AN ACT concerning payment of compensation; relating to payment 10methods; electronic transfer; electronic deposit; payroll card; amend-11 12 ing K.S.A. 44-314 and repealing the existing section. 13 14Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: New Section 1. Between July 1, 2006, and June 30, 2007, the 1516 employer shall convene four quarterly employee forums to provide 17information to employees regarding plans to implement a payment system pursuant to K.S.A. 44-314, as it will be effective on and after 18July 1, 2007. The provisions of this section shall expire on June 30, 1920 2007. 21 Section 1 2. On and after July 1, 2007, K.S.A. 44-314 is hereby 22 amended to read as follows: 44-314. (a) Every employer shall pay all wages 23 due to the employees of the employer at least once during each calendar 24month, on regular paydays designated in advance by the employer, in lawful money of the United States or with checks or drafts which are 2526negotiable in the community wherein the place of employment is located 27or, with the written consent of the employee, by electronic deposit to an 28employce's account at a financial institution. 29(b) The employer may designate the method by which employees re-30 ceive wages, provided all wages shall be paid by one or more of the fol-31 lowing methods at no cost to employees: 32 (1)In lawful money of the United States; 33 (2)by check or draft which is negotiable in the community wherein 34 the place of employment is located; 35 by electronic transfer or deposit to an automated clearing house (3)member financial institution account designated by the employee; or 36 37 (4) by payroll card at the election of the employee when offered by 38 the employer. If such method is used exclusively, the employer must 39 offer a payroll card, if requested by the employee. At least one with-40drawal per pay period shall be allowed at no cost to employees who 41 use payroll cards. For purposes of this section, "payroll card" means a card, issued by the employer, a bank or other entity on behalf of an 4243 employer, on which the net wages of an employee have been loaded or

deposited by the employer and which are available to an employee each 1 2 payday. Funds available to an employee by payroll card may be withdrawn by the employee at authorized automated teller machines, pre-3 sented to card accepting merchants at points of sale or at other authorized 4  $\mathbf{5}$ locations as may be included in the payroll card program offered by the 6 employer. 7 (c) Except as provided in subsection (b)(4) of this section, an employee may not refuse payment of wages by a method designated by the employer 8 9 and permitted under subsection (b) of this section.  $\frac{d}{d}$  (c) The end of the pay period for which payment is made on 10a regular payday shall be not more than 15 days before such regular 11 payday unless a variance in such requirement is authorized by state or 12 13 federal law. Sec. 2 3. On and after July 1, 2007, K.S.A. 44-314 is hereby 1415repealed. 16 Sec. 3 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

17 publication in the statute book.
