AN ACT relating to schools; concerning state general fund revenues targeted for teacher salary increases on a merit and market rate basis; relating to site councils; amending K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 72-6439 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) Whenever the state general fund revenue estimates pursuant to K.S.A. 75-6701, and amendments thereto, in any April are increased from the prior year's April revenue estimates, the provisions of this section shall be applicable to such estimated increased state general fund revenues.

- (b) Subject to appropriations therefor, 25% of the increased state general fund estimated revenues, up to a limit of \$25 million, shall be targeted for teachers' salary increases to be awarded on a merit pay and market rate basis. The appropriated money will be distributed to school districts on a per pupil basis. Merit and market rate salary increases authorized by this subsection shall not be subject to mandatory negotiations pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5413 et seq., and amendments thereto, but shall be a permissible topic of negotiations.
- (c) The award of teacher salary increases pursuant to subsection (b) shall be in addition to salary increases which are negotiated pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5413 et seq., and amendments thereto.
- (d) As used in this act, "market rate" means a salary level needed to attract and retain teachers who teach subjects in which there is a shortage of qualified teachers.
- (e) The center for innovative school leadership shall provide the state board of education and school districts with advise and assistance in considering or adopting merit and market rate salary increases.
- (f) The state board of education shall provide assistance and guidelines to school boards implementing merit and market rate salary increases but the final determinations relating thereto shall be within the sole discretion of the school board. Both objective and subjective measures are recommended, including the use of peer review to include teachers in the merit and market pay process.
- New Sec. 2. (a) Site councils created pursuant to K.S.A. 72-6439, and

amendments thereto, are authorized to make recommendations to the board of education regarding modifications to the current school year budget. Such recommendations may include reductions in expenditures in particular areas and reallocation of such reductions to provide a pool of money for the award of merit and market rate pay increases. Implementation of budget modifications shall require the approval of the board of education of the school district.

- (b) In the event a board of education approves a recommendation which provides a pool of money for merit and market rate pay increases, such merit and market rate pay increases shall not be subject to mandatory negotiations pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5413 et seq., and amendments thereto, but shall be a permissive topic of negotiations. The award of merit and market rate pay salary increases shall be in addition to salary increases negotiated pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5413 et seq., and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 72-6439 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-6439. (a) In order to accomplish the mission for Kansas education, the state board of education shall design and adopt a school performance accreditation system based upon improvement in performance that reflects high academic standards and is measurable.
- (b) The state board of education shall provide for assessments in the core academic areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing, and social studies, and shall establish curriculum standards for such core academic areas. The assessments shall be administered at three grade levels, as determined by the state board. The curriculum standards shall be equal to the best standards and shall be reviewed at least every three years. The state board shall ensure compatibility between the statewide assessments and the curriculum standards. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed in any manner so as to impinge upon any district's authority to determine its own curriculum.
- (c) The state board of education shall determine performance levels on the statewide assessments, the achievement of which represents excellence in the academic area at the grade level to which the assessment applies. The state board should specify the measure of excellence both for individual performance and school performance on the assessments.
- (d) Each school in every district shall establish a school site council composed of the principal and representatives of teachers and other school personnel, parents of pupils attending the school, the business community, and other community groups. Reasonable effort shall be made to have at least one-third of the members of the site council made up of parents who have children in the school, if possible. School site councils shall be responsible for providing advice and counsel in evaluating state, school district, and school site performance goals and objectives and in determining the methods that should be employed at the school site to

1 meet these goals and objectives. Site councils may make recommendations and proposals to the school board regarding budgetary items and 3 school district matters, including but not limited to, identifying and implementing the best practices for developing efficient and effective administrative and management functions. Site councils also may help school boards analyze the unique environment of schools, enhance the 6 efficiency and maximize limited resources, including outsourcing arrangements and cooperative opportunities as a means to address limited budg-8 9 ets. Site councils may make recommendations and proposals regarding 10 procedures relating to teacher compensation, market rates payable to teachers and merit pay increases. These recommendations are limited to 11 the development of procedures and the inclusion of processes and checks 12 13 and balances to continually improve the use of merit and market rate pay. Site councils shall not be directly involved in the evaluation of teacher 14 15 performance.
