9 AN ACT concerning water; providing for establishment of the upper Ar-10 kansas river conservation reserve enhancement program.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section:

- (1) "Farm services agency" means the United States department of agriculture farm services agency.
- (2) "Arkansas river corridor" means those portions of the upper Arkansas river basin within Hamilton, Kearny, Finney, Gray, Ford, Edwards, Pawnee, Stafford, Barton and Rice counties.
- (b) Upon execution of an agreement between the state of Kansas and the farm services agency for implementation of an upper Arkansas river conservation reserve enhancement program (CREP), the state conservation commission and the Kansas water office are hereby authorized to establish such program. The program shall be a joint state-federal program, to be administered for the state by the state conservation commission.
- (c) The upper Arkansas river conservation reserve enhancement program shall have the purpose of reducing withdrawal demands on the high plains aquifer, improving water quality, protecting public water supplies and enhancing wildlife habitat. The program shall provide for voluntary retirement of water rights in the Arkansas river corridor, in accordance with: (1) A program prepared and submitted by the state conservation commission and the Kansas water office and presented to the senate committee on natural resources and the house committee on agriculture and natural resources; and (2) rules and regulations adopted by the state conservation commission.
- (d) The state conservation commission shall adopt rules and regulations for the implementation and administration of the upper Arkansas river conservation reserve enhancement program. The rules and regulations shall include, but are not limited to, eligibility requirements for and conditions of participation in the program and incentives to participate in the program.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
