## SENATE BILL No. 447

9 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to full voter identification; 10amending K.S.A. 25-2354 and K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 25-1122, 25-1122d, 25-1123, 25-2908 and 25-3002 and repealing the existing sections. 11 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as 15follows: 25-1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county elec-16tion officer where such person is a resident, or where such person is 17authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only 1819to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as 20otherwise provided by law. 21(b) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to 22 be transmitted in person, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter 23 shall provide a form of valid identification such as a current and valid 24 Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank 25statement, paycheck, government check or other government document 26containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on the reg-27 istration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide identification 28if such voter has previously provided current and valid identification in 29 the county where registered. 30 - (e) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to 31be transmitted by mail, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter 32 shall provide on the application for an advance voting ballot the voter's 33 current and valid Kansas driver's license number, nondriver's identifica-34 tion card number or the last four digits of the voter's social security num-35 ber, or shall provide with the application a copy of the voter's current and 36 valid Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification eard, utility bill, 37 bank statement, paycheek, government cheek or other government doe-38 ument containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on 39 the registration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide identification if such voter has previously provided current and valid identi-40 41fication in the county where registered The registered voter shall provide 42valid identification with the voter's application for an advance voting 43 ballot. The forms of valid identification shall include:

1 (1) The voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license number or 2 nondriver's identification card number;

(2) the last four digits of the voter's social security number; or

4 (3) a copy of the voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license or 5 nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, gov-6 ernment check or other government document.

Outside the list the document provided in accordance with this subsection shall contain, at minimum, the voter's current name and residential
address as indicated on the registration book.

 $\frac{d}{d}(c)$  If a first-time voter is unable or refuses to provide current and 10valid identification, or if the name and address do not match the voter's 11 12name and address on the registration book, the voter may vote a provisional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and amendments thereto. The 13 voter shall provide a valid form of identification as defined in subsection 1415(e) (b) of this section to the county election officer in person or provide 16a copy by mail or electronic means before the meeting of the county board of canvassers. At the meeting of the county board of canvassers the county 1718election officer shall present copies of identification received from pro-19visional voters and the corresponding provisional ballots. If the county 20board of canvassers determines that a voter's identification is valid and 21the provisional ballot was properly cast, the ballot shall be counted.

22 (c) (d) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to 23 the voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times:

(1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August
in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and the last business day of the week preceding such primary election.

(2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the
first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between 90 days
prior to such election and the last business day of the week preceding
such general election.

(3) For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last
business day of the week preceding such primary election.

34 (4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in April,
35 between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day
36 of the week preceding such general election.

(5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a primary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for election
of officers at such election.

40 (6) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a
41 primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice
42 thereof and the last business day of the week preceding such question
43 submitted election, except that if the question submitted election is held

1 on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine

2 the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots, but such date shall 3 not be more than three business days before such election.

4 (7) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified by 5 the secretary of state.

6 (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1 of 7 the year in which such primary is held and the last business day of the 8 week preceding such primary election.

9 The county election officer of any county may receive applications prior 10 to the time specified in this subsection (e)(d) and hold such applications 11 until the beginning of the prescribed application period. Such applications 12 shall be treated as filed on that date.

13 (f) (e) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election office, applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in 1415person in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the 16Tuesday next preceding the election and on each subsequent business day until no later than 12:00 noon on the day preceding such election. If 1718the county election officer so provides, applications for advance voting 19ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county elec-20tion officer also may be filed on the Saturday preceding the election. 21Upon receipt of any such properly executed application, the county elec-22 tion officer shall deliver to the voter such ballots and instructions as are 23 provided for in this act.

An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the close of the polls on election day.

In any county having a population exceeding 250,000, the county election officer may designate places other than the central county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for advance voting ballots, such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by this subsection.

36 (g)(f) Any person having a permanent disability or an illness which 37 has been diagnosed as a permanent illness is hereby authorized to make 38 an application for permanent advance voting status. Applications for per-39 manent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such in-40 formation as is required for application for advance voting ballots and also 41 shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to permanent 42 advance voting status.

43 A person applying for permanent advance voter status shall submit

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1 valid identification as provided in subsection (b). Once such permanent 2 voter has provided valid identification, or if such voter's registration has 3 been verified pursuant to K.S.A. 25-2354, and amendments thereto, such voter shall not be required to provide identification in subsequent elec-4 tions unless the voter: 56

Changes name or residential address; (1)

(2)moves out of the county or state; or

(3)is removed from the registration list and re-registers.

 $(\mathbf{h})$  (g) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this 9 section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such 10 officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such 11 12applications, together with their correct post office address and the pre-13 cinct, ward, township or voting area in which such persons claim to be registered voters or to be authorized by law to vote as former precinct 1415 residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Such names 16and addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The county election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names and 1718addresses of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status. All 19such lists shall be available for inspection upon request in compliance 20with this subsection by any registered voter during regular business hours. 21The county election officer upon receipt of such applications shall enter 22upon a record kept by such officer the name and address of each appli-23 cant, which record shall conform to the list above required. Before inspection of any advance voting ballot application list, the person desiring 24 25to make such inspection shall provide to the county election officer iden-26tification in the form of driver's license or other reliable identification and 27shall sign a log book or application form maintained by such officer stating 28such person's name and address and showing the date and time of in-29 spection. All records made by the county election officer shall be subject 30 to public inspection, except that the voter identification information required by subsections (b) and (c) subsection (b) and the identifying num-3132 ber on ballots and ballot envelopes and records of such numbers shall not 33 be made public. 34 (i) (h) If a person on the permanent advance voting list fails to vote 35 in two consecutive general elections held on the Tuesday succeeding the 36 first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, the county elec-37 tion officer may mail a notice to such voter. Such notice shall inform the 38 voter that the voter's name will be removed from the permanent advance 39 voting list unless the voter renews the application for permanent advance

40 voting status within 30 days after the notice is mailed. If the voter fails to renew such application, the county election officer shall remove the 41

42voter's name from the permanent advance voting list. Failure to renew

43 the application for permanent advance voting status shall not result in

1	removal of the voter's name from the voter registration list.

(a) (1) When an application for an advance voting ballot has been filed in accordance with K.S.A. 25-1122, and amendments thereto, the county election officer shall transmit to the voter applying therefor one each of the appropriate ballots. Except as provided by subsection (b), the county election officer shall transmit the advance voting

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1 ballots to the voter at one of the following addresses as specified by the 2 voter on such application: (1)

3 (A) The voter's residential address or mailing address as indicated on 4 the registration list; (2)

(B) the voter's temporary residential address; or (3)

(B) If the advance voting ballot is transmitted by mail, such ballot
shall be transmitted with printed instructions prescribed by the secretary
of state and a ballot envelope bearing upon the outside a printed form as
described in K.S.A. 25-1120, and amendments thereto, and the same
number as the number of the ballot.

18(C) If the advance voting ballot is transmitted to the applicant in 19person in the office of the county election officer or at a satellite advance 20voting site, such advance voting ballot and printed instructions shall be 21transmitted in an advance voting ballot envelope bearing upon the outside 22 a printed form as described in K.S.A. 25-1120, and amendments thereto, 23 and the same number as the number of the ballot unless the voter elects to deposit the advance voting ballot into a locked ballot box without an 24 25envelope.

(3) All ballots shall be transmitted to the advance voting voter not
more than 20 days before the election but within two business days of
the receipt of such voter's application by the election officer or the commencement of such 20-day period. In primary elections required to be
conducted on a partisan basis, the election officer shall deliver to such
voter the ballot of the political party of the applicant.

32 (b) The restrictions in subsection (a) relating to where a county election officer may transmit an advance voting ballot shall not apply to an advance voting ballot requested pursuant to an application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language.

(c) The secretary of state or the county election officer shall compare
the driver's license number, nondriver's identification card number, social
security number or copy of other valid identification provided by a firsttime voter each applicant for an advance voting ballot to the voter reg-

41 istration list verified by the division of motor vehicles in accordance with

42 federal law K.S.A. 25-2354 and amendments thereto. If no identification

43 information was provided by the first-time voter, or if such information

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1 does not match the information on the *verified* voter registration list, the county election officer shall not transmit an advance voting ballot issue a 2 3 provisional ballot to such voter in accordance with K.S.A. 25-409 and amendments thereto. The voter shall provide a valid form of identification 4 as defined in subsection (a) of K.S.A. 25-1122, and amendments thereto,  $\mathbf{5}$ to the county election officer in person or provide a copy by mail or 6 7 electronic means before the meeting of the county board of canvassers. At 8 the meeting of the county board of canvassers the county election officer 9 shall present copies of identification received from provisional voters and the corresponding provisional ballots. If the county board of canvassers 10 determines that a voter's identification is valid and the provisional ballot 11 12 was properly cast, the ballot shall be counted. 13 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 25-2354 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-2354. (a) Once each calendar year a check of the registration records of 1415 voters in the state of Kansas shall be commenced by the chief state elec-16tion official or the county election officer by comparing such records to the National Change of Address files. A county election officer may com-1718plete one or more checks each calendar year. If the chief state election 19official performs the check, any discrepancies discovered in the check 20shall be reported to the appropriate county election officer, who shall 21initiate the confirmation process prescribed by K.S.A. 25-2316c, and 22 amendments thereto, within 45 days. As an alternative to participation in 23 the national change of address program, the county election officer may 24 conduct mass or targeted mailings to registered voters to obtain infor-25mation upon which to base the confirmation mailings. 26(b) In a manner determined by the chief state election official and the 27 director of the division of motor vehicles, the chief state election official 28 shall compare information derived from the voter registration records of 29 voters in the state of Kansas to driver's license records for the purpose of 30 verifying the accuracy of the information provided on applications for 31 voter registration in compliance with section 303 of the help America vote

act of 2002. Such comparison shall include each voter's driver's license
number or nondriver's identification number or the last four digits of the
voter's social security number as provided by the voter on the voter's
application for registration.

(c) The chief state election official shall compare information derived
from the voter registration records of voters in the state of Kansas to state
felony conviction records for the purpose of removing the names of ineligible voters from the registration list in compliance with section 303 of
the help America vote act of 2002.

(d) The chief state election official shall compare information derived
from the voter registration records of voters in the state of Kansas to state
records on death for the purpose of removing the names of ineligible voters

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1 from the registration list in compliance with section 303 of the help Amer-2 ica vote act of 2002.

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3 (e) The chief state election official may adopt rules and regulations 4 to carry out the provisions of this section.

5 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 25-2908 is hereby amended to read as 6 follows: 25-2908. (a) Each polling place shall use either: (1) A registration 7 book and a poll book, as defined in K.S.A. 25-2507(a) and K.S.A. 25-8 2507(b)(1), and amendments thereto; or (2) a registration book, as de-9 fined in K.S.A. 25-2507(b)(2), and amendments thereto. The county elec-10 tion officer shall determine which books are used in each county, and 11 which book voters shall sign.

12 (b) A person desiring to vote shall provide to the election board:

13 (1) The voter's name;

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14 (2) if required, the voter's address; and

15 (3) the voter's valid identification as defined in subsection (d);
