AN ACT concerning the secretary of health and environment; providing for the establishment of an electronic communicable disease reporting system; establishing criteria for the system.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Within the limits of appropriations therefor, the secretary of health and environment shall establish a computer information system of near real-time automated and electronic communicable disease reporting which is designed to assist in the identification of potential outbreaks of communicable disease or bioterrorism events and which provides near real-time information to public health personnel and health care providers.

- (b) The electronic communicable disease reporting system shall be designed to: (1) Allow for importing data to existing systems; (2) shorten the communicable disease outbreak detection or identification cycle by decreasing manual data entry and reporting, thereby improving the timeliness of communicable disease reports; (3) increase the volume of reporting of diseases and reduce under-reporting of diseases; (4) improve the quality of data collected by increasing the completeness of required data fields; (5) provide automatic alerting to key individuals and agencies of critical events such as identification of potential communicable disease outbreaks or bioterrorism agents; (6) provide detailed reports for trend analysis; (7) provide laboratory orders information to assist in early detection of potential outbreaks of communicable disease or bioterrorism events; (8) provide reports simultaneously to authorized jurisdictions and individuals; and (9) provide aggregate reports to contributing health care providers including medical care facilities.
- (c) The secretary of health and environment may adopt rules and regulations as necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
