9 AN ACT concerning the admission of students to state educational in-10stitutions; amending K.S.A. 72-116 and repealing the existing section. 11 12Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 Section 1. K.S.A. 72-116 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-14116. (a) Any person who completes a four-year course of study in grad-15 uates from any high school accredited by the state board of education and 16 who meets the admission requirements established by the state board of 17regents pursuant to K.S.A. 76-717, and amendments thereto, shall be 18entitled to admission to the freshman class of the state educational insti-19tutions which are under the control and supervision of the state board of 20regents upon presenting a statement containing a transcript of the high 21school record of the person signed by the principal of the school or su-22 perintendent of the school district and certifying that the person has sat-23 isfactorily completed the course requirements of the state board of ed-24 ucation necessary for graduation from high school. 25Any person who is a resident of the state of Kansas, who graduates (b)26from an accredited high school located outside the state of Kansas and 27 who meets the admission requirements established by the state board of 28regents pursuant to K.S.A. 76-717, and amendments thereto, for persons 29 who have graduated from an accredited Kansas high school shall be en-30 titled to admission to the freshman class of the state educational institu-31tions which are under the control and supervision of the state board of 32 regents upon presenting a statement containing a transcript of the high 33 school record of the person signed by the principal of the school or su-34 perintendent of the school district and certifying that the person has sat-35 isfactorily completed the course requirements necessary for graduation 36 from high school. 37 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 72-116 is hereby repealed. 38 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
