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12AN ACT concerning the presidential primary; establishing the date 13 thereof; amending K.S.A. 25-4502 and 25-4503 and K.S.A. 2006 14Supp. 25-4501 and repealing the existing sections. 15 16Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 17Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 25-4501 is hereby amended to 18read as follows: 25-4501. (a) Subject to the provisions of this sec-19tion, there shall be held a presidential preference primary election 20in the year 2008, and every fourth year thereafter. 21(b) On or before November 1, 2007, and on or before November 22 1 every fourth year thereafter, the secretary of state shall certify to 23 the governor, to the chief clerk of the house of representatives and 24 to the secretary of the senate a common date in the next succeeding 25year on which at least five [three] other states will hold a presiden-26tial preference primary election, a delegate or mass convention or 27a caucus of qualified voters at which delegates to a national con-28vention are selected. On or before each such date, if the secretary 29 of state determines that there is no common date on which at least 30 five three states are conducting such a selection process in the next 31 succeeding year, the secretary of state shall certify to the governor, 32 the chief clerk of the house of representatives and the secretary of 33 the senate on a date, which shall be on or before the first Tuesday 34 in April of the next following year, on which the presidential pref-35 erence primary election shall be held. (c) The date certified by the secretary of state pursuant to sub-36 37 section (b) shall be the date on which the presidential preference 38 primary election authorized by subsection (a) shall be held in the 39 state of Kansas. 40 Section 1. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-4502 is hereby amended to read as 41follows: 25-4502. (a) Every registered elector who has declared such elec-42tor's party affiliation with a political party eligible to participate in a state

43 primary election shall have the opportunity to vote one vote at a presi-

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1 dential preference primary election for such elector's preference for one 2 person to be the candidate for nomination by such candidate's party for 3 president of the United States or for "none of the names shown." Any registered elector who has not declared such candidate's party affiliation 4 $\mathbf{5}$ prior to the election may make such a declaration at the polling place, 6 and thereupon shall be permitted likewise the opportunity to vote one 7 vote at the presidential preference primary. A vote for "none of the names 8 shown" shall express the preference for an uncommitted delegation from 9 Kansas to the national convention of that elector's party. Preference shall be indicated by marking with a cross or check mark inside a voting square 10on the ballot at the left of the voter's choice, or by voting by using a voting 11 12machine. 13 (b) The name of any candidate for a political party nomination for president of the United States shall be printed on the ballots only if, not 1415later than twelve o'clock noon, February 12 prior to on the date which 16precedes by seven weeks the date of the presidential preference primary or, if such date falls on Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, not later than twelve 1718o'clock noon the following day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday: 19(1) The candidate files with the secretary of state a declaration of 20intent to become a candidate accompanied by a fee of \$100; or 21there is filed in the office of secretary of state a petition in the (2)22form prescribed by K.S.A. 25-205, and amendments thereto, signed by 23 not less than 1,000 registered electors, who are affiliated with the political 24 party of such candidate as shown by the party affiliation list. The secretary 25of state shall determine the sufficiency of each such petition, and such 26determination shall be final. 27 Sec. 2. 3. K.S.A. 25-4503 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-284503. (a) The names of the candidates for nomination for president of 29 the United States by a political party eligible to participate in a state 30 primary election shall be printed on the official ballots for the presidential 31preference primary elections of their respective parties along with the 32 choice of "none of the names shown." The ballots shall be marked, re-33 turned and canvassed in the same manner and under the same conditions, 34 so far as the same are applicable, as in the case of the primary election 35 of candidates for nomination for state offices. 36 (b) The official presidential preference primary election ballots shall 37 be printed in a single column and shall have the following heading: 38 **OFFICIAL PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE** 39 PRIMARY ELECTION BALLOT 40 _ Party To vote for a person whose name is printed on the ballot make a cross 4142or check mark in the square **or oval** to the left of the name of the person

for whom you desire to vote. To vote for "none of the names shown"

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1 make a cross or check mark in the square *or oval* to the left of such 2 words.

This shall be followed by the names of the candidates for president of the United States of such party in the manner and order certified by the secretary of state.

(c) As soon as possible after February 12 *the candidate filing deadline* 6 7 as specified in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 25-4502, and amendments thereto, 8 secretary of state shall certify to each county election officer the name of 9 each person who is a candidate for nomination to be president of the United States of each party authorized to participate in the presidential 10preference primary election. The secretary of state shall publish, not less 11 than 21 days prior to the presidential preference primary, a notice in one 1213 newspaper in each county of the state where a newspaper is published, that the official list of candidates and the date of the election can be 1415 acquired in the office of the secretary of state or the office of the county 16 election officer.

(d) When a party participating in the presidential preference primary
election has more than one candidate, the secretary of state shall determine by lot the order in which the candidates' names will appear on the
ballot. The order of names, as established by the secretary of state, shall
be uniform in each county throughout the state.

Sec. 3. *4.* K.S.A. 25-4502 and 25-4503 *and* K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 254501 are hereby repealed.
