HOUSE BILL No. 2988

By Committee on Appropriations

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AN ACT enacting the Kansas cancer act; creating the Kansas comprehensive cancer center and prescribing powers, duties and functions therefor; establishing an executive advisory board, the Kansas umbilical cord blood bank and the midwest cancer alliance; providing for annual reports; prohibiting certain expenditures.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. The provisions of section 1 through 8, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the Kansas cancer act.

- Sec. 2. (a) There is hereby created the Kansas comprehensive cancer center which shall be the lead agency for the public health initiative of Kansas dedicated to the mission of ending suffering and death from cancer.
 - (b) The Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall:
- (1) plan and develop an expanded, intensified and coordinated cancer research program for the benefit of all Kansas;
- (2) collaborate with and coordinate, through the Kansas bioscience authority, the cancer research efforts of all universities and community colleges under the state board of regents to assure that capital for viable research is provided and that the high standards of the Kansas bioscience authority are applied;
- (3) establish and provide for the operation of the Kansas umbilical cord blood bank as provided in section 5 and amendments thereto;
- (4) aggressively pursue the development and deployment of effective initiatives to prevent cancer in humans;
- (5) enhance access to exceptional cancer care for patients throughout Kansas and to clinical trials for patients whose diagnosis merits participation in such trials;
- (6) aggressively pursue translational and clinical research to allow Kansans to more fully benefit from discoveries in basic cancer research; and
- (7) enhance the expertise of health care providers in treating and preventing cancer.
- 42 (c) The Kansas bioscience authority shall be the lead agency in co-43 ordinating cancer research efforts of the Kansas comprehensive cancer

center, all entities participating in such research efforts through the Kansas comprehensive cancer center, and all universities and community colleges under the state board of regents to assure that capital for viable research is provided and that the high standards of the Kansas bioscience authority are applied to the cancer research component of this Kansas public health initiative.

- Sec. 3. (a) The Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall be comprised of the university of Kansas cancer center, which has the medical and research elements required by the national cancer institute to qualify for designation as a federal comprehensive cancer center, and other state educational institutions, or allied health research facilities, that are approved for participation in accordance with this section. Participation in the Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall be open to other state educational institutions under the control and supervision of the state board of regents, and any allied health research facilities, that have cancer research expertise and are approved for such participation by the state board of regents.
- (b) Nothing in this act shall preclude the re-designation of the university of Kansas cancer center in honor of, or as a memorial to, a private sector donor, or the donor's designee, when the contribution in support of the university of Kansas cancer center is determined by the state board of regents to merit such re-designation.
- (c) The Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall be operated under the authority of the director of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the executive vice-chancellor of the university of Kansas medical center. The director of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall be a preeminent scientist physician and faculty member of the university of Kansas medical center.
- (d) All moneys and other proceeds received for or through the commercialization of treatments or other rights or properties that are discovered or developed or are otherwise the result of the discovery, creation or distribution of new therapeutic agents, tools or techniques resulting from the cancer research program or activities of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center or the university of Kansas cancer center, shall be used to support the Kansas comprehensive cancer center.
- Sec. 4. (a) There is hereby established the executive advisory board of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center to support and advance the purposes of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center.
- (b) The executive advisory board shall be appointed by the governor and shall be composed of the following:
- (1) One member representing the university of Kansas school of medicine from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the executive dean of the university of Kansas school of medicine;

- (2) one member representing the Kansas state university Terry C. Johnson center for basic cancer research from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the president of Kansas state university;
- (3) one member representing the center for cancer experimental therapeutics from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the chair of the department of medicinal chemistry of the university of Kansas;
- (4) one member representing the University of Kansas cancer center from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the executive vice-chancellor of the university of Kansas medical center;
- (5) one member representing the Kansas City cancer center from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the president of the Kansas City cancer center;
- (6) one member representing the Wichita community cancer oncology program from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the administrator of the Wichita community cancer oncology program;
- (7) one member representing the Kansas bioscience authority from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the board of directors of the Kansas bioscience authority;
- (8) one member representing the university of Kansas school of pharmacy from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the dean of the university of Kansas school of pharmacy;
- (9) one member representing the Kansas health policy authority from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the Kansas health policy authority;
- (10) one member representing the division of health of the department of health and environment from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the director of health;
- (11) one member representing the Kansas hospital association from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the Kansas hospital association; and
 - (12) one member representing the general public.
- Sec. 5. (a) The Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall establish and provide for the operation of the Kansas umbilical cord blood bank in compliance with standards set by the federal government. The Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall develop and make available education and training in the procedures and other requirements for collecting and maintaining umbilical cord blood donations to all health care providers and other medical personnel and clinical staff in Kansas.
- (b) The Kansas umbilical cord blood bank shall accept and maintain umbilical cord blood donations at no charge or other cost to any donor. The operations of the Kansas umbilical cord blood bank shall be subject to review and approval by the executive advisory board of the Kansas

comprehensive cancer center.

Sec. 6. (a) There is hereby established the midwest cancer alliance. The midwest cancer alliance shall exist for the purpose of delivering the benefits of the university of Kansas cancer center to every region of Kansas through a network of public and private hospitals, health care providers and research entities that are committed to supporting and advancing the mission of the university of Kansas cancer center. The midwest cancer alliance shall be operated by the director of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center under the direction of the midwest cancer alliance governing board.

- (b) There is hereby established the midwest cancer alliance governing board which shall adopt policies for the activities and operations of the midwest cancer alliance. The midwest cancer alliance governing board shall be appointed by the governor and shall be composed of the following:
- (1) One member representing the university of Kansas school of medicine from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the executive dean of the university of Kansas school of medicine;
- (2) one member representing the Kansas health policy authority from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the Kansas health policy authority;
- (3) one member representing the University of Kansas cancer center from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the executive vice-chancellor of the university of Kansas medical center;
- (4) one member representing the Kansas city cancer center from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the president of the Kansas City cancer center;
- (5) one member representing the Wichita community cancer oncology program from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the administrator of the Wichita community cancer oncology program;
- (6) one member representing the Kansas hospital association from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the Kansas hospital association; and
- (7) one member representing the Kansas medical society from a list of one or more persons who are nominated by the Kansas medical society.
- (c) Members of the midwest cancer alliance governing board established by this section shall not receive any compensation or travel expenses or subsistence expenses or allowances for attendance at meetings of the midwest cancer alliance governing board and shall not receive any other expense allowances or reimbursements for expenses incurred in performing the statutory or any other duties or services as a member of the midwest cancer alliance governing board.
- 43 Sec. 7. The director of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center shall

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 prepare and provide annual reports to the governor, the legislature and the Kansas health policy authority regarding the activities and operations of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center and the progress attained in treating, curing and conducting research on cancer.

Sec. 8. No moneys appropriated from the state general fund or any special revenue fund in the state treasury shall be expended by the Kansas comprehensive cancer center, university of Kansas cancer center, the executive advisory board established by section 4, and amendments thereto, or any state agency, as defined by K.S.A. 75-3701, and amendments thereto, for any lobbying or other activities to request or influence federal or state legislative action or approval for or on behalf of the Kansas comprehensive cancer center, the university of Kansas cancer center or the midwest cancer alliance.

Sec. 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
