is applied to all moneys withheld from the wages of 24 individuals and received under the Kansas withholding and declaration 25of estimated tax act. 26 On and after July 1, 2005, the aggregate of all amounts credited to the IMPACT program repayment fund under this section during any fiscal 2728year to pay bond repayment obligations on bonds to finance major project investments shall not exceed 10% 20% of the amount which results when 2930 the rate of 2% is applied to all money withheld from the wages of indi-31 viduals and received under the Kansas withholding and declaration of 32 estimated tax act. 33 K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 74-50,108 is hereby amended to read as Sec. 4. 34 follows: 74-50,108. There is hereby created in the state treasury the IM-35 PACT program services fund. The secretary of commerce shall administer 36 the IMPACT program services fund. All moneys credited to the SKILL 37 *IMPACT* program services fund shall be for all or part of the program 38 costs of projects or major project investments approved by the secretary 39 of commerce under this act, except that moneys in the IMPACT program 40services fund which are not required to pay program costs or major pro-41jects investments may be transferred to the state general fund in accord-42ance with provisions of appropriation acts. All expenditures from the IM-

43 PACT program services fund shall be for the purposes of paying program

1 costs and shall be made in accordance with appropriations acts upon war-

2 rants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers
3 approved by the secretary of commerce or the secretary's designee. The

 secretary of commerce shall remit all moneys received under this act,

5 including the proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development fi-

6 nance authority for the purposes of this act to the state treasurer in ac-

8 Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit

9 the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the IMPACT

10 program services fund.
