9 AN ACT concerning health insurance; establishing a pilot program to 10 allow certain small businesses to provide health insurance through the 11state employees health benefits program. 12 13Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. (a) Commencing in plan year 2007, the Kansas state em-15ployees health care commission shall establish a pilot program which 16would allow a qualified small business to provide health insurance to its 17employees by allowing eligible employees to participate in the state health 18care benefits program. 19(1) The pilot program established by this section shall expire on Jan-20uary 1, 2011. 21(2) Participation in the pilot program shall be limited to a total of 22 1,000 eligible employees regardless of the number of qualified small busi-23 nesses involved. 24 Notwithstanding the provisions of K.S.A. 75-6501, and amend-(3)25ments thereto, eligibility of eligible employees of a qualified small busi-26 ness in this pilot program shall not be required to be designated by rule 27and regulation. 28(4) Each participating qualified small business shall agree to stay in 29 the pilot program for at least two years. 30 Each participating qualified small business shall pay the required (5)31health insurance premium for each of its participating eligible employees; 32 however, the employer shall be paid by the eligible employee for such 33 employee's portion of the premium. The determination of the portion of 34 the premium to be paid by the eligible employee shall be subject to 35 negotiation. (b) 36 As used in this section: 37 (1)"Small business" means any business that has at most 30 38 employees. 39 (2)"Qualified small business" means a small business that does not 40 provide health insurance to its employees. "Eligible employee" means an employee who is not already cov-41(3)42ered under another health insurance policy or program. 43 (c) The Kansas state employees health care commission shall report

1 its findings and any recommendations which the commission may have2 concerning the pilot program established under this section to the gov-3 ernor and to the legislature annually.

(d) The secretary of administration is hereby authorized to receive 4 grants, gifts or donations from the United States government, or its agen- $\mathbf{5}$ cies, the Sunflower Foundation: Healthcare for Kansas, or any other 6 7 source whatsoever for the purposes of the pilot program established under this section and amendments thereto, and any moneys so received 8 9 shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the cafeteria benefits fund established by K.S.A. 75-6513 and amendments thereto. All 10 funds received pursuant to this section shall be placed in a separate ac-11 count within the cafeteria benefits fund. All expenditures made from such 1213 fund for the purposes of this section shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports 1415 issued by the secretary of administration or a person designated by the 16 secretary of administration. 17Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

18 publication in the Kansas register.
