9 AN ACT concerning offender registration; relating to registration 10 requirements; amending K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 22-4904 and repealing the existing section. 11 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 22-4904 is hereby amended to read as 1415follows: 22-4904. (a) (1) Except as provided in subsection (a)(2), within 1610 days of the offender coming into any county in which the offender 17resides or is temporarily domiciled for more than 10 days, the offender 18shall register with the sheriff of the county. 19(2)Within 10 days of the offender coming into any county in which 20the offender resides or temporarily resides for more than 10 days, any 21offender who has provided the information and completed and signed 22 the registration form as required in K.S.A. 22-4905 and amendments 23 thereto, shall verify with the sheriff of the county that the sheriff has 24 received such offender's information and registration form. 25Upon registration with a school or educational institution, a non-(3)26resident student attending such school or educational institution shall 27 register with the sheriff within 10 days of the commencement of the 28school term. 29 (4) Upon commencement of employment, a nonresident worker shall 30 register with the sheriff within 10 days of the commencement date of 31 employment. 32 (5) For persons required to register as provided in subsections (a)(1), 33 (a)(3) and (a)(4), the sheriff shall: (A) Explain the duty to register and the 34 procedure for registration; 35 (B) obtain the information required for registration as provided in 36 K.S.A. 22-4907 and amendments thereto; 37 (C) inform the offender that the offender must give written notice of 38 any change of address within 10 days of a change in residence to the law 39 enforcement agency where last registered and the Kansas bureau of 40 investigation; (D) inform the nonresident student offender that the offender must 4142give written notice to the sheriff and the Kansas bureau of investigation 43 of any change or termination of attendance at the school or educational 1 institution the offender is attending, within 10 days of such change or 2 termination;

(E) inform the nonresident worker offender that the offender must
give written notice to the sheriff and the Kansas bureau of investigation
of any termination of employment at the offender's place of employment,
within 10 days of such termination;

7 (F) inform the offender that if the offender changes residence to 8 another state, the offender must inform the law enforcement agency 9 where last registered and the Kansas bureau of investigation of such 10 change in residence and must register in the new state within 10 days of 11 such change in residence;

12 (G) inform the offender that the offender must also register in any 13 state or county where the offender is employed, carries on a vocation or 14 is a student;

15 (H) inform the offender that if the offender expects to or subsequently becomes enrolled in any institution of higher education in the 16state of Kansas on a full-time or part-time basis or have any full-time or 1718part-time employment at an institution of higher education in the state 19of Kansas, with or without compensation, for more than 14 days, or for 20an aggregate period exceeding 30 days in one calendar year, the offender 21must provide written notice to the Kansas bureau of investigation within 22 10 days upon commencement of enrollment or employment;

(I) inform the offender that if there is any change or termination in
attendance or employment at an institution of higher education, the offender must provide written notice to the Kansas bureau of investigation
within 10 days of the change or termination; and

(J) require the offender to read and sign the registration form which
shall include a statement that the requirements provided in this subsection have been explained to the offender.

30 (6) Such sheriff, within three days of receipt of the initial registration31 shall forward this information to the Kansas bureau of investigation.

32 (7) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if a diversionary 33 agreement or probation order, either adult or juvenile, or a juvenile of-34 fender sentencing order, requires registration under the Kansas offender 35 registration act then all provisions of that act shall apply, except that the 36 term of registration shall be controlled by such diversionary agreement, 37 probation order or juvenile offender sentencing order.

(b) (1) If any person required to register as provided in this act
changes the address of the person's residence, the offender, within 10
days, shall inform in writing the Kansas bureau of investigation of the new
address.

42 (2) After receipt of the change of address, the Kansas bureau of in-43 vestigation shall forward this information to the law enforcement agency having jurisdiction of the new place of residence within 10 days of such
 receipt of the change of address.

3 (c) For any person required to register as provided in this act, every 4 90 days after the person's initial registration date during the period the 5 person is required to register, the following applies:

6 (1) The Kansas bureau of investigation shall mail a nonforwardable 7 verification form to the last reported address of the person.

8 (2) The person shall mail the verification form to the Kansas bureau 9 of investigation within 10 days after receipt of the form.

10 (3) The verification form shall be signed by the person and shall pro-11 vide the following information, as applicable, to the Kansas bureau of 12 investigation: (A) Whether the person still resides at the address last re-13 ported; (B) whether the person still attends the school or educational 14 institution last reported; (C) whether the person is still employed at the 15 place of employment last reported; and (D) whether the person's vehicle 16 registration information is the same as last reported.

17 (4) If the person fails to mail the verification form to the Kansas
18 bureau of investigation within 10 days after receipt of the form, the person
19 shall be in violation of the Kansas offender registration act.

20 (5) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to alleviate 21 any person required to register as provided in this act from meeting the 22 requirements prescribed in subsections (a)(1), (a)(2) and (b)(1).

23 (d) The registration requirements of the Kansas offender registration

act shall apply to offenders who are 16 years of age or older. Those persons
who meet the definition of offender but are under 16 years of age shall

who meet the definition of offender but are undenot be required to be registered.
