HOUSE BILL No. 2480

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9 AN ACT concerning electric utilities; relating to electricity generated from renewable resources or technologies.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. As used in this act:

- (a) "Commission" means the state corporation commission.
- (b) "Electric public utility" means an electric public utility, as defined in K.S.A. 66-101a, and amendments thereto, which is subject to rate regulation by the commission.
- (c) "Governmental entity" means the federal government, the state government or any political or taxing subdivision of the state, or any agency thereof.
- (d) "Renewable resources or technologies" means wind, solar, photovoltaic, biomass, hydropower, geothermal, waste incineration and landfill gas resources or technologies located in Kansas.
- Sec. 2. (a) Any electric public utility may seek to recover costs associated with the cost of purchasing or generating electricity from renewable resources or technologies by filing an application with the commission. The utility shall demonstrate that competitive bids were solicited for the purchase of the electricity or renewable electric generation facility and that the most responsible selection was made, taking into consideration factors including, but not limited to, certainty of construction of the facility, power price, certainty of power price over the length of the contract and economic benefits to Kansas.
- (b) Upon a finding that an electric public utility has complied with the requirements of subsection (a), the commission shall allow the utility to recover the utility's costs of purchasing or generating electricity from renewable resources or technologies in an amount not to exceed 15% of the utility's total generation and purchased power requirements.
- Sec. 3. The state and agencies of the state may budget for increased expenditures for electricity purchased from electric utilities which are not subject to rate regulation by the commission if such increased expenditures are associated with the utilities' providing at least 10% of such electricity from generation from renewable resources technologies or renewable energy credits from Kansas generation facilities.

- Sec. 4. The commission may adopt rules and regulations to implement and administer the provisions of this act.
