Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1608

7 8 9 A PROPOSITION to amend section 8 of article 2 of the constitution of 10 the state of Kansas, relating to the duration of sessions of the 11 legislature. 12 13 Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the 14 members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate and two-15 thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House 16 of Representatives concurring therein: 17Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of the 18 state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state 19 for their approval or rejection: Section 8 of article 2 of the constitution 20of the state of Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows: 21 "§ 8. Organization and sessions. The legislature shall meet 22 in regular session annually commencing on the second Monday in 23 January, and all sessions shall be held at the state capital. The du-24ration of each regular sessions held in even-numbered years session 25shall not exceed ninety eighty-eight calendar days. Each such ses-26 sions session may be extended beyond ninety eighty-eight calendar 27 days by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the a majority of all 28members elected (or appointed) and qualified to each house, except 29 that no regular session can be extended by more than two calendar 30 days. Bills and concurrent resolutions under consideration by the 31 legislature upon adjournment of a regular session held in an odd-32 numbered year may be considered at the next succeeding regular 33 session held in an even-numbered year, as if there had been no 34 such adjournment. 35 The legislature shall be organized concurrently with the terms of 36 representatives except that the senate shall remain organized during 37 the terms of senators. The president of the senate shall preside over

38 the senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives shall 39 preside over the house of representatives. A majority of the mem-40 bers then elected (or appointed) and qualified of the house of rep-41 resentatives or the senate shall constitute a quorum of that house. 42 Neither house, without the consent of the other, shall adjourn for

43 more than two days, Sundays excepted. Each house shall elect its

presiding officer and determine the rules of its proceedings, except 1 2 that the two houses may adopt joint rules on certain matters and 3 provide for the manner of change thereof. Each house shall provide for the expulsion or censure of members in appropriate cases. Each 4 $\mathbf{5}$ house shall be the judge of elections, returns and qualifications of its own members." 6

7 Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with 8 the amendment as a whole:

9 "Explanatory statement. The purpose of this amendment is to limit 10 the duration of the annual regular sessions of the Kansas legis-11 lature. It imposes a limit of eighty-eight calendar days for each 12 regular session. It removes the existing limit of ninety calendar 13 days which applies only to regular sessions held in even-numbered years and the existing provision allowing extension of such 14 15sessions beyond ninety calendar days by a vote of two-thirds of 16 the members of each house. This amendment would permit the 17legislature to extend the regular session beyond the eighty-eighth 18 calendar day by the vote of a majority vote of all members of each house. Such extension could not be for more than two cal-19 20 endar days.

- 21 "A vote for this proposition would limit the duration of each regular 22 session of the Kansas legislature to eighty-eight calendar days. 23 Each such session could be extended by the legislature for up to 24two calendar days by a majority vote of all members of each 25house.
- 26 "A vote against this proposition would continue in effect the current 27 provision which limits only the regular sessions held in even-28numbered years to ninety calendar days and the existing provi-29 sion allowing extension of such sessions beyond ninety calendar 30 days by a vote of two-thirds of the members of each house."

31 Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members 32 elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate, and two-thirds of the 33 members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and 34 35 nays. The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as 36 provided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted 37 to the electors of the state at the general election in November in the year 2004 unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent 38 resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the 39 40electors of the state at the special election. proposed amendment to be 41 submitted to the electors of the state at the general election in November 42 in the year 2004 unless a special election is called at a sooner date by 43
