A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the President and the Con-10gress of the United States to lift the moratorium on offshore drilling 11 12for natural gas. 13 WHEREAS, Policies of the federal government have placed much of 1415 the coastal Outer Continental Shelf off limits to natural gas exploration; 16and WHEREAS, Dwindling natural gas supplies and global competition 1718for natural gas continue to force prices upward; and WHEREAS, America's increased dependence on foreign energy sup-19 plies, will create a threat to national security; and 20WHEREAS, High gas prices are forcing industries like the nitrogen 21fertilizer industry to move production to other countries, creating a threat 22 to our food security; and 23 WHEREAS, Other industrial natural gas users likewise are feeling the 24 pinch and are faced with choices of absorbing cost increases, passing them 2526along to consumers or moving production overseas; and WHEREAS, The Economic Research Service of the United States 27 Department of Agriculture estimates that farmers' fuel expenses for 2005 2829 will have exceeded their 2004 fuel expenses by 41%; and WHEREAS, The Energy Information Administration of the United 30 States Department of Energy projects that the average residential cus-31tomer this winter will spend approximately 48% more on natural gas than 32 33 last winter; and 34 WHEREAS, Development of natural gas reserves contained in the Outer Continental Shelf would provide a reasonably priced supply of gas 35 36 for years to come; and WHEREAS, Technological innovations have increased the efficiency 37 38 and ecological safety of natural gas exploration and recovery: Now, 39 therefore, 40 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas, the Senate concurring therein: That the State of Kansas urges the Pres-41ident and the Congress of the United States to lift the moratorium on 42offshore exploration for natural gas; and 43
