HOUSE BILL No. 2302

By Committee on Veterans, Military and Homeland Security

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AN ACT relating to veterans; amending K.S.A. 73-1221, 73-1222, 73-9 1223, 73-1224, 73-1225, 73-1226, 73-1227, 73-1230 and 73-1231 and 10 repealing the existing sections. 11

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13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 73-1221 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-14 15 1221. This act shall be known as the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans 16 health initiative act.

- Sec. 2. K.S.A. 73-1222 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1222. As used in K.S.A. 73-1221 through 73-1231, and amendments thereto, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Birth defeet" means any physical or mental abnormality or condition, including any susceptibility to any illness or condition other than normal childhood illnesses or conditions.
 - "Board" means the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative board established by K.S.A. 73-1223, and amendments thereto.
- 25 "Commission" means the Kansas commission on veterans 26 affairs.
 - (d) (c) "Director" means the executive director of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs.
 - $\frac{(e)}{(d)}$ "Gulf War syndrome" means the wide range of physical and mental conditions, problems and illnesses that are connected with service in the armed forces of the United States during and in the area of operations of the Persian Gulf War.
 - "Veteran" means a person who is a resident of Kansas who was a member of the armed forces of the United States of America and who served in such armed forces in the area of operations of the Persian Gulf War during the Persian Gulf War or thereafter regardless of whether such person is still actively serving in the armed forces or reserve. served on active service and who was discharged or released from the service under conditions other than dishonorable, and it also includes everyone still serving on active duty in the national guard or is one of the reserve components that was deployed to hostile theater operations.
- 42 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 73-1223 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1223. (a) There is hereby established with the commission an advisory 43

board known to be the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative board. The board shall be advisory to the commission in the implementation and administration of this act.

- (b) The board shall consist of $\frac{1}{2}$ no less than 11 members appointed as follows:
- (1) At least three five members shall be veterans. The director shall notify the state level unit commanders of the Disabled American Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and, the American Legion and other veterans organizations in Kansas to request a list of three no less than two nominations of veterans from each such veterans organization. The governor shall appoint one veteran as a member from each list, but subject to a total of five veterans, and with no two veterans from the same organization list. If any veteran member fails to show to two meetings in one calendar year, the veteran may be replaced by the chairperson of the commission using the list and so long as no two veterans on the board are from the same organization list.
- (2) One member shall be qualified from each of the medical specializations of epidemiology, toxicology and genetics. One member shall be qualified in one of the behavioral sciences in the speciality area of family dynamics. The director shall notify one or more professional societies or associations which represent the medical or behavioral science specialty area required and request a list of three nominations from that specialty area. The commission shall appoint one member of the board from each list. The board shall include up to six clinical or research professionals appointed by the commission with expertise in appropriate areas that may include, but are not limited to: Toxicology, epidemiology, traumatic injury, trauma related psychiatric disorders, neurology, family dynamics, social work and human services and physical therapy.
- (3) Two legislators, one from each house, shall be appointed to the board with the speaker of the house of representatives and president of the senate each appointing a member. One legislator shall be a member of the democratic party and one legislator shall be a member of the republican party.
- (4) The board shall include at least three representatives appointed by the commission from the state and or federal agencies that may include, but are not limited to, the U.S. department on veterans affairs, the department of labor, the Kansas adjutant general's office, the Kansas department of health and environment and the Kansas department of social and rehabilitation services.
- (c) Within 90 days of the effective date of this act, the governor, the commission, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate shall appoint the initial members of the board. Of the initial appointments to the board by the governor, one shall be for a term of

one year, one shall be for a term of two years and one shall be for a term ending three years after the date of the initial appointment. Of the initial appointments to the board by the commission, two shall be for a term of one year, one shall be for a term of two years and one shall be for a term ending three years after the date of the initial appointment. After the initial appointments, terms of office of the members appointed by the governor or the commission shall be for three years but no person shall be appointed for more than two successive three-year terms. The term of office of each member appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives or the president of the senate shall end on the first day of the regular session of the legislature which commences in the first odd-numbered year occurring after the year such member was appointed.

- (d) Each member of the board shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the membership of the board for any reason other than the expiration of a member's term of office, the governor, the commission, speaker of the house of representatives or president of the senate shall appoint a successor of like qualifications to fill the unexpired term in accordance with this section. In the case of any vacancy occurring in the position of a board member who was appointed from a list of nominations submitted by a veterans' organization, the governor shall notify that veterans' organization of the vacant position and request a list of three nominations of veterans from which the governor shall appoint a successor to the board. In the case of any vacancy occurring in the position of a board member who is qualified in one of the speciality areas listed in subsection (b)(3) after the initial appointments, the director shall notify one or more professional societies or associations which represent the medical or behavioral science speciality required for the vacant position and request a list of three nominations from that speciality area from which the commission shall appoint a successor to the board.
- (e) Annually, the board shall elect a chairperson, vice-chairperson and secretary from among its members and shall meet at least four no less than six times each year at the call of the chairperson.
- (f) The members of the board attending meetings of the board or attending a subcommittee meeting thereof authorized by the board shall receive no compensation for their services but shall be paid subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in subsections (b), (c) and (d) of K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 4. K.S.A. 73-1224 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1224. (a) The commission shall develop comprehensive surveys, or adopt one or more existing surveys, to be conducted to determine and study the physical and mental conditions, problems and illnesses, including birth defects, as well as the employment, social, emotional and family

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problems experienced by veterans, their spouses and family members since the veteran's return to Kansas and by any other persons residing in 2 3 Kansas who are suffering from Gulf War syndrome.

- (b) The commission shall develop or adopt the surveys within the first four months after the effective date of this act. The commission shall administer the surveys and review the completed surveys with the board. The commission shall compile the results of the surveys and develop recommendations for the legislature based thereon. The director shall report the results to appropriate federal agencies and shall request additional assistance for veterans commensurate with the director's duties under K.S.A. 73-1209, and amendments thereto.
- (e) The aggregate amount expended for the development and administration of surveys and studies set out under this section and for board expenses, including the position established by K.S.A. 73-1225, and amendments thereto, shall not exceed \$100,000 per fiscal year.
- (d) The commission shall request the different media, including radio, television and newspaper, to make public service announcements publicizing information on the Persian Gulf War surveys and inform Kansans of the health problems identified and where help is available. The public service announcements should be published no less than four times a year. (a) The commission will conduct a survey that follows upon its highly successful initial survey of veterans of the 1990-1991 Gulf War. This follow-up survey will collect systematic information on any changes in the diagnosed conditions or symptoms of the veterans who were initially surveyed. The survey will also collect information on treatment or other factors that may have affected the veterans' health since the initial survey. Based on the results of the survey, the board shall develop a plan of action to address the health needs of the veterans and seek funding for additional research as needed. Results of the survey shall be provided in a timely manner to the appropriate federal and state agencies and officials and disseminated to veterans via the media, mailings and public meetings.
- The board shall work at, but is not limited to, developing materials needed to conduct veterans briefings, handouts and press releases on health issues that are affecting Kansas veterans.
- Sec. 5. K.S.A. 73-1225 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1225. There is hereby established with the commission a full-time position dedicated to developing and executing the provisions of K.S.A. 73-1221 through 73-1231, and amendments thereto, and additional duties may include, but are not limited to, seeking and applying for grants and other moneys to fund activities under this act, to assist in the preparation and administration of surveys under this act, to promote programs and activities designed to assist persons affected by Gulf War syndrome military deployments to hostile theaters and help them to receive the help

 they need and to perform such other duties as the chairperson of the commission director may prescribe. Within 90 days of the effective date of this act, the commission shall appoint a qualified individual to this position.

Sec. 6. K.S.A. 73-1226 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1226. (a) The commission shall request that the department of health and environment contact families of any children born after August 1, 1991, who are on any state birth defect list maintained by the department, to inform the families of the availability of the survey and the registry if either parent served in the Persian Gulf War. If the family voluntarily participates in the survey, the veteran's child's name shall be listed in the state Persian Gulf War registry.

— (b) The commission shall determine the appropriate health programs and the confidential mechanisms that shall be utilized to ask participants in such programs whether they are Persian Gulf War veterans, and if so, offer the veterans voluntary participation in the survey under K.S.A. 73-1224, and amendments thereto.

 $\overline{}$ (c) (a) The commission shall establish and maintain a state Persian Gulf War registry containing the names of veterans, their spouses, family members and other persons in Kansas who have been affected by Gulf War syndrome.

- $\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{(b)}}$ The commission shall inform veterans of any state and federal 23 programs available to meet the veterans' needs.
 - (e) (c) Any person who in good faith provides information to the commission under the provisions of this section shall be immune from civil or criminal liability therefor.
 - Sec. 7. K.S.A. 73-1227 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1227. Subject to funds available, the commission shall conduct a fiscal impact study, aimed at identifying the annual budgetary impact of Gulf War syndrome deployment on Kansas veterans in terms of increased costs of education, medical coverage, correction of birth defects reemployment, underemployment and other expenses identified through the results of the surveys conducted under K.S.A. 73-1224, and amendments thereto hardships.
- Sec. 8. K.S.A. 73-1230 is hereby amended to read as follows: 731230. The Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall cooperate and
 share information with appropriate state and federal agencies as necessary
 for the purposes of this act to aid veterans and other persons in obtaining
 aid and relief from the effects of Gulf War syndrome deployment. Such
 cooperation shall include reporting the survey statistics to appropriate
 federal agencies to bring issues to the notice of appropriate agencies.
- Sec. 9. K.S.A. 73-1231 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-43 1231. The Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund is hereby ren-

1 amed the Kansas veterans health fund. Any statute or appropriation bill referring to the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund shall be deemed to refer to the Kansas veterans health fund. There is hereby established in the state treasury the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans 4 health initiative fund which shall be administered by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs. All moneys received from any grants from 6 federal or other nonstate sources, from contributions or from any other 8 source for the purpose of financing the activities of the board or the 9 development or administration of the surveys or research developed by the board under this act, shall be remitted to the state treasurer in ac-10 cordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. 11 12 Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit 13 the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative fund. All expenditures from the 14 15 Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative fund shall be for the purposes of financing the activities of the commission for the implemen-16 tation and administration, including the activities of the board and the 17 development and administration of the surveys or research under this act 18 and shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants 19 20 of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers ap-21 proved by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs or the commission's 22 designee.

- New Sec. 10. On and after July 1, 2011, the provisions of K.S.A. 73-1221 through 73-1231, and amendments thereto, shall expire.
- 25 Sec. 11. K.S.A. 73-1221, 73-1222, 73-1223, 73-1224, 73-1225, 73-26 1226, 73-1227, 73-1230 and 73-1231 are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
