9 AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to leaving the scene of an 10 accident; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 8-1602 and repealing the ex-11isting section. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 8-1602 is hereby amended to read as 15follows: 8-1602. (a) The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident 16resulting in injury to, great bodily harm to or death of any person shall 17immediately stop such vehicle at the scene of such accident, or as close 18thereto as possible, but shall then forthwith return to and in every event shall remain at the scene of the accident until the driver has fulfilled the 1920requirements of K.S.A. 8-1604, and amendments thereto. Every such stop 21shall be made without obstructing traffic more than is necessary. 22 (b) A person who violates this section which results in: 23 (1)Injury to any person shall be guilty of a class A person 24 misdemeanor. 25Great bodily harm to any person shall be guilty of a severity level (2)26 10, person felony. 27(3)The death of any person shall be guilty of a severity level 9, person 28felony. In addition to any other penalty provided for a violation of this 29 paragraph, the court shall upon a conviction of such a violation: 30 (A) If the violator is under 18 years of age, order the division of 31vehicles to suspend the driving privileges of such violator until such date 32 as such violator turns 21 years of age. Upon receipt of the court order, 33 the division shall notify the violator and suspend the driving privileges of 34 the violator until such date as such violator turns 21 years of age whether 35 or not the violator has a driver's license. 36 If the violator is 18 years of age or older, order the division of (B)37 vehicles to suspend the driving privileges of such violator for five years. 38 Upon receipt of the court order, the division shall notify the violator and 39 suspend the driving privileges of the violator for five years whether or 40 not the violator has a driver's license. 41The director may revoke the license or permit to drive or any (c) 42nonresident operating privilege of any person so convicted.
