9 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging Congress to make the re-10peal of the death tax permanent. 11 12WHEREAS, Under tax relief legislation passed in 2001, by the United 13 States congress, the federal estate tax, often referred to as the death tax, was temporarily phased out but not permanently eliminated; and 1415 WHEREAS, Farmers and other small business owners will face losing 16their farms and businesses if the federal government resumes the heavy 17taxation of citizens at death; and 18WHEREAS, This is a tax that is particularly damaging to families who 19are working their way up the ladder and trying accumulate wealth for the 20first time: and 21WHEREAS, Employees suffer layoffs when small and medium busi-22 nesses are liquidated to pay death taxes; and 23 WHEREAS, If the death tax had been repealed in 1996, the United States economy would have realized billions of dollars each year extra 24 output and an average of 145,000 additional new jobs would have been 2526created; and 27 WHEREAS, Having repeatedly passed in the United States House of 28 Representatives and Senate, repeal of the death tax holds wide bipartisan 29 support: Now, therefore, Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas, the House of Rep-30 resentatives concurring therein: That the Senate of the State of Kansas 3132 requests our elected Representatives and Senators in the United States 33 Congress support, work to pass and vote for the immediate and perma-34 nent repeal of the death tax; 35 *Be it further resolved:* That the Secretary of State is directed to send 36 enrolled copies of this resolution to each member of the Kansas Con-
