9 AN ACT concerning salaries and compensation for state officers and em-10 ployees; making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005; amending K.S.A. 40-102, 46-137a and 46-137b and 11 12K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-3101, 75-3103, 75-3104, 75-3108, 75-3110 and 13 75-3111a and repealing the existing sections. 1415Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 16New Section 1. (a) The governor is hereby authorized to modify the 17pay plan for fiscal year 2005 in accordance with this subsection and to 18adopt such pay plan as so modified. The existing pay plan for fiscal year 19 2005 shall be modified to provide for an increase of 3% in the pay rates 20of such pay plan. The pay plan adopted by the governor under this sub-21section shall be the pay plan for the classified service under the Kansas 22 civil service act and shall be effective on the first day of the first biweekly 23 payroll period which is chargeable to the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005. 24 Such pay plan shall be subject to modification and approval as provided 25under K.S.A. 75-2938 and amendments thereto and to any enactment of 26 the legislature applicable thereto. 27(b) (1) The governor is hereby authorized to modify or authorize the 28modification of the salaries of state officers and employees who are in the 29unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act and whose salaries 30 are subject to approval by the governor under K.S.A. 75-2935b or 75-31 2935c and amendments thereto to provide for base salary increases, to 32 be effective on the first day of the first payroll period which is chargeable 33 to the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2005, and to be distributed from a 34 salary increase pool, the average of such increases shall not exceed 3% of 35 the base salaries of such officers and employees. 36 (2) Each elected state official of the executive branch of state govern-37 ment, including the state board of education, and the board of directors 38 of the Kansas technology enterprise corporation, Kansas, Inc., the state 39 board of regents and the board of trustees of the Kansas public employees 40 retirement system, in each such official, corporation or board's discretion, 41 are hereby authorized and directed to modify or to authorize the modi-42fication of the salaries of the state officers and employees of such official, 43 corporation or board, who are in the unclassified service under the Kansas SB 549

civil service act and whose salaries are not subject to approval by the 1 2 governor under K.S.A. 75-2935b and amendments thereto, to provide for 3 base salary increases to be effective on the first day of the first payroll 4 period which is chargeable to the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, and $\mathbf{5}$ to be distributed from a salary increase pool, the average of such increases 6 shall not exceed 3% of the base salaries of such officers and employees 7 of such official, corporation or board. The provisions of this subsection 8 (b)(2) shall not authorize or provide any salary increase for the governor, 9 lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, commissioner of 10insurance, or attorney general, or for any member of any state board, 11 commission, council or committee receiving per diem compensation as 12 provided by statute. 13 New Sec. 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated for the state finance 14council from the state general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 152005, the sum of \$21,872,906 to be used for the purpose of paying the 16 proportionate share of the cost to the state general fund of: (1) The salary 17increases which are provided for by modification of the pay plan for state 18officers and employees in the classified service under the Kansas civil 19 service act to provide for an increase of 3% in the pay rates of such pay 20plan for biweekly pay periods which are chargeable to the fiscal year 21ending June 30, 2005; and (2) the salary increases for state officers and 22 employees in the unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act 23 which are provided for in subsection (b)(1) and subsection (b)(2) of sec-24 tion 1. 25(b) To pay the proportionate share of the cost to the state general fund 26 of each state agency for the salary increases specified in subsection (a), 27including associated employer contributions, 28upon recommendation of the director of the budget, the state finance 29 council, acting on this matter which is hereby characterized as a matter 30 of legislative delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed in sub-31 section (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto, except paragraph 32 (3) of such subsection (c), is hereby authorized to approve the transfer of 33 moneys from the appropriation under subsection (a) by the director of 34 accounts and reports, who is hereby authorized and directed to make 35 such transfers in accordance with such approval, to the proper accounts 36 created by state general fund appropriations for the fiscal year ending 37 June 30, 2005. 38 (c) Upon recommendation of the director of the budget, the state fi-39 nance council, acting on this matter which is hereby characterized as a 40matter of legislative delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed

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41 in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto, except

42 paragraph (3) of such subsection (c), is hereby authorized to approve 43 increases in expenditure limitations on special revenue funds and ac-

counts established for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, by the director 1 2 of accounts and reports, who is hereby authorized and directed to increase 3 expenditure limitations on such special revenue funds and accounts in 4 accordance with such approval, for the purpose of paying from such funds 5or accounts the proportionate share of the cost to such funds or accounts, 6 including associated employer contributions, of the salary increases spec-7 ified in subsection (a) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005. (d) Each state agency of the executive branch of state government shall 8 9 prepare and submit a budget estimate for such salary increases specified 10in subsection (a), and all amendments and revisions of such estimates, to the director of the budget on forms prescribed by the director of the 11 12 budget. There is hereby established a department to be known 40 as the insurance department, which shall have a chief officer entitled the commissioner of insurance who shall receive, except as otherwise pro-41 42vided in K.S.A. 75-3111a and amendments thereto, a salary at a biweekly 43 pay rate of \$2,648.45 \$3,026.16, and such officer shall be charged with SB 549

the administration of all laws relating to insurance, insurance companies 1 2 and fraternal benefit societies doing business in this state, and all other 3 duties which are or may be imposed upon such officer by law. 4 Sec. 8. In addition to the compensation provided for by K.S.A. 6 46-137b, 46-137e and 75-3212 and amendments thereto, each member 7 of the legislature shall receive the following amounts: 8 (a) The sum of \$72.06 \$81.11 per calendar day for service at any regular 9 or special session, except as otherwise provided in subsection (e); 10 (b) the sum of \$80 per calendar day for subsistence allowance for any 11 regular or special session of the legislature, except that if the amounts 12 allowable for the capital city of Kansas under applicable federal law and 13 regulations to employees of the executive branch of the federal government for per diem expenses, while away from home but serving in the 1415United States, are amounts which total greater than \$80, then each mem-16 ber of the legislature shall receive such greater total amount per calendar 17day for subsistence allowance for any regular or special session of the 18 legislature; 19 (c) an allowance of \$270 for the two-week period which coincides with 20the first biweekly payroll period commencing in April and for each of the 2119 ensuing two-week periods thereafter, to defray expenses incurred be-22 tween sessions of the legislature for postage, telephone, office and other 23 incidental expenses; 24 (d) an allowance for mileage in an amount equal to the rate per mile 25prescribed under the provisions of K.S.A. 75-3203a and amendments 26thereto multiplied by the number of miles traveled by the usual route in 27going to and returning from the member's place of residence for any 28regular or special session of the legislature. Such mileage allowances shall 29be paid for not to exceed the equivalent of one trip for each full week 30 occurring between convening and adjournment sine die in any regular or 31 special session. The mileage allowance provided under the provisions of 32 this subsection shall not be subject to the restrictions relating to the use 33 of vehicles prescribed by K.S.A. 75-3203 and 75-3203a and amendments 34 thereto but shall only be allowed for trips actually made. Compensation 35 and subsistence allowance shall not be allowed under the provisions of 36 subsections (a) and (b) of this section during any period in which the 37 legislature is adjourned for more than two days, Sundays excepted; and 38 (e) whenever the rates of compensation of the pay plan for persons in 39 the classified service under the Kansas civil service act are increased for 40payroll periods chargeable to fiscal years commencing after June 30, 1999 41 2005, the rate of compensation per calendar day for members of the 42 legislature for service at any regular or special session of the legislature

43 shall be increased on the effective date of any such pay plan increase by

an amount computed by multiplying the average of the percentage increases in all steps of such pay plan by the rate of compensation per
calendar day which is authorized by this section for service at any regular
or special session of the legislature for the day upon which such increase
is computed.

Sec. 9. On June 6, 2004, K.S.A. 46-137b is hereby amended to read as
follows: 46-137b. (a) In addition to the compensation provided for by
K.S.A. 46-137a and 75-3212 and amendments thereto, and any other statute, and except as otherwise provided by subsection (b):

(1) The president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives shall each receive an allowance at a biweekly pay rate of \$438.82 \$493.99 during their terms of office as speaker and president, which compensation shall be for additional services performed in connection with discharging the duties assigned to the respective positions;
(2) the speaker pro tem of the house of representatives, the vice pres-

ident of the senate, the assistant majority leaders of the senate and house
of representatives and the assistant minority leaders of the senate and
house of representatives shall each receive an allowance at a biweekly pay
rate of \$223.97 \$252.13 during their respective terms of office which
compensation shall be for additional services performed in connection
with discharging the duties assigned to the respective positions;

(3) the chairperson of the senate committee on ways and means and the chairperson of the house committee on appropriations shall each receive an allowance at a biweekly pay rate of \$352.89 \$397.26 during their respective terms of office, which compensation shall be for additional services performed in connection with discharging the duties assigned to the respective positions; and

(4) the majority and minority leaders of the senate and the house of
representatives shall each receive an allowance at a biweekly pay rate of
\$305.89 \$445.66 during their respective terms of office, which compensation shall be for additional services performed in connection with discharging the duties assigned to the respective positions.

33 (b) Whenever the rates of compensation of the pay plan for persons in 34 the classified service under the Kansas civil service act are increased for 35 payroll periods chargeable to fiscal years commencing after June 30, 1999, 36 the biweekly pay rate of officers of the legislature specified in subsection 37 (a) shall be increased on the effective date of any such pay plan increase 38 by an amount computed by multiplying the average of the percentage 39 increases in all steps of such pay plan by the biweekly pay rate of such 40 officers which is being received as provided by law and which is in effect 41prior to the effective date of such pay plan increase.

(a) The lieutenant governor shall $\mathbf{5}$ receive, as reimbursement for expenses the following: (1) Biweekly the 6 sum of 72.12, and (2) when attending the duties of office or attending 7 any authorized meeting, in addition to other provisions of this section, 8 travel expenses and subsistence expenses and allowances in amounts 9 equal to those provided for by K.S.A. 75-3212 and amendments thereto. 10 In addition to any other compensation provided by law and except as 11 otherwise provided in K.S.A. 75-3111a and amendments thereto, the lieu-12 tenant governor shall also receive for services in the performance of duties 13 imposed by law compensation at the biweekly pay rate of \$964.29 \$1,101.81. While acting as governor, the lieutenant governor shall receive 1415the same salary as the governor. The lieutenant governor may appoint an 16 administrative assistant and office and stenographic employees, all of 17whom shall be in the unclassified service of the Kansas civil service act. 18Such administrative assistant shall receive travel expenses and subsistence 19 expenses or allowances as provided by K.S.A. 75-3212 and amendments 20thereto when traveling as authorized by the lieutenant governor. 21(b) If the lieutenant governor is appointed by the governor under the 22 provision of K.S.A. 75-303 and amendments thereto, the lieutenant gov-23 ernor shall receive a salary to be fixed by the governor or a salary as 24 provided for in subsection (a) of this section, whichever is greater. 25Sec. 12. On June 6, 2004, K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-3111a is hereby 38 amended to read as follows: 75-3111a. Whenever the rates of compen-39 sation of the pay plan for persons in the classified service under the Kansas civil service act are increased for payroll periods chargeable to fiscal years 40commencing after June 30, 1999 2005, the salary of the governor, the 4142 lieutenant governor, the attorney general, the secretary of state, the state 43 treasurer and the commissioner of insurance shall be increased by an 1 amount computed by multiplying the average of the percentage increases

2 in all steps of such pay plan by the salary of the elected state officer which

3 is being received as provided by law and which is in effect prior to the
4 effective date of such increase in the rates of compensation of the pay
5 plan for persons in the classified service under the Kansas civil service

6 act.
