

## HOUSE BILL No. 2009

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9 AN ACT concerning pharmacists; relating to vaccinations; amending  
10 K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 65-1635a and repealing the existing section.

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12 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

13 Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 65-1635a is hereby amended to read  
14 as follows: 65-1635a. (a) A pharmacist may administer vaccine to a person  
15 ~~18 years of age or older~~ pursuant to a vaccination protocol if the phar-  
16 macist has successfully completed a course of study and training, ap-  
17 proved by the accreditation council for pharmacy or the board, in vacci-  
18 nation storage, protocols, injection technique, emergency procedures and  
19 recordkeeping. A pharmacist who successfully completes such a course  
20 of study and training shall maintain proof of completion and, upon re-  
21 quest, provide a copy of such proof to the board.

22 (b) All vaccinees will be given a written immunization record for their  
23 personal files. The administering pharmacist shall promptly report a rec-  
24 ord of the immunization to the vaccinee's primary-care provider by elec-  
25 tronic facsimile or mail. If the vaccinee does not have a primary care  
26 provider, then the administering pharmacist shall promptly report a rec-  
27 ord of the immunization to the person licensed to practice medicine and  
28 surgery by the state board of healing arts who has entered into the vac-  
29 cination protocol with the pharmacist. The immunization will also be re-  
30 ported to appropriate county or state immunization registries.

31 (c) A pharmacist may not delegate to any person the authority granted  
32 under this act to administer a vaccine.

33 (d) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the pharmacy  
34 act of the state of Kansas.

35 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 65-1635a is hereby repealed.

36 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its  
37 publication in the statute book.
