## **SENATE BILL No. 246**

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9 AN ACT concerning certain state officials; requiring employment of per-10sons fluent in the Spanish language; amending K.S.A. 40-110, 75-413, 75-623 and 75-3102 and K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 75-710 and repealing the 11 12existing sections. 13 14Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 15Section 1. K.S.A. 40-110 is hereby amended to read as follows: 40-16110. (a) (1) The commissioner of insurance is hereby authorized to ap-17point an assistant commissioner of insurance, actuaries, two special attorneys who shall have been regularly admitted to practice, an executive 18 19secretary, policy examiners, two field representatives, and a secretary to the commissioner. 2021(2)Such appointees shall each receive an annual salary to be deter-22 mined by the commissioner of insurance, within the limits of available 23 appropriations but in no case shall any such annual salary exceed the salary 24 of the commissioner of insurance as established by law, except that the 25commissioner of insurance may appoint two actuaries, who are members 26in good standing of either the American Academy of Actuaries or the 27 Casualty Actuarial Society or the Society of Actuaries, whose annual sal-28aries may exceed the annual salary of the commissioner. 29 (b) The commissioner is also authorized to appoint, within the pro-30 visions of the civil service law, and available appropriations, other em-31ployees as necessary to administer the provisions of this act. *Two or more* 32 of such employees shall be sufficiently fluent in the Spanish language to 33 be able to converse with and answer questions from a person whose pri-34 mary language is Spanish. The field representatives authorized by this 35 section may be empowered to conduct inquiries, investigations or to re-36 ceive complaints. Such field representatives shall not be empowered to 37 make, or direct to be made, an examination of the affairs and financial 38 condition of any insurance company in the process of organization, or 39 applying for admission or doing business in this state. 40 The appointees authorized by this section shall take the proper 41official oath and shall be in no way interested, except as policyholders, in 42any insurance company. In the absence of the commissioner of insurance 43 the assistant commissioner shall perform the duties of the commissioner

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1 of insurance, but shall in all cases execute papers in the name of the 2 commissioner of insurance, as assistant. The commissioner of insurance 3 shall be responsible for all acts of an official nature done and performed by the commissioner's assistant or any person employed in such office. 4 All the appointees authorized by this section shall hold their office at the  $\mathbf{5}$ will and pleasure of the commissioner of insurance. 6 7 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 75-413 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-413. 8 The secretary of state may appoint such other assistants and clerks as may 9 be authorized by law; but the secretary of state shall be responsible for the proper discharge of the duties of all assistants and clerks, and they 10shall hold their offices at the will and pleasure of the secretary and shall 11 12do and perform such general duties as the secretary may require. Two or 13 more of such employees shall be sufficiently fluent in the Spanish language to be able to converse with and answer questions from a person whose 1415primary language is Spanish. 16Sec. 3. K.S.A. 75-623 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-623. The treasurer shall appoint such other assistants, clerks, bookkeepers, 1718accountants and stenographers as may be authorized by law, each of 19which persons shall take the oath of office required of public officers. 20Such persons shall hold their offices at the will and pleasure of the state 21treasurer. Two or more of such employees shall be sufficiently fluent in 22 the Spanish language to be able to converse with and answer questions 23 from a person whose primary language is Spanish. Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 75-710 is hereby amended to read as fol-24 25lows: 75-710. The attorney general shall appoint such assistants, clerks, 26and stenographers as shall be authorized by law, and who shall hold their 27office at the will and pleasure of the attorney general. All fees and allow-28ances earned by said such assistants or any of them, or allowed to them 29 by any statute or order of court in any civil or criminal case whatsoever, 30 shall be turned into the general revenue fund of the state treasury, and 31 the vouchers for their monthly salaries shall not be honored by the di-32 rector of accounts and reports until a verified account of the fees collected 33 by them, or either of them, during the preceding month, has been filed 34 in the director of accounts and reports' office. Assistants appointed by the 35 attorney general shall perform the duties and exercise the powers as prescribed by law and shall perform other duties as prescribed by the attor-36 37 ney general. Assistants shall act for and exercise the power of the attorney 38 general to the extent the attorney general delegates them the authority 39 to do so. Two or more of such employees shall be sufficiently fluent in the 40 Spanish language to be able to converse with and answer questions from a person whose primary language is Spanish. 4142Sec. 5. K.S.A. 75-3102 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-43 3102. The governor is authorized to appoint a private secretary, an assis-

- 1 tant private secretary, executive clerk and pardon attorney, who shall each
- 2 receive an annual salary to be fixed by the governor, within available
- appropriations; and may also appoint and fix the compensation of such
  other assistants, secretaries, stenographers, clerks and employees as he
- 5 or she may deem deemed necessary and as are within available appropri-
- 6 ations. Two or more of such employees shall be sufficiently fluent in the
- 7 Spanish language to be able to converse with and answer questions from
- 8 a person whose primary language is Spanish.
- 9 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 40-110, 75-413, 75-623 and 75-3102 and K.S.A. 2006
  10 Supp. 75-710 are hereby repealed.
- 11 Sec. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 12 publication in the statute book.
