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9 AN ACT concerning teachers; relating to teacher preparation programs. 10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 11 12Section 1. The state board of education shall adopt rules and regu-13 lations for the administration and effectuation of the provisions of this section and sections 2 through 7, and amendments thereto. In accordance 1415with such rules and regulations, the board may issue an initial license to 16 teach in this state to any person who successfully completes the alternate 17teacher preparation program. 18Sec. 2. As used in sections 1 through 7, and amendments thereto: 19"Alternate teacher preparation program" means a program which (a) 20is provided for by the state board of education and designed to ensure 21that a teacher licensure applicant has the basic knowledge and qualifi-22cations necessary to engage in the profession of teaching at an accredited 23 school in this state. 24 "Teacher licensure applicant" means a person who applies under (b) 25authority of sections 1 through 7, and amendments thereto, for an initial 26license to teach in this state. 27 Sec. 3. (a) The alternate teacher preparation program will require a 28teacher licensure applicant to complete: 29 (1) A 10 contact hour preservice orientation conducted by an em-30 ploying accredited school prior to a classroom assignment. Orientation 31shall include familiarization with school policies, procedures, curriculum, 32 instructional model, community characteristics and resources; and 33 (2)an internship of two school years (four semesters) prescribed by 34 the state board of education. At the successful completion of internship, 35 student teaching requirements will be waived. 36 (b) During internship, a teacher licensure applicant will be super-37 vised by a team of two persons consisting of a mentor teacher or national 38 board certified teacher and the building principal from the accredited 39 school employing the applicant. Guidelines for supervision will be provided by the state board of education. The supervisory team will meet no 40 fewer than three times per school year to evaluate, consult with and pro-4142vide advice to the applicant. The last meeting of the first year of internship 43 will result in a recommendation for discontinuation of the program or

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continuation for the second year of internship. Successful completion of
 the program will result in a recommendation for licensure.

Sec. 4. A teacher licensure applicant shall:

4 (a) Be the holder of a baccalaureate or higher degree, earned with a
5 minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale, and
6 granted by an accredited college or university;

(b) have earned academic credits appropriate to meeting subject and 7 8 field requirements for licensure with an endorsement at the secondary 9 level for such subject or field or for licensure with an endorsement at the elementary, middle or junior high level. The state board of education will 10assure attainment by the applicant of the minimum semester hour 11 12requirements for general education and subjects or fields of specializa-13 tion. Minor deficiencies in the subject or field of specialization requirements may be satisfied through additional course work approved by the 1415state board of education;

16 (c) take and pass the national teacher examination core battery with 17 a composite score at or higher than the national mean score;

(d) apply for and receive from the state board of education a license
valid for one year and renewable for a second year upon successful completion of the first year of participation in the program and recommendation by the supervisory team;

(e) receive and document an offer of a teaching position at an ac-credited Kansas school; and

pay a fee approved by the state board of education as part of the 24 (f) contractual arrangements with the employing accredited school, which 2526fee shall be in an amount determined by the board to be necessary for 27 payment of the costs of the program including, but not limited to, the 28costs for remuneration of the principal and mentor teacher members of 29 the supervisory team. The applicant and employing accredited school 30 shall share equally in the costs for remuneration of the principal and 31 mentor teacher.

32 Sec. 5. Upon successful completion of the alternate teacher prepa-33 ration program as verified by the employing accredited school, a teacher 34 licensure applicant may apply for licensure on a form provided by the 35 state board of education. The state board shall review the application and the recommendation of the employing accredited school and shall grant 36 37 licensure, grant provisional licensure or deny licensure. Successful com-38 pletion of the alternate teacher preparation program will not entitle a 39 teacher licensure applicant to licensure with an endorsement in special 40 education subject areas or licensure at the elementary level other than in the subjects or fields of specialization for which the applicant has met the 4142standards for endorsement.

43 Sec. 6. Upon completion of each school year, commencing with the

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1 2005-2006 school year, the state board of education shall make a report

to the legislature on the effectiveness of the alternate teacher preparation 2 3 program. The report shall include the following information:

The number of accredited schools participating in the program; (a)

(b) the number of persons who applied for employment as teacher

5licensure applicants and the number of such applicants who actually were 6 7 employed;

(c) the number of persons who successfully completed the alternate 8 9 teacher preparation program, who were recommended for licensure, and who were granted licenses; 10

(d) the quality of teachers granted licenses under sections 1 through 11 7, and amendments thereto; 12

13 (e) the rate of attrition of teachers granted licenses under sections 1 through 7, and amendments thereto, as compared with teachers who have 14completed a regular teacher preparation program; and 15

the costs to the state of providing the alternate teacher preparation 16 (f) program as compared with regular teacher preparation programs. 17

18Sec. 7. The requirements and procedures contained in sections 1 through 6, and amendments thereto, for initial issuance of licenses to 1920teach shall be deemed alternative to the requirements and procedures 21therefor that are in effect under any other provision of law and under rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto by the state board of 22 23 education.

24 Sec. 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book. 25
