9 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to paper verification of votes cast 10on electronic voting machines; amending K.S.A. 25-1308 and 25-1310 and repealing the existing sections. 11 1213 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. K.S.A. 25-1308 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-151308. (a) The secretary of state shall examine and approve the kinds or 16makes of voting machines, and no kind or make of voting machine shall 17be used at any election where voting machines are authorized to be used unless and until it shall have been approved by the secretary of state and 1819a statement thereof is filed in the office of the secretary of state. 20(b) (1) No electronic or computerized voting machine shall be ap-21proved for use in this state unless such electronic voting machine provides 22 for a paper record of each electronically generated ballot that can be: 23 (A) Reviewed and corrected by the voter at the time the vote is cast; 24 and 25used for a recount of the votes cast at an election in which elec-(B)26 tronically generated ballots are used. 27 (2) (A) On and after January 1, 2007, no direct recording voting system shall be used in this state unless such voting system has an acces-2829 sible voter verified paper audit trail. 30 (B) For the purposes of this provision, "accessible voter verified paper 31audit trail" means a component of a direct recording electronic voting 32 system that prints a contemporaneous paper record copy of each elec-33 tronic ballot and allows each voter to confirm such voter's selections before 34 the voter casts such voters ballot. 35 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-1310 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-36 1310. (a) A kind or make of voting machine approved by the secretary of 37 state: 38 (1) Must be so constructed as to provide facilities for voting for the 39 candidates for nomination or election of at least seven different political 40 parties or organizations; 41must permit a voter to vote for any person for any office although (2)42not nominated as a candidate by any political party or organization; 43 (3)must provide for voting on constitutional amendments, proposi1 tions or questions;

must be so constructed that as to primaries where candidates are 2 (4)3 nominated by political parties it can be so locked from the outside that the voter can vote only for the candidates of the political party with which 4 such voter is affiliated or, if not affiliated, according to such voter's dec- $\mathbf{5}$ laration when applying to vote; 6 7 must be so constructed as to prevent voting for more than one (5)8 person for the same office except where the voter is lawfully entitled to 9 vote for more than one person for that office; must afford the voter an opportunity to vote for any or all persons 10(6)for an office as such voter is by law entitled to vote for and no more, and 11 12at the same time preventing such voter from voting for the same person twice for the same office; 13 must be so constructed that in presidential elections the presi-14(7)15dential electors of any political party for presidential and vice-presidential 16 candidates may be voted upon at the same time; must provide facilities for "write-in" votes; 17(8)18must provide for voting in absolute secrecy in voting, except as to (9)

persons entitled to assistance;

20 (10) must be so constructed as to accurately account for every vote 21 cast upon it;

(11) be provided with a "protective counter" or "protective device"
whereby any operation of the machine before or after the election will
be detected;

(12) be provided with a counter which will show at all times duringthe election how many persons have voted; and

(13) be provided with a mechanical model illustrating the manner ofvoting on the machine, suitable for the instruction of voters.

Voting machines approved by the state executive council shall continueon the approved list of voting machines.

(b) In addition to the requirements of subsection (a), each electronic
or computerized voting machine approved by the secretary of state shall
meet the requirements of subsection (b) of K.S.A. 25-1308, and amendments thereto.

New Sec. 3. (a) The secretary of state shall expend any moneys for the initial purchase, upgrade, retrofit or equipping of any direct recording voting system, or any equipment related thereto, unless such voting system includes, or is equipped with, an accessible voter verified paper audit trail.

40 (b) As used in this section, "accessible voter verified paper audit trail"
41 shall have the meaning ascribed thereto by K.S.A. 25-1308, and amend42 ments thereto.

43 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 25-1308 and 25-1310 are hereby repealed.
