10 AN ACT concerning improvement districts; pertaining to compensation 11 of directors; amending K.S.A. 19-2764 and repealing the existing 12 section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 19-2764 is hereby amended to read as follows: 19-2764. That (a) Regular meetings of the board of directors shall be held on the first Tuesday of each quarter, and special. Special meetings may be held at any time when all the directors are voluntarily present or may be called by the president or any two directors at any time. Each meeting of the board, whether special or regular, shall be open to the public. That Except as provided in subsection (b), each director shall receive as compensation for services as such, the sum of \$5 per day while actually and necessarily engaged in the performance of his such director's duties under this act. The assessors provided for by this act shall receive for their services each the sum of \$5 per day while actually and necessarily engaged in the performance of his such assessor's duty. The compensation of directors and assessors shall be paid out of the general fund of the improvement district authorized by this act.

(b) The board of directors, by adoption of a resolution, may fix the amount of compensation to be received by the directors members of the board. Such resolution shall be published at least once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the improvement district. If the total amount of compensation to be received annually by each director member of the board is \$100 or less, such resolution shall not be required to be published and shall be effective upon adoption of the resolution. A resolution providing for an increase in compensation shall not be effective until 30 days following the date of the last publication of the resolution.

- Sec. 2. K.S.A. 19-2764 is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
