WHEREAS, War dogs have significantly reduced the enemy's capacity to sabotage or destroy war equipment worth billions of dollars; and

WHEREAS, War dogs work for food, water and the love, loyalty and bond of their handlers. The loving bond and extreme loyalty between dog and handler is unconditional and immeasurable; and

WHEREAS, Thousands of war dogs with names like Stubby, Chips, Prince, Rolf, Rip, Clipper, Duke, Lady, Flop, Erich, London, Rebel, Sarge, Kelly, Tiger, Smokey, Missy, Roger, Teddy, Troubles, Dutch, Blitz, Cimmaron and Hansle never returned from their duty in harm's way; and

WHEREAS, The National War Dog Team Memorial is currently proposed for construction and permanent display in Washington, D.C., and contributions for this endeavor are underway: Now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas: That we commend the valiant efforts of our war dogs and offer our humble gratitude for the heroic duties, great feats and sacrifice war dogs have made as the American serviceperson's auxiliary and best friend.
