AN ACT concerning driver's licenses; relating to medical information 10reported to the division; amending K.S.A. 8-255c and repealing the 11 12existing section. 13 14Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 15Section 1. K.S.A. 8-255c is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-16 255c. (a) No person reporting to the division or to the medical advisory 17board in good faith any information that any such person may have re-18lating to the mental or physical condition of an applicant for *or a holder* 19 of a driver's license shall be subject to a civil action for damages as a result 20 of reporting such information. No Nothing in this section shall be con-21strued to create a duty to report, nor shall a physician or optometrist shall 22 be required by law to volunteer report information to the division or to 23 the medical advisory board as to the mental or physical condition of any 24 patient. 25(b) A physician or optometrist may report to the division or to the 26 medical advisory board any person diagnosed or assessed as having a 27 disorder or condition that may in such physician's or optometrist's pro-28fessional judgment could prevent such person from safely operating a 29motor vehicle or could constitute an immediate and serious danger 30 to the public. Such report shall state the diagnosis or assessment and 31 whether the condition is likely to be permanent or temporary. The exis-32 tence of a privilege pursuant to K.S.A. 60-427, and amendments thereto, 33 shall not prevent a physician or optometrist from making a report. All 34 reports made to, and all medical records reviewed and maintained by, the 35 division pursuant to this section shall be kept confidential and shall not 36 be disclosed except upon the order of a court of competent jurisdiction, 37 pursuant to the request of the division or medical advisory board and 38 shall not be subject to subpoena, discovery or other demand in any other 39 administrative, criminal or civil matter. 40 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-255c is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
