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9 AN ACT concerning criminal procedure; relating to the collection of 10 DNA specimens; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-2511 and repealing the existing section; also repealing K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-2511a. 11 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-2511 is hereby amended to read as 15follows: 21-2511. (a) Any person convicted as an adult or adjudicated as 16a juvenile offender because of the commission of any felony; a violation 17of subsection (a)(1) of K.S.A. 21-3505; a violation of K.S.A. 21-3508; a 18violation of K.S.A. 21-4310; a violation of K.S.A. 21-3424, and amend-19ments thereto, when the victim is less than 18 years of age; a violation of 20K.S.A. 21-3507, and amendments thereto, when one of the parties in-21volved is less than 18 years of age; a violation of subsection (b)(1) of K.S.A. 22 21-3513, and amendments thereto, when one of the parties involved is 23 less than 18 years of age; a violation of K.S.A. 21-3515, and amendments 24 thereto, when one of the parties involved is less than 18 years of age; or 25a violation of K.S.A. 21-3517, and amendments thereto; including an at-26tempt, conspiracy or criminal solicitation, as defined in K.S.A. 21-3301, 27 21-3302 or 21-3303 and amendments thereto, of any such offenses pro-28vided in this subsection regardless of the sentence imposed, shall be re-29 quired to submit specimens of blood or an oral or other biological sample 30 authorized by the Kansas bureau of investigation to the Kansas bureau of 31investigation in accordance with the provisions of this act, if such person 32 is: 33 Convicted as an adult or adjudicated as a juvenile offender be-(1)34 cause of the commission of a crime specified in subsection (a) on or after 35 the effective date of this act: 36 (2)ordered institutionalized as a result of being convicted as an adult 37 or adjudicated as a juvenile offender because of the commission of a crime 38 specified in subsection (a) on or after the effective date of this act; or 39 (3)convicted as an adult or adjudicated as a juvenile offender because 40 of the commission of a crime specified in this subsection before the ef-41fective date of this act and is presently confined as a result of such con-42viction or adjudication in any state correctional facility or county jail or is 43 presently serving a sentence under K.S.A. 21-4603, 21-4603d, or 22-3717

1 or 38-1663 K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 38-2361, and amendments thereto.

2 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Kansas bureau of 3 investigation is authorized to obtain fingerprints and other identifiers for 4 all persons, whether juveniles or adults, covered by this act.

5 (c) Any person required by paragraphs (a)(1) and (a)(2) to provide 6 such specimen or sample shall be ordered by the court to have such 7 specimen or sample collected within 10 days after sentencing or 8 adjudication:

9 (1) If placed directly on probation, that person must provide such specimen or sample, at a collection site designated by the Kansas bureau 10of investigation. Collection of specimens shall be conducted by qualified 11 12volunteers, contractual personnel or employees designated by the Kansas 13 bureau of investigation. Failure to cooperate with the collection of the specimens and any deliberate act by that person intended to impede, 1415delay or stop the collection of the specimens shall be punishable as con-16tempt of court and constitute grounds to revoke probation;

(2) if sentenced to the secretary of corrections, such specimen or
sample will be obtained as soon as practical upon arrival at the correctional facility; or

(3) if a juvenile offender is placed in the custody of the commissioner
of juvenile justice, in a youth residential facility or in a juvenile correctional facility, such specimen or sample will be obtained as soon as practical upon arrival.

(d) Any person required by paragraph (a)(3) to provide such specimen or sample shall be required to provide such samples prior to final
discharge or conditional release at a collection site designated by the
Kansas bureau of investigation. Collection of specimens shall be conducted by qualified volunteers, contractual personnel or employees designated by the Kansas bureau of investigation.

30 (e) (1) On and after January 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008, any adult 31 arrested or charged or juvenile placed in custody for or charged with the 32 commission or attempted commission of any person felony or drug se-33 verity level 1 or 2 felony shall be required to submit such specimen or 34 sample at the same time such person is fingerprinted pursuant to the 35 booking procedure.

(2) On and after July 1, 2008, except as provided further, any adult
arrested or charged or juvenile placed in custody for or charged with the
commission or attempted commission of any felony shall be required to
submit such specimen or sample at the same time such person is fingerprinted pursuant to the booking procedure.

(3) Prior to taking such samples, the arresting, charging or custodial
law enforcement agency shall search the Kansas criminal history files
through the Kansas criminal justice information system to determine if

1 such person's sample is currently on file with the Kansas bureau of investigation. In the event that it cannot reasonably be established that a 2 DNA sample for such person is on file at the Kansas bureau of investi-3 4 gation, the arresting, charging or custodial law enforcement agency shall cause a sample to be collected. If such person's sample is on file with the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Kansas bureau of investigation, the law enforcement agency is not re-7 quired to take the sample. 8 (4) If a court later determines that there was not probable cause for

9 the arrest, charge or placement in custody, the court shall send a copy of such determination to the Kansas bureau of investigation. The Kansas 10bureau of investigation shall forthwith remove such specimen or sample 11 12from the Kansas bureau of investigation database records. After a deter-13 mination by a court that probable cause exists for the arrest, charge or placement in custody, such specimen or sample shall be submitted to the 1415Kansas bureau of investigation. The court shall ensure, at the time of such 16person's first appearance, that the person has submitted such specimen 17or sample.

18(5) If charges against a person, who is required to submit such spec-19imen or sample, are dismissed, a conviction against such person is ex-20punged or a verdict of acquittal with regard to such person is returned, 21the court shall send a copy of such order to the Kansas bureau of inves-22 tigation. The Kansas bureau of investigation shall forthwith destroy such 23 specimen or sample, but retain the record in the Kansas bureau of in-24 vestigation database.

25If a person, who is required to submit such specimen or sample, (6)26has not been charged and the statute of limitations on the crime charged 27 has expired the prosecutor shall send documentation of such expiration 28to the Kansas bureau of investigation. The Kansas bureau of investigation 29 shall forthwith destroy such specimen or sample, but retain the record in 30 the Kansas bureau of investigation database.

31 The Kansas bureau of investigation shall provide all specimen vials, 32 mailing tubes, labels and instructions necessary for the collection of oral 33 or other biological samples. No person authorized by this section to collect 34 oral or other biological samples, and no person assisting in the collection 35 of these samples shall be liable in any civil or criminal action when the 36 act is performed in a reasonable manner according to rules and regula-37 tions promulgated by the Kansas bureau of investigation. The samples 38 shall thereafter be forwarded to the Kansas bureau of investigation. The 39 bureau shall analyze the samples to the extent allowed by funding avail-40 able for this purpose.

(g) The Kansas bureau of investigation shall provide all specimen vi-4142als, mailing tubes, labels and instructions necessary for the collection of 43

blood samples. The collection of samples shall be performed in a medi-

1 cally approved manner. No person authorized by this section to withdraw blood, and no person assisting in the collection of these samples shall be 2 3 liable in any civil or criminal action when the act is performed in a reasonable manner according to generally accepted medical practices. The 4 withdrawal of blood for purposes of this act may be performed only by: $\mathbf{5}$ (1) A person licensed to practice medicine and surgery or a person acting 6 7 under the supervision of any such licensed person; (2) a registered nurse 8 or a licensed practical nurse; or (3) any qualified medical technician in-9 cluding, but not limited to, an emergency medical technician-intermediate or mobile intensive care technician, as those terms are defined in 10K.S.A. 65-6112, and amendments thereto, or a phlebotomist. The samples 11 12shall thereafter be forwarded to the Kansas bureau of investigation. The 13 bureau shall analyze the samples to the extent allowed by funding available for this purpose. 1415(h) The DNA (deoxyribonucleic acid) records and DNA samples shall 16be maintained by the Kansas bureau of investigation. The Kansas bureau of investigation shall establish, implement and maintain a statewide au-1718tomated DNA databank and DNA database capable of, but not limited to, searching, matching and storing DNA records. The DNA database as 1920established by this act shall be compatible with the procedures specified 21by the federal bureau of investigation's combined DNA index system 22 (CODIS). The Kansas bureau of investigation shall participate in the 23 CODIS program by sharing data and utilizing compatible test procedures, laboratory equipment, supplies and computer software. 24 25(i) The DNA records obtained pursuant to this act shall be confiden-26tial and shall be released only to authorized criminal justice agencies. The DNA records shall be used only for law enforcement identification pur-27 28poses or to assist in the recovery or identification of human remains from 29 disasters or for other humanitarian identification purposes, including 30 identification of missing persons. (i) (1) The Kansas bureau of investigation shall be the state central 3132 repository for all DNA records and DNA samples obtained pursuant to

this act. The Kansas bureau of investigation shall promulgate rules and
 regulations for: (A) The form and manner of the collection and mainte nance of DNA samples;

(B) a procedure which allows the defendant to request the DNA samples be destroyed in the event of a dismissal of charges expungement,
acquittal at trial or statute of limitations expiration; and

(C) other procedures for the operation of this act.

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40 (2) These rules and regulations also shall require compliance with 41 national quality assurance standards to ensure that the DNA records sat-42 isfy standards of acceptance of such records into the national DNA iden-43 tification index.

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1 (3) The provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act shall 2 apply to all actions taken under the rules and regulations so promulgated. 3 (k) The Kansas bureau of investigation is authorized to contract with third parties for the purposes of implementing this section. Any other 4 party contracting to carry out the functions of this section shall be subject 5to the same restrictions and requirements of this section, insofar as ap-6 7 plicable, as the bureau, as well as any additional restrictions imposed by the bureau. 8 9 (l) In the event that a person's DNA sample is lost or is not adequate for any reason, the person shall provide another sample for analysis. 10 (m) Any person who is subject to the requirements of this section, 11 and who, after receiving notification of the requirement to provide a DNA 1213 specimen, knowingly refuses to provide such DNA specimen, shall be guilty of a class A nonperson misdemeanor. 1415 Sec. 2.
