9 AN ACT concerning gambling devices; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-10 4306 and 21-4307 and repealing the existing sections. 11 12Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-4306 is hereby amended to read as 13 14follows: 21-4306. (a) Dealing in gambling devices is manufacturing, trans-15ferring or possessing with intent to transfer any gambling device or sub-16assembly or essential part thereof. 17(b) Proof of possession of any device designed exclusively for gam-18bling purposes, which device is not set up for use or which is not in a 19gambling place, creates a presumption of possession with intent to 20transfer. 21(c) Dealing in gambling devices is a severity level 8, nonperson felony. 22 It shall be a defense to a prosecution under this section that the (d) 23 gambling device is an antique slot machine and that the antique slot ma-24 chine was not operated for gambling purposes while in the owner's or 25the defendant's possession. A slot machine shall be deemed an antique 26 slot machine if it was manufactured prior to the year 1950 at least 25 27 years before commencement of the prosecution. 28(e) It shall be a defense to a prosecution under this section that the 29 gambling device or sub-assembly or essential part thereof is manufac-30 tured, transferred or possessed by a manufacturer registered under the 31 federal gambling devices act of 1962 (15 U.S.C. 1171 et seq.) or a trans-32 porter under contract with such manufacturer with intent to transfer for 33 use: 34 By the Kansas lottery or Kansas lottery retailers as authorized by (1)35 law and rules and regulations adopted by the Kansas lottery commission; 36 by a licensee of the Kansas racing commission as authorized by (2)37 law and rules and regulations adopted by the commission; 38 in a state other than the state of Kansas; or (3)39 (4)tribal gaming. 40 K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-4307 is hereby amended to read as Sec. 2. 41follows: 21-4307. (a) Possession of a gambling device is knowingly pos-42sessing or having custody or control, as owner, lessee, agent, employee,

43 bailee, or otherwise, of any gambling device.

1 Possession of a gambling device is a class B nonperson misdemeanor.

2 (b) It shall be a defense to a prosecution under this section that the 3 gambling device is an antique slot machine and that the antique slot machine was not operated for gambling purposes while in the owner's or 4 the defendant's possession. A slot machine shall be deemed an antique 5slot machine if it was manufactured prior to the year 1950 at least 25 6 7 years before commencement of the prosecution.

(c) It shall be a defense to a prosecution under this section that the 8 9 gambling device is possessed or under custody or control of a manufacturer registered under the federal gambling devices act of 1962 (15 U.S.C. 10 1171 et seq.) or a transporter under contract with such manufacturer with 11 12intent to transfer for use:

13 By the Kansas lottery or Kansas lottery retailers as authorized by (1)law and rules and regulations adopted by the Kansas lottery commission; 1415(2) by a licensee of the Kansas racing commission as authorized by

law and rules and regulations adopted by the commission; 16

17in a state other than the state of Kansas; or (3)

18(4)in tribal gaming.

19 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-4306 and 21-4307 are hereby repealed.
