## SENATE BILL No. 276

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AN ACT relating to veterans; amending K.S.A. 73-1221, 73-1222, 73-9 1223, 73-1224, 73-1225, 73-1226, 73-1227, 73-1230 and 73-1231 and 10 repealing the existing sections. 11 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 73-1221 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1415 1221. This act shall be known as the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans 16health initiative act. 17Sec. 2. K.S.A. 73-1222 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-181222. As used in K.S.A. 73-1221 through 73-1231, and amendments 19thereto, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 20(a) "Birth defect" means any physical or mental abnormality or con-21dition, including any susceptibility to any illness or condition other than 22 normal childhood illnesses or conditions. 23 <del>(b)</del> "Board" means the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative board established by K.S.A. 73-1223, and amendments thereto. 24 25"Commission" means the Kansas commission on veterans (e) (b) 26affairs. 27  $\frac{d}{d}(c)$ "Director" means the executive director of the Kansas com-28mission on veterans affairs. 29 (e) (d) "Gulf War syndrome" means the wide range of physical and 30 mental conditions, problems and illnesses that are connected with service 31in the armed forces of the United States during and in the area of op-32 erations of the Persian Gulf War. 33  $\frac{(\mathbf{f})}{(e)}$ "Veteran" means a person who is a resident of Kansas who was 34 a member of the armed forces of the United States of America and who 35 served in such armed forces in the area of operations of the Persian Gulf War during the Persian Gulf War or thereafter regardless of whether such 36 37 person is still actively serving in the armed forces or reserve. served on 38 active service and who was discharged or released from the service under 39 conditions other than dishonorable, and it also includes everyone still 40 serving on active duty in the national guard or is one of the reserve com-41ponents that was deployed to hostile theater operations. 42Sec. 3. K.S.A. 73-1223 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1223. (a) There is hereby established with the commission an advisory 43

1 board known to be the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative

2 board. The board shall be advisory to the commission in the implemen-3 tation and administration of this act.

4 (b) The board shall consist of <del>nine</del> *no less than 11* members appointed 5 as follows:

At least three five members shall be veterans. The director shall 6 (1)7 notify the state level unit commanders of the Disabled American Veter-8 ans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and, the American 9 Legion and other veterans organizations in Kansas to request a list of three no less than two nominations of veterans from each such veterans' 10 organization. The governor shall appoint one veteran as a member from 11 12each list, but subject to a total of five veterans, and with no two veterans from the same organization list. If any veteran member fails to show to 13 two meetings in one calendar year, the veteran may be replaced by the 1415chairperson of the commission using the list and so long as no two veterans 16on the board are from the same organization list.

One member shall be qualified from each of the medical spe-17(2)cializations of epidemiology, toxicology and genetics. One member shall 1819be qualified in one of the behavioral sciences in the speciality area of 20family dynamics. The director shall notify one or more professional so-21cieties or associations which represent the medical or behavioral science 22 specialty area required and request a list of three nominations from that 23 specialty area. The commission shall appoint one member of the board from each list. The board shall include up to six clinical or research pro-24 25fessionals appointed by the commission with expertise in appropriate ar-26eas that may include, but are not limited to: Toxicology, epidemiology, 27 traumatic injury, trauma related psychiatric disorders, neurology, family 28dynamics, social work and human services and physical therapy. 29 (3) Two legislators, one from each house, shall be appointed to the

board with the speaker of the house of representatives and president of
the senate each appointing a member. One legislator shall be a member
of the democratic party and one legislator shall be a member of the republican party.

(4) The board shall include at least three representatives appointed
by the commission from the state and or federal agencies that may include,
but are not limited to, the U.S. department on veterans affairs, the department of labor, the Kansas adjutant general's office, the Kansas department of health and environment and the Kansas department of social
and rehabilitation services.

40 (c) Within 90 days of the effective date of this act, the governor, the
41 commission, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president
42 of the senate shall appoint the initial members of the board. Of the initial
43 appointments to the board by the governor, one shall be for a term of

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1 one year, one shall be for a term of two years and one shall be for a term ending three years after the date of the initial appointment. Of the initial 2 appointments to the board by the commission, two shall be for a term of 3 one year, one shall be for a term of two years and one shall be for a term 4 ending three years after the date of the initial appointment. After the  $\mathbf{5}$ initial appointments, terms of office of the members appointed by the 6 7 governor or the commission shall be for three years but no person shall 8 be appointed for more than two successive three-year terms. The term 9 of office of each member appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives or the president of the senate shall end on the first day of 10 the regular session of the legislature which commences in the first odd-11 12 numbered year occurring after the year such member was appointed.

13 (d) Each member of the board shall serve until a successor is ap-14pointed and qualified. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the membership of 15 the board for any reason other than the expiration of a member's term 16of office, the governor, the commission, speaker of the house of representatives or president of the senate shall appoint a successor of like 1718qualifications to fill the unexpired term in accordance with this section. 19In the case of any vacancy occurring in the position of a board member 20who was appointed from a list of nominations submitted by a veterans' 21organization, the governor shall notify that veterans' organization of the 22 vacant position and request a list of three nominations of veterans from 23 which the governor shall appoint a successor to the board. In the case of any vacancy occurring in the position of a board member who is qualified 24 in one of the speciality areas listed in subsection (b)(3) after the initial 25appointments, the director shall notify one or more professional societies 2627 or associations which represent the medical or behavioral science speci-28ality required for the vacant position and request a list of three nomina-29 tions from that speciality area from which the commission shall appoint a successor to the board. 30

31 (e) Annually, the board shall elect a chairperson, vice-chairperson and 32 secretary from among its members and shall meet at least four no less 33 than six times each year at the call of the chairperson.

34 (f) The members of the board attending meetings of the board or 35 attending a subcommittee meeting thereof authorized by the board shall 36 receive no compensation for their services but shall be paid subsistence 37 allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in subsections (b), 38 (c) and (d) of K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.

39 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 73-1224 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-40 1224. (a) The commission shall develop comprehensive surveys, or adopt one or more existing surveys, to be conducted to determine and study 41

42the physical and mental conditions, problems and illnesses, including

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birth defects, as well as the employment, social, emotional and family

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1 problems experienced by veterans, their spouses and family members since the veteran's return to Kansas and by any other persons residing in 2 Kansas who are suffering from Gulf War syndrome. 3 (b) The commission shall develop or adopt the surveys within the first 4 four months after the effective date of this act. The commission shall 5administer the surveys and review the completed surveys with the board. 6 7 The commission shall compile the results of the surveys and develop recommendations for the legislature based thereon. The director shall 8 9 report the results to appropriate federal agencies and shall request additional assistance for veterans commensurate with the director's duties 10under K.S.A. 73-1209, and amendments thereto. 11 12 -(e) The aggregate amount expended for the development and ad-13 ministration of surveys and studies set out under this section and for board expenses, including the position established by K.S.A. 73-1225, and 1415amendments thereto, shall not exceed \$100,000 per fiseal year. - The commission shall request the different media, including ra-16dio, television and newspaper, to make public service announcements 1718publicizing information on the Persian Gulf War surveys and inform Kan-19sans of the health problems identified and where help is available. The 20public service announcements should be published no less than four times 21a year. (a) The commission will conduct a survey that follows upon its 22 highly successful initial survey of veterans of the 1990-1991 Gulf War. 23 This follow-up survey will collect systematic information on any changes in the diagnosed conditions or symptoms of the veterans who were initially 24 surveyed. The survey will also collect information on treatment or other 25factors that may have affected the veterans' health since the initial survey. 26 27Based on the results of the survey, the board shall develop a plan of action 28to address the health needs of the veterans and seek funding for additional 29 research as needed. Results of the survey shall be provided in a timely 30 manner to the appropriate federal and state agencies and officials and 31 disseminated to veterans via the media, mailings and public meetings. 32 The board shall work at, but is not limited to, developing materials (b)33 needed to conduct veterans briefings, handouts and press releases on 34 health issues that are affecting Kansas veterans. 35 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 73-1225 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1225. There is hereby established with the commission a full-time posi-36 37 tion dedicated to developing and executing the provisions of K.S.A. 73-38 1221 through 73-1231, and amendments thereto, and additional duties 39 may include, but are not limited to, seeking and applying for grants and 40 other moneys to fund activities under this act, to assist in the preparation and administration of surveys or research under this act, to promote pro-41

42 grams and activities designed to assist persons affected by Gulf War syn-

43 drome military deployments to hostile theaters and help them to receive

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1 the help they need and to perform such other duties as the <del>chairperson</del>

2 of the commission director may prescribe. Within 90 days of the effective
3 date of this act, the commission shall appoint a qualified individual to this
4 position.

5 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 73-1226 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-6 1226. (a) The commission shall request that the department of health and

7 environment contact families of any children born after August 1, 1991,
8 who are on any state birth defect list maintained by the department, to
9 inform the families of the availability of the survey and the registry if
10 either parent served in the Persian Gulf War. If the family voluntarily

11 participates in the survey, the veteran's child's name shall be listed in the 12 state Persian Gulf War registry.

13 (b) The commission shall determine the appropriate health programs

14 and the confidential mechanisms that shall be utilized to ask participants

15 in such programs whether they are Persian Gulf War veterans, and if so,

offer the veterans voluntary participation in the survey under K.S.A. 73 1224, and amendments thereto.

18 -(c)(a) The commission shall establish and maintain a state Persian 19 Gulf War registry containing the names of veterans, their spouses, family 20 members and other persons in Kansas who have been affected by Gulf 21 War syndrome.

22 (d)(b) The commission shall inform veterans of any state and federal 23 programs available to meet the veterans' needs.

27 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 73-1227 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-28 1227. Subject to funds available, the commission shall conduct a fiscal 29 impact study, aimed at identifying the annual budgetary impact of Gulf 30 War syndrome deployment on Kansas veterans in terms of increased costs of education, medical coverage, correction of birth defects reemployment, 3132 underemployment and other expenses identified through the results of the surveys conducted under K.S.A. 73-1224, and amendments thereto 33 34 hardships.

35 K.S.A. 73-1230 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-Sec. 8. 36 1230. The Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall cooperate and 37 share information with appropriate state and federal agencies as necessary 38 for the purposes of this act to aid veterans and other persons in obtaining 39 aid and relief from the effects of Gulf War syndrome deployment. Such cooperation shall include reporting the survey statistics to appropriate 40 41federal agencies to bring issues to the notice of appropriate agencies. 42Sec. 9. K.S.A. 73-1231 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-

43 1231. The Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund is hereby ren-

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1 amed the Kansas veterans health fund. Any statute or appropriation bill 2 referring to the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund shall be 3 deemed to refer to the Kansas veterans health fund. There is hereby established in the state treasury the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans 4 health initiative fund which shall be administered by the Kansas com-5mission on veterans affairs. All moneys received from any grants from 6 7 federal or other nonstate sources, from contributions or from any other 8 source for the purpose of financing the activities of the board or the 9 development or administration of the surveys or research developed by the board under this act, shall be remitted to the state treasurer in ac-10 cordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. 11 12Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit 13 the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative fund. All expenditures from the 1415 Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative fund shall be for the purposes of financing the activities of the commission for the implemen-16tation and administration, including the activities of the board and the 17development and administration of the surveys or research under this act 18and shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants 1920of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers ap-21proved by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs or the commission's 22 designee. 23 Sec. 10. K.S.A. 73-1221, 73-1222, 73-1223, 73-1224, 73-1225, 73-

- 24 1226, 73-1227, 73-1230 and 73-1231 are hereby repealed.
- 25 Sec. 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 26 publication in the statute book.
