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9 AN ACT concerning schools; relating to accreditation; amending K.S.A. 10 2005 Supp. 72-6439 and repealing the existing section. 11 12Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 New Section 1. (a) As used in this section: 14(1) "Public agency" means the state of Kansas, a school district and 15any department, agency, board, officer, employee, servant, contractor, 16 subcontractor, agent, or other instrumentality of the state or any school 17district. 18(2)"Public moneys" means any moneys received from a public 19agency or the federal government. 20(3)"State board" means the state board of education. 21No public agency shall expend any public moneys for the purpose (b) 22 of adopting, implementing or enforcing school accreditation guidelines 23 or standards which require, or are based upon a requirement of, improve-24 ment in student performance or student proficiency. 25Nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting the state (c) 26board from establishing school accreditation guidelines or standards 27 which establish, or which are based upon, goals of improvement in stu-28dent performance or student proficiency. 29 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 72-6439 is hereby amended to read as 30 follows: 72-6439. (a) Subject to the provisions of section 1, and amend-31*ments thereto*, in order to accomplish the mission for Kansas education, 32 the state board of education shall design and adopt a school performance 33 accreditation system based upon improvement in performance that which 34 reflects high academic standards and is measurable. The state board may 35 establish school accreditation standards which establish, or which are 36 based upon, goals of improvement in student performance or student proficiency. 37 38 The state board of education shall provide for assessments in the (b) 39 core academic areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing, and social 40 studies, and shall establish eurrieulum standards for such core academie 41areas. The assessments shall be administered at three grade levels, as determined by the state board. The curriculum standards shall be equal 42

43 to the best standards and shall be reviewed at least every three years. The

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1 state board shall ensure compatibility between the statewide assessments and the curriculum standards. The state board shall establish curriculum 2 3 standards which reflect high academic standards for the core academic areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing and social studies. The 4 curriculum standards shall be reviewed at least every seven years. Noth-5ing in this subsection shall be construed in any manner so as to impinge 6 7 upon any district's authority to determine its own curriculum. (c) The state board shall provide for statewide assessments in the core 8 9 academic areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing and social studies. The board shall ensure compatibility between the statewide assess-10 ments and the curriculum standards established pursuant to subsection 11 12(b). Such assessments shall be administered at three grade levels, as de-13 termined by the board. The state board of education shall determine performance levels on the statewide assessments, the achievement of 1415which represents excellence high academic standards in the academic area at the grade level to which the assessment applies. The state board 16should specify the measure of excellence high academic standards both 1718for individual performance and school performance on the assessments. (d) Each school in every district shall establish a school site council 19 composed of the principal and representatives of teachers and other 2021school personnel, parents of pupils attending the school, the business 22community, and other community groups. School site councils shall be 23 responsible for providing advice and counsel in evaluating state, school district, and school site performance goals and objectives and in deter-24 25mining the methods that should be employed at the school site to meet 26these goals and objectives. Site councils may make recommendations and 27 proposals to the school board regarding budgetary items and school district matters, including but not limited to, identifying and implementing 2829 the best practices for developing efficient and effective administrative and management functions. Site councils also may help school boards analyze 30 31 the unique environment of schools, enhance the efficiency and maximize 32 limited resources, including outsourcing arrangements and cooperative 33 opportunities as a means to address limited budgets. 34 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 72-6439 is hereby repealed. 35 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

36 publication in the Kansas register.

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
