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12AN ACT concerning early childhood education services. 13 14Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 15Section 1. (a) The legislative educational planning committee in col-16laboration with the 2010 commission shall study and make recommen-17dations relating to early childhood education. The committee and com-18mission shall: 19(1) Develop a coordinated, comprehensive system for the delivery of 20early childhood education services; 21(2)identify priorities for early childhood education services; 22 identify barriers to service and gaps in service due to strict defi-(3)23 nition of boundaries between departments and agencies; facilitate interagency and interdepartmental cooperation toward 24 (4)25the common goal of serving children; 26 (5) investigate and identify methodologies for the combining of funds 27 across departmental boundaries to better serve children; 28(6)propose actions needed to achieve coordination of funding and 29 services across departmental lines; 30 (7) encourage and facilitate joint planning and coordination between 31 the public and private sectors to better serve the needs of children; 32 (8)determine whether a centralized internet-based reporting system 33 would provide a more efficient and effective system to comply with re-34 porting requirements imposed by law; 35 (9) make recommendations relating to the design of a universal application form and single point of access for families in need of early 36 37 childhood education services; 38 (10) evaluate and report on the performance and cost effectiveness 39 of early childhood education services and make recommendations nec-40 essary to ensure that private entities and public agencies are accountable 41for the progress of children and that such services produce high quality 42opportunities for children; 43 (11) make recommendations to improve communication with local

1 agencies which provide early childhood education services in order to 2 keep such local agencies informed of the availability of state and federal moneys for early childhood education services and make recommenda-3 tions to assist such local agencies in obtaining such state and federal mon-4 5eys and the utilization of such moneys so as to avoid waste and abuse; 6 (12) conduct hearings to receive a wide variety of input from individ-7 uals and groups affected by and concerned with the quality, efficiency 8 and cost of early childhood education services; and 9 prepare a plan for the transfer of the powers and duties of the (13)10state department of social and rehabilitation services, state department of education, Kansas department of health and environment, Kansas chil-11 12dren's cabinet, juvenile justice authority and any other state agency relating to the administration of early childhood education services to the 13 office of early childhood education services. The plan shall provide that 1415the transfer of powers and duties shall occur on or before January 1, 2009. 16The plan shall recommend whether or not the office of early childhood 17education services should be an independent state agency or within an 18existing state agency and if so, which existing state agency. [prepare a 19plan which recommends the establishment by January 1, 2009, of 20the office of early childhood education and the manner in which 21such office should be structured.] 22 (b) For the purposes of conducting the study required by sub-23 section (a), the commissioner of education, the secretary of the Kansas department of health and environment, the secretary of the state 24 25department of social and rehabilitation services and the executive 26director of the Kansas children's cabinet shall be ex officio members 27 of the legislative educational planning committee and the 2010 28commission. 29 (b) (c) On or before December 31, 2007, the legislative educational 30 planning committee shall submit a report of its activities to the governor 31and the legislature. Such report shall include the recommendations 32 adopted by the committee and the 2010 commission and a copy of the 33 plan adopted pursuant to paragraph (13) of subsection (a). The report 34 shall include recommendations for changes in the law which are necessary 35 to implement such recommendations and plan. 36 - Sec. 2. State and local agencies which provide preschool at-risk ed-37 ucation services shall enter into memoranda of understanding under 38 which such agencies will develop consistent strategies for informing par-39 ents of the programs for which they are eligible, and to coordinate the 40 referral of families to the education services which are most appropriate

41 for their needs.

42 - Sec. 3. State and local agencies which provide home visitation pro-

43 grams shall enter into memoranda of understanding under which, such

1 agencies will (a) design a universal application form to be used by such agencies to determine eligibility of families for services and for the re-2 3 ferral of families to the early childhood education services which are most appropriate for their needs and (b) collaborate to develop and imple-4 $\mathbf{5}$ ment a common training plan. -Sec. 4. (a) The state board of education shall develop and implement 6 7 an alternative or provisional license for preschool teachers. No person shall qualify for an alternative or provisional license under this subscetion, 8 9 unless such person holds a valid license in the field of education other than as a preschool teacher. The alternative certification program shall 10 include opportunities for distance education. 11 12(b) The alternative certification program shall be reviewed at least 13 once every five years to evaluate the effectiveness of the program. 14- (c) The state board of education shall establish program goals and 15objectives for high quality preschool programs. - (d) The state board of education shall provide professional develop-16ment opportunities to teachers and administrators of preschool education 1718programs. (e) The state board of education shall assist with the development of 1920self-study and self-evaluation processes and the development of improve-21ment plans for preschool education programs. -Sec. 5. When expending moneys appropriated for early childhood 22 education services, the department of education shall give first priority to 23 community-based programs which provide early childhood education 24 services which did not receive moneys in the preceding fiscal year. 2526-As used in this section, "moneys" means 20% of that amount of moneys 27appropriated for fiscal year 2008 which exceeds the amount of moneys 28appropriated for fiscal year 2007. 29 Sec. 6. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 30 publication in the statute book.
