The House met Session pro forma pursuant to adjournment with Acting Speaker Pro Tem McKinney in the chair.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

The following bills were introduced and read by title:

HB 2817, An act concerning the department of wildlife and parks; prescribing certain procedures for acquisition of land by such department; also concerning reporting procedures; amending K.S.A. 32-844 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 2818, An act concerning the secretary of corrections; relating to payment for certain personal injuries and personal property of inmates; amending K.S.A. 46-920 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 2819, An act concerning corrections; relating to time limits for transfer of certain offenders to reception and diagnostic unit; amending K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 75-5220 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 2820, An act concerning distribution of certain prescription drugs; enacting the wholesale licensure and prescription medication integrity act, by Committee on Appropriations.

INTRODUCTION OF SENATE BILLS AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

The following Senate bills were thereupon introduced and read by title:

SB 297, SB 336, SB 339, SB 362, SB 371, SB 411.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

The Committee on **Appropriations** recommends **HB 2394** be amended on page 1, in line 15, preceding "con-" by inserting "building"; in line 19, preceding "construction" by inserting "building"; in line 23, preceding "design" by inserting "building"; in line 24, fol-

lowing "comprehensive" by inserting "building"; preceding line 40, by inserting new material to read as follows:

"(g) "Building construction" means furnishing labor, equipment, material or supplies used or consumed for the design, construction, alteration, renovation, repair or maintenance of a building or structure. Building construction does not include highways, roads, bridges, dams, turnpikes or related structures, or stand-alone parking lots.";

By relettering the remaining subsections accordingly;

On page 2, in line 7, by striking "and turnpikes" and inserting ", roads, bridges, dams, turnpikes or related structures, or stand-alone parking lots";

On page 3, preceding line 15, by inserting new material to read as follows:

"(v) "Parking lot" means a designated area constructed on the ground surface for parking motor vehicles. A parking lot included as part of a building construction project shall be subject to the provisions of this act. A parking lot designed and constructed as a stand-alone project shall not be subject to the provisions of this act.";

By relettering the remaining subsections accordingly;

Also on page 3, following line 22, by inserting new material to read as follows:

"(y) "Public construction project" means the process of designing, constructing, reconstructing, altering or renovating a public building or other structure. Public construction project does not include the process of designing, constructing, altering or repairing a public highway, road, bridge, dam, turnpike or related structure.";

By relettering the remaining subsections accordingly;

Also on page 3, in line 39, by striking "or turnpikes" and inserting ", roads, bridges, dams,

turnpikes or related structures, or stand-alone parking lots"; On page 7, in line 1, by striking "highest" and inserting "best"; in line 7, by striking "highest" and inserting "best"; in line 9, by striking "highest" and inserting "best";

On page 11, in line 24, preceding "con-" by inserting "building"; in line 25, by striking "highway or turnpike projects" and inserting "the process of designing, constructing, altering or repairing a public highway, road, bridge, dam, turnpike or related structures, or standalone parking lots";

On page 1, in the title, in line 11, after "delivery" by inserting "building"; and the bill be passed as amended.

Committee on Federal and State Affairs recommends HB 2595 be passed and, because the committee is of the opinion that the bill is of a noncontroversial nature, be placed on the consent calendar.

Committee on Judiciary recommends HB 2611 be passed.
