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9 AN ACT concerning the long term care services task force; relating to 10the extension of the task force; amending K.S.A. 65-6206 and repealing 11 the existing section. 1213 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. K.S.A. 65-6206 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-156206. (a) A task force on long-term care services is hereby established to 16study state and federal laws and rules and regulations which impact on 17the services provided by government and the private sector to citizens who are consumers of long-term care services, the financing of these 1819services, both public and private, the effectiveness of partnering activities 20between state agencies and long-term care providers and such other mat-21ters relating thereto as the task force deems appropriate. 22The task force shall consist of 20 23 members appointed as (b) 23 follows: 24 (1)Seven Nine members appointed by the legislative coordinating 25council, three of whom shall be consumers of long-term care services, 26 three of whom shall be providers of long-term care services and, one of 27whom shall be a trustee or board member of a long-term care facility, 28one of whom shall be a physically disabled consumer of long-term care or 29 an advocate for physically disabled consumers of long-term care, and one 30 of whom shall be a developmentally disabled consumer of long-term care 31 or an advocate for developmentally disabled consumers of long-term care; 32 two members appointed by the president of the senate and the (2)33 speaker of the house of representatives, one of whom shall be a member 34 of the senate committee on ways and means and one of whom shall be a 35 member of the house committee on appropriations and both of whom 36 shall be from different political parties; 37 two members appointed by the president of the senate, one of (3)38 whom shall be a member of the senate committee on public health and 39 welfare and one of whom shall be a member of the senate committee on 40 financial institutions and insurance; 41two members appointed by the minority leader of the senate, one (4)42of whom shall be a member of the senate committee on public health 43 and welfare and one of whom shall be a member of the senate committee

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1 on financial institutions and insurance;

2 (5) two members appointed by the speaker of the house of represen-

tatives, one of whom shall be a member of the house committee on health
and human services and one of whom shall be a member of the house
committee on insurance;

6 (6) two members appointed by the minority leader of the house of 7 representatives, one of whom shall be a member of the house committee 8 on health and human services and one of whom shall be a member of the 9 house committee on insurance. Of the seven members appointed by the 10 legislative coordinating council, no more than two members shall reside 11 in any one congressional district;

12 (7) one member shall be the secretary of social and rehabilitation 13 services or the secretary's designee;

14 (8) one member shall be the secretary of health and environment or15 the secretary's designee; and

16 (9) one member shall be the secretary of aging or the secretary's 17 designee; *and*

(10) one member shall be the state long-term care ombudsman.

(c) The legislative coordinating council shall appoint the chairperson and vice-chairperson from among the membership of the task force, the chairperson to be appointed from among the legislator members of the task force. Staffing for the task force shall be available from the legislative research department, the revisor of statutes office and the division of legislative administrative services if authorized by the legislative coordinating council.

(d) The members of the task force shall receive reimbursement for
attending meetings of the task force as authorized by the legislative coordinating council consistent with the provisions of K.S.A. 46-1209 and
amendments thereto.

(e) The task force shall prepare and submit a report and recommendations to the governor and to the legislature on or before the second
Monday of January each year through 2005 2013. In developing such
recommendations the task force shall give consideration to creative, common sense solutions and approaches to problems which do not necessarily
require additional expenditures of money.

(f) As used in this section, the term "long-term care" includes a broad
spectrum of supports, ranging from skilled nursing services to assistance
with activities of daily living or help with instrumental activities of daily
living provided to Kansas citizens, including, but not limited to, the elderly, children, those with disabilities and citizens suffering from mental
illnesses.

42 (g) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, 2005 2013.
