Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), no person shall 13 receive a permanent appointment as a jail officer unless awarded a certificate by the sheriff which attests to satisfactory completion of a basic course of preparatory training as provided further. Such training shall be approved by the sheriff or the sheriff's designee and shall consist of not less than 60 hours of instruction. The certificate shall be effective during the term of a person's employment, except that any person who has terminated employment with the sheriff for a period exceeding one year shall be required to be certified again.

- (b) The sheriff may award a certificate which attests to the satisfactory completion of training to any person who has been duly certified under the laws of another state or territory if, in the opinion of the sheriff, the requirements for certification in the other jurisdiction are equal to or exceed the requirements for certification in this state. The sheriff may waive any number of hours or courses required to complete the basic training for any person who, in the opinion of the sheriff, has received sufficient training or experience that such hours of instruction would be unduly burdensome or duplicitous.
- (c) Every jail officer shall receive not less than 16 hours of in-service training annually.
- Preparatory training shall include, but not be limited to, courses covering the following subjects: Interpersonal communication, self-defense, first aid, cardiac pulmonary resuscitation, ethics, suicide prevention and inmate supervision training.
 - Employees shall:
- Obtain a passing grade in all courses except competency based courses. Competency based courses shall be passed by demonstrating the achievement of course objectives to the satisfaction of the instructors; and
- successfully complete the training within six months. Under justifiable circumstances, this period may be extended by the sheriff for an additional six months.
- As used in this section, "jail officer" means an employee of the

- county working at a county jail with responsibility for maintaining custody, 1
- security and control of individuals in the custody of the sheriff at the jail.
