9	A PROPOSITION to amend section 2 of article 2 of the constitution of
10	the state of Kansas, relating to senators and representatives.
11	Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the
12	members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Repre-
13	sentatives and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and
14	qualified to the Senate concurring therein:
15	Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of the
16	state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state
17	for their approval or rejection: Section 2 of article 2 of the constitution
18	of the state of Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:
19	"§ 2. Senators and representatives. (a) The number of representa-
20	tives and senators shall be regulated by law, but shall not exceed one
21	hundred twenty-five 125 representatives and forty 41 senators. Rep-
22	resentatives and senators shall be elected from single-member districts
23 24	prescribed by law. Representatives shall be elected for two-year terms.
$\frac{24}{25}$	Senators shall be elected for four-year terms. The terms of represen-
25 26	tatives and senators shall commence on the second Monday of January
$\frac{20}{27}$	of the year following election.
$\frac{21}{28}$	(b) (1) At the election of representatives in the year 2008, representa-
20 29	tives elected from even-numbered districts shall be elected for two-year
30	terms and representatives elected from odd-numbered districts shall be
31	elected for four-year terms. At the election of representatives in the
32	year 2010, and thereafter, representatives shall be elected for four-year
33	terms.
34	(2) At the election of senators in the year 2008: (A) Senators elected
35	from district number one and each successive district, the number of
36	which is determined by adding three to the number of the preceding
37	district, shall be elected for two-year terms; (B) senators elected from
38	district number two and each successive district, the number of which
39	is determined by adding three to the number of the preceding district,
40	shall be elected for four-year terms; and (C) senators elected from dis-
41	trict number three and each successive district, the number of which
42	is determined by adding three to the number of the preceding district,
43	shall be elected for six-year terms. At the election of senators in the

1 year 2010 and thereafter, senators shall be elected for six-year terms."

2 Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with 3 the amendment as a whole:

4 *"Explanatory statement.* This amendment would allow the legislature to

increase the number of state senators from 40 to 41 and would increase
terms of state representatives from two to four years and terms of state
senators from four to six years. The amendment would also stagger

8 terms of members of both houses of the legislature.

9 "A vote for this amendment favors increasing the senate from 40 to 41 10 members, increasing terms of state representatives from two to four

11 years, increasing terms of state senators from four to six years and

12 staggering terms of both state representatives and state senators.

13 "A vote against this amendment favors retaining current constitutionalprovisions relating to the number of senators and legislators' terms."

15 Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members16 elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives and

17 two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the

18 Senate, shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and nays.

19 The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as pro-

vided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submittedto the electors of the state at the general election in November 2006.
