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9 AN ACT enacting the teacher-firefighter-police housing development 10 act; 11 12Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. This act may be cited as the teacher-firefighter-police 13 14housing development act. 15Sec. 2. (a) There is established a foundation knows as the teacher-16firefighter-police housing development foundation. The foundation shall 17be a part of the department of commerce. (b) The foundation shall be operated and controlled by a board of 1819trustees consisting of 15 members, of whom three shall represent teach-20ers; three shall represent firefighters; three shall represent law enforce-21ment officers; three shall represent realtors, mortgage officers and real 22 estate developers; and three shall represent state and local government. 23 Board members shall be appointed by the governor in consulta-(c) 24 tion with the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of 25representatives. 26 The initial board members shall be appointed not later than 30 (d) 27 days after the effective date of this act. The governor shall designate one 28board member to serve as chairperson, who shall call the first board meet-29 ing within 30 days after all initial members have been appointed. 30 (e) Board members shall serve for terms of two years and may be 31reappointed. Any vacancy on the board shall be filled in the same manner 32 as the original appointment. 33 (f) A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum 34 for conducting business, but a lesser number of members may hold 35 hearings. 36 (g) The board may adopt rules and procedures to govern its 37 proceedings. 38 Sec. 3. (a) The purpose of the foundation is to provide housing in-39 centives to encourage well-qualified teachers, firefighters and law en-40 forcement officers to transfer to jobs in high priority areas that need them 41most. 42(b) The foundation shall identify high priority areas:

43 (1) For teachers, based on subdistricts identified by the state board

1 of education as having had in the preceding school year an enrollment of

2 at least 35.1% of pupils who were eligible for free or reduced price meals 3 under the national school lunch act;

4 (2) for firefighters, based on areas served by a fire station that the

5 state fire marshal designates as chronically understaffed; and
6 (3) for law enforcement officers, based on crime statistic areas that

7 are designated by the superintendent of the Kansas highway patrol as 8 having high levels of serious crime.

9 (c) The foundation shall identify well-qualified applicants for housing 10 assistance:

11 (1) For teachers, based on educational attainment and years of ex-12 perience, giving preference to national board certified teachers;

(2) for firefighters, based on educational attainment, years of expe-rience and rank; and

(3) for law enforcement officers, based on educational attainment,years of experience and rank.

(d) The foundation may solicit and accept private donations for hous-ing incentive programs, including gifts, grants and bequests.

Sec. 4. (a) Based on available funding, the foundation shall provide mortgage assistance to applicants who, in the opinion of the board, are the most promising candidates to provide excellent public service to high priority areas for many years to come. Applicants must agree to remain on the job in a high priority area for at least five years.

(b) Applicants for housing assistance shall submit three letters of recommendation, explain the reasons that they are available for employment
in the high priority area and state why they want such employment.

(c) The foundation shall develop, implement and administer a home
loan program to provide special home loan financing to selected teachers,
firefighters and law enforcement officers. To the extent possible, the following financing options shall be included in the home loan program:

(1) A conventional 30-year mortgage available for the purchase of an
eligible home, at a favorable interest rate determined by the foundation;
(2) other mortgage options at favorable interest rates determined by
the foundation; and

(3) a forgivable loan equal to not more than ten percent of the total
cost of an eligible home, which is intended as assistance with the down
payment. The applicant shall receive ¹/₅ credit on a forgivable loan for
each year that the applicant serves in the high-risk area.

(d) If a successful applicant leaves the job for any reason within five
years after exercising an option for a mortgage under this section, the
remaining balance on the mortgage shall become due and payable within
six months after the termination of the applicant.

2 then the remaining balance on the forgivable loan shall become due and3 payable within six months after the termination of the applicant.

7 Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 8 publication in the statute book.
